

State Energy Management Plan Annual Summary Report Fiscal Year 2013-14

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Executive Summary

The State Energy Management Plan (SEMP) was developed by the Department of Management Services (DMS) to provide a comprehensive system to manage and reduce non-renewable energy consumption and costs in state-owned and metered state-leased facilities. The SEMF applies to each executive branch department or agency of the State of Florida.

The State Energy Management Plan applies to all state-owned and private-lease facilities where the agency is contractually obligated to pay for utility consumption based on the utility provider's monthly statement or the facility's sub-meter. The purpose of this report is to summarize energy data submissions provided by each agency for Fiscal Year 2013-14 (FY 2013-14), which was the third year for which SEMF data was collected.

For FY 2013-14, 20 agencies reported energy data for a total of 48.7 million gross square feet of space. The total energy consumption reported for this period translates to a total annual cost of \$117.1 million.

This report contains facility-specific energy consumption and cost data, including performance metrics and benchmark comparisons, for each state agency. In addition, based on the benchmarking comparisons, DMS has identified within this report specific facilities to investigate for potential energy system upgrades or related operational improvements.

For the third year, the state has acquired facility-specific energy consumption and cost data that can, and should, be used to prioritize energy conservation efforts and capital improvements. This report will assist DMS and other stakeholders in the process of evaluating the energy conservation programs of each agency.

Overview

This report summarizes the State Energy Management Plan submissions provided by each agency for FY 2013-14. The metrics provided are the total agency-reported gross square footage (GSF), annual energy consumption (AEC), energy performance index (EPI), annual utility cost (AUC), and cost utilization index (CUI).

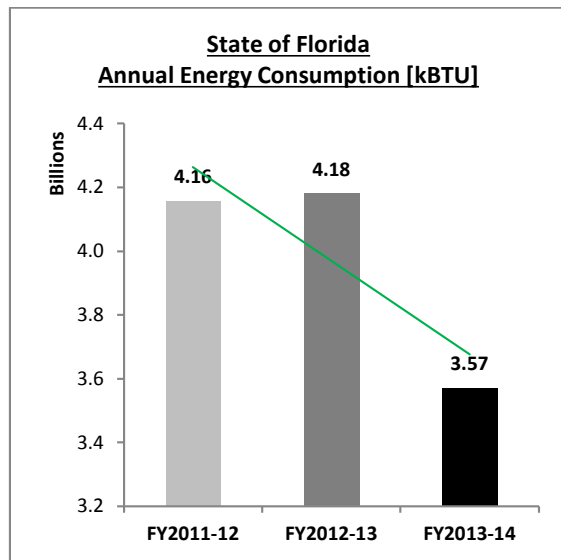
The State of Florida is comprised of 20 state agencies that own facilities, encompassing approximately 48.7 million gross square feet of space. The combined annual energy consumption is approximately 3.6 billion kBTU (thousand British thermal units), at a combined annual cost of approximately \$117.1 million. Table 1 provides a summary of the state's energy performance metrics for each year of SEMF submissions.

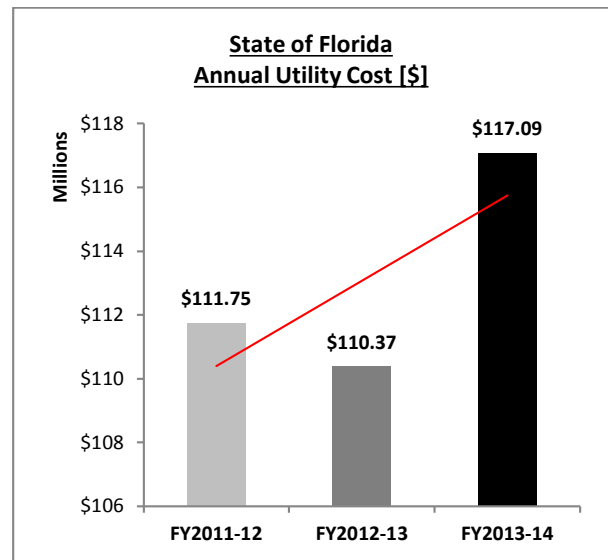

It should be noted data variations over the consecutive years can be attributed to more accurate data reporting and changes in statutory requirements to include all facilities sizes and utility-related costs. Additionally, agency portfolios have changed as properties are acquired and/or released.

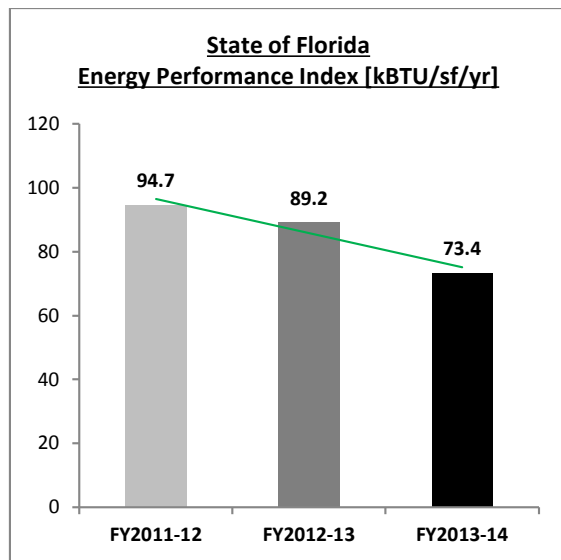

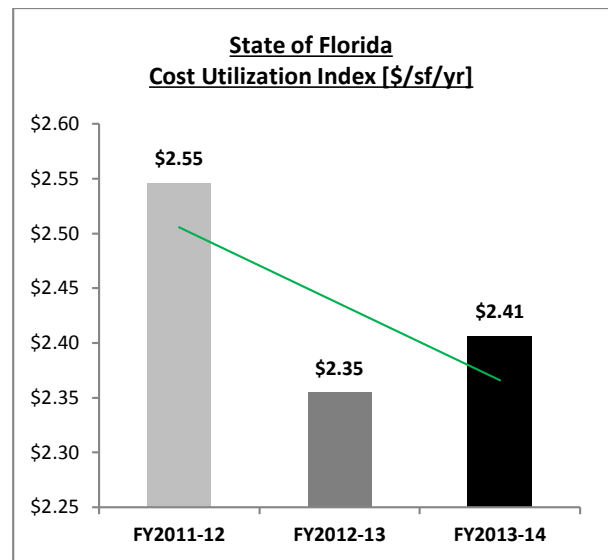
**Figure 1: State of Florida

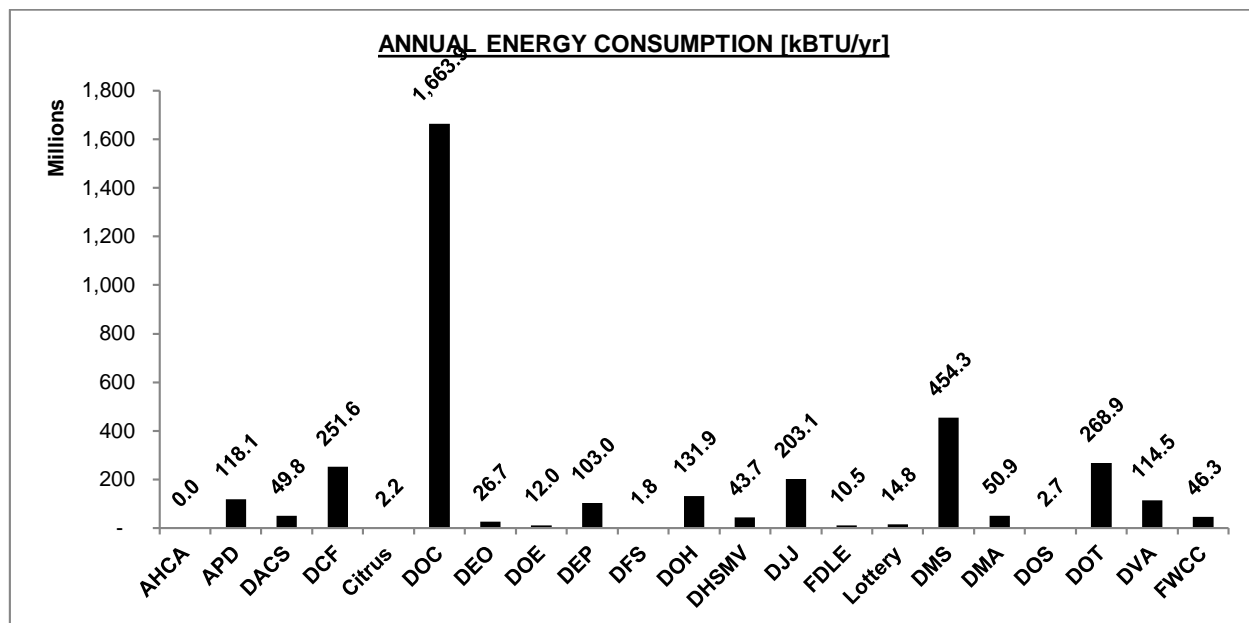


Figure 5: AEC, By Agency, 3-Year Comparison
Total AEC: 3,570,724,059 kBTU

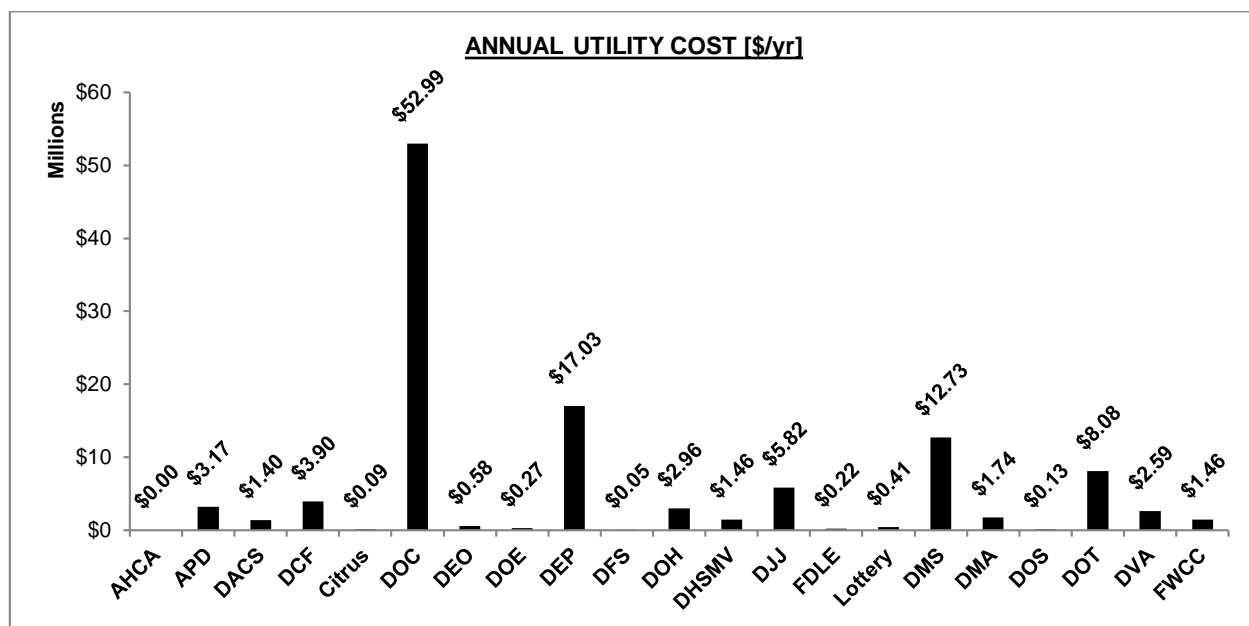


Figure 6: AUC, By Agency, 3-Year Comparison
State of Florida AUC = \$117,092,115.53

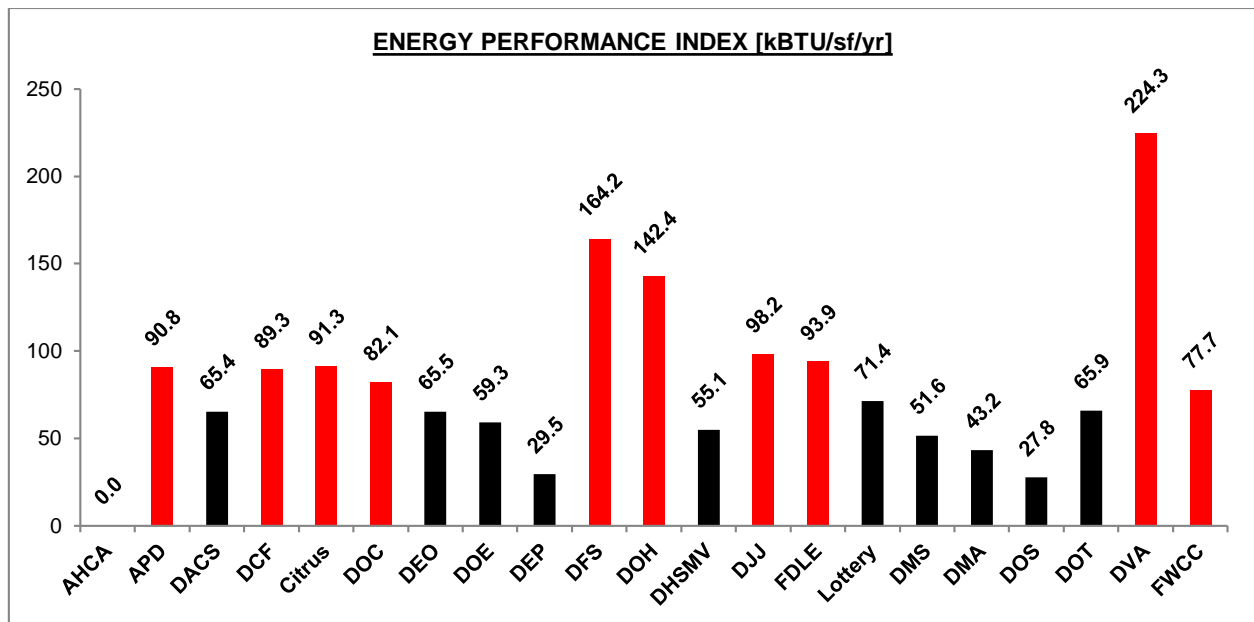


Figure 7: EPI, By Agency, 3-Year Comparison
State of Florida EPI = 73.4

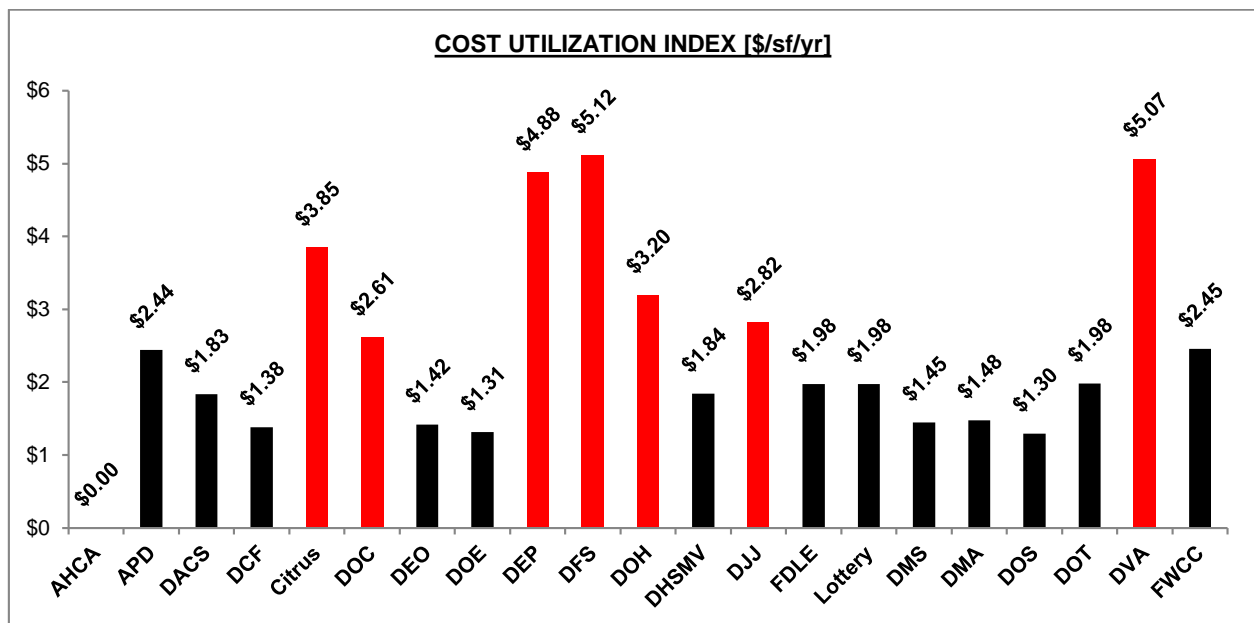


Figure 8: CUI, By Agency, 3-Year Comparison

Performance Indices & Benchmarking

This report compares each agency's energy performance to the United States Department of Energy's Commercial Building Energy Consumption Survey (CBECS) for 2003, which is the latest CBECS data available and serves as the foundation of the federal Energy Star Program. The 2012 CBECS data is currently being processed by the United States Energy Information Administration. The performance metrics utilized in this analysis are the Energy Performance Index (EPI) and the Cost Utilization Index (CUI). The EPI, measured in kBtu per square foot per year (kBtu/sf/yr), is the ratio of total energy consumed to the total square footage over the course of one full year. The CUI, measured in dollars per square foot per year (\$/sf/yr), is the ratio of total energy cost to the total square footage over the course of one full year.

For comparison of individual agency properties to national benchmarks, Table 3 provides EPIs and CUIs based on region, square footage, and principal facility activity (occupancy type). Due to the facility-specific energy data collected in the SEMP, the state will be able to benchmark individual facilities to national statistics such as those provided in Table 2.

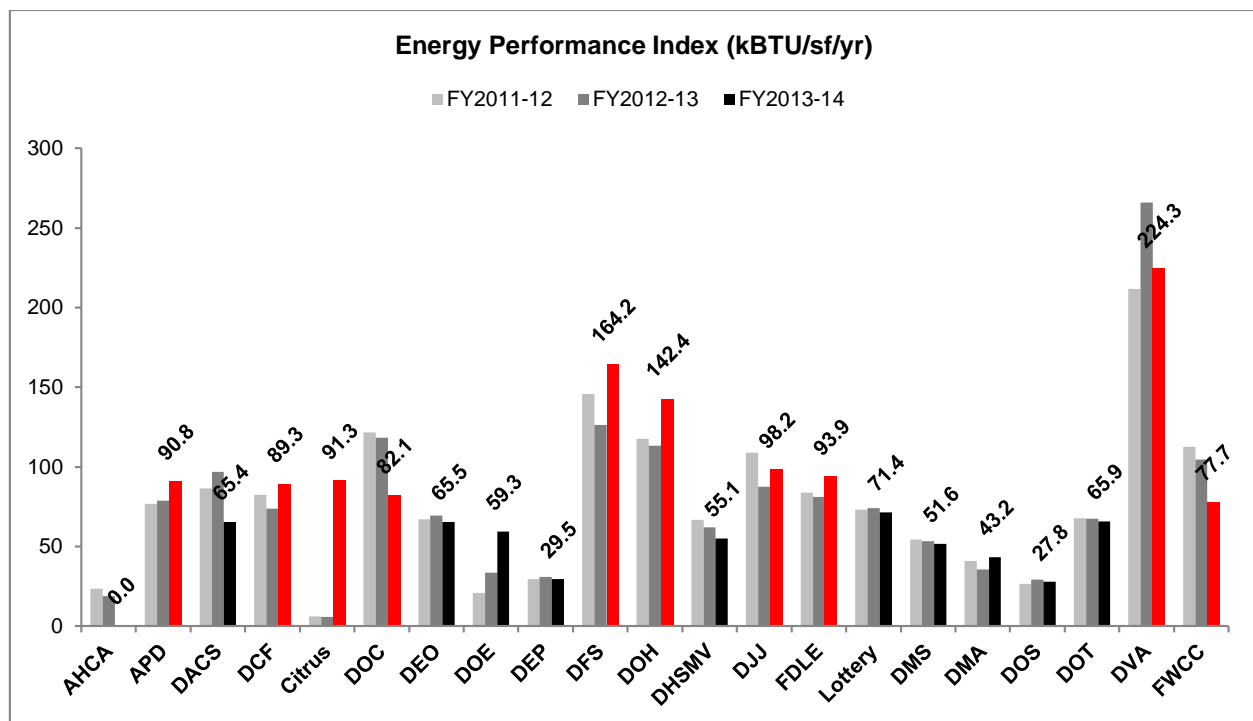


Figure 9: FY2013-14 Energy Performance Index (EPI) By Agency, FY 2013-14

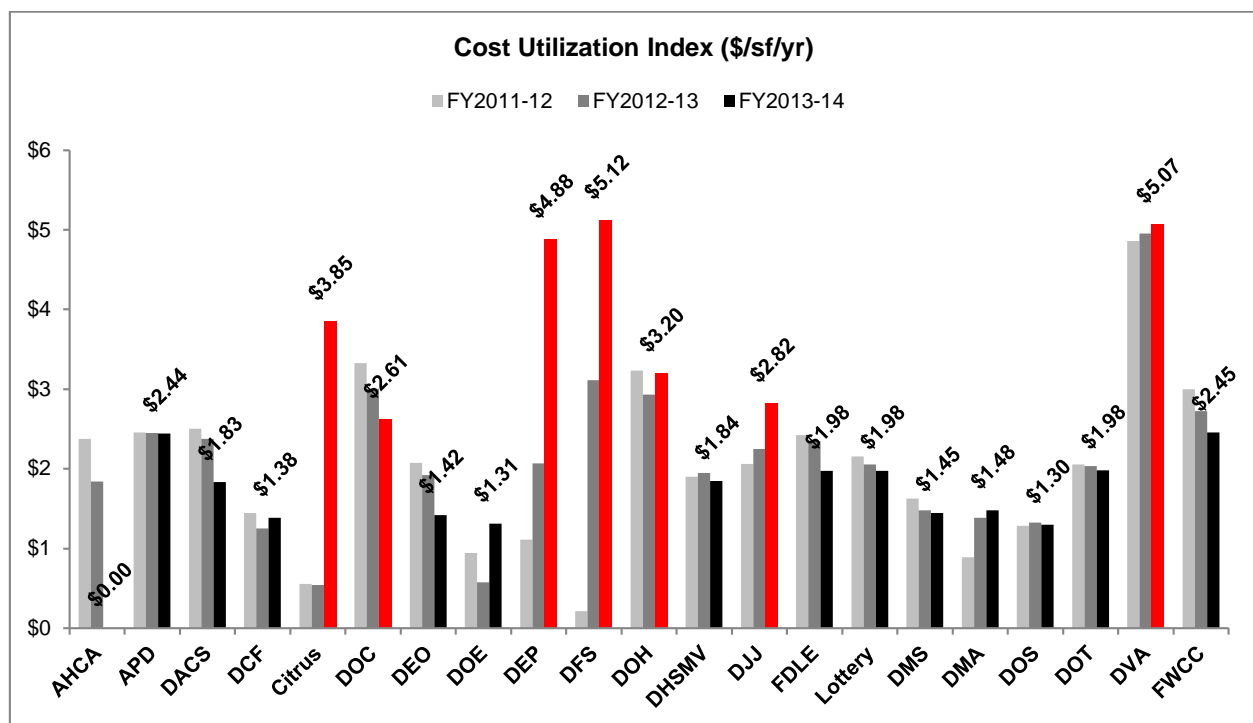


Figure 10: FY2013-14 Cost Utilization Index (CUI) By Agency, FY 2013-14

The state's overall EPI is 73.4 (kBtu/sf/yr). Figure 9 illustrates the EPI for each of the agencies, compared to the state's overall EPI, as well as the CBECS South Atlantic EPI of 86.8, and the CBECS Healthcare EPI of 249.2. The state's overall CUI is \$2.41 (\$/sf/yr). Figure 10 illustrates the CUI for each of the 20 agencies, compared to the state's overall CUI, as well as the CBECS South Atlantic CUI of \$1.43, and the CBECS Healthcare EPI of \$2.80.

It should be noted the increases in EPI and/or CUI for Department of Citrus (Citrus) and Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) can be attributed to changes in SEMP reporting requirements, resulting in increased gross square footage for both agencies.

 State of Florida EPI = 73.4; CBECS South Atlantic EPI = 86.8; CBECS Inpatient EPI = 249.2

The purpose of the additional CBECS data is to demonstrate that different facility types have substantially different levels of energy intensity. Although the EPI of 86.8 and CUI of \$1.43 may be considered a reasonable benchmark for office space and other space types of similar occupancies, it would not be an appropriate benchmark for hospitals and correctional facilities due to occupancy levels, complexity, operating schedules, and other characteristics. The EPI of 249.2 and CUI of \$2.80 would be a more reasonable benchmark for these facility types.

Agency Summaries

This section of the report provides the key metrics for each agency, as provided in Table 3. On subsequent pages, the performance of each agency is compared over the three years (FY 2011-12 to FY 2013-14) of SEMP data collection.

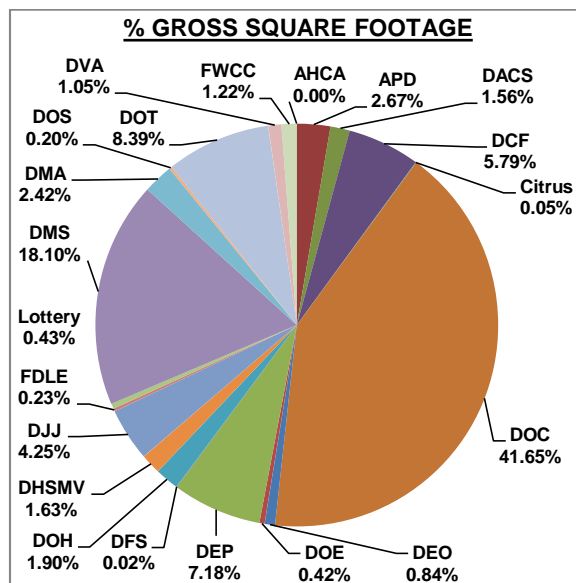


Figure 11: Gross Square Footage Distribution

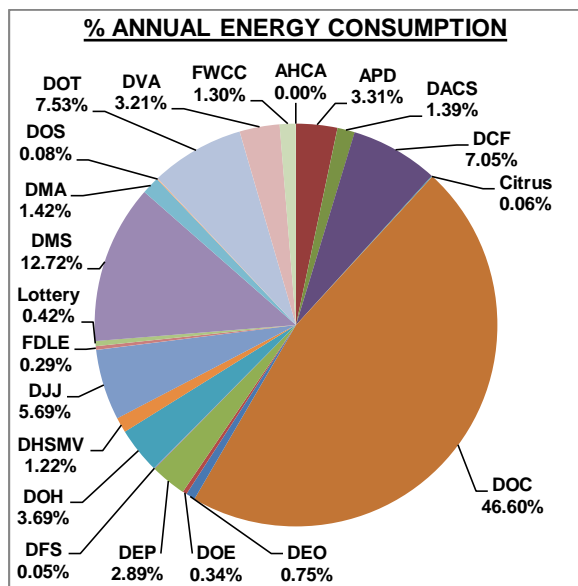


Figure 12: Energy Consumption Distribution

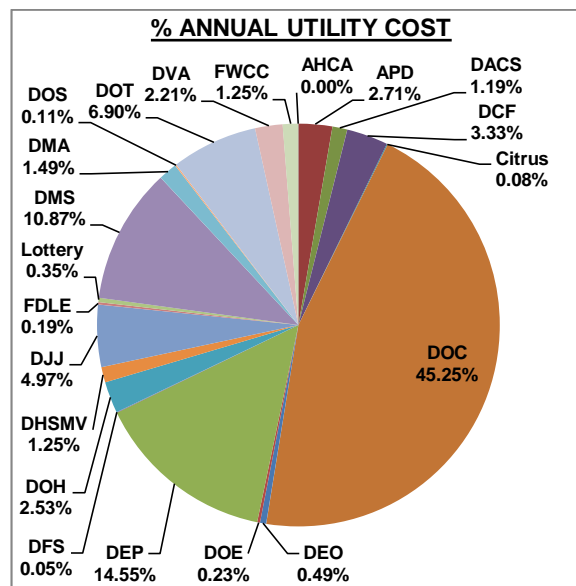


Figure 13: Utility Cost Distribution

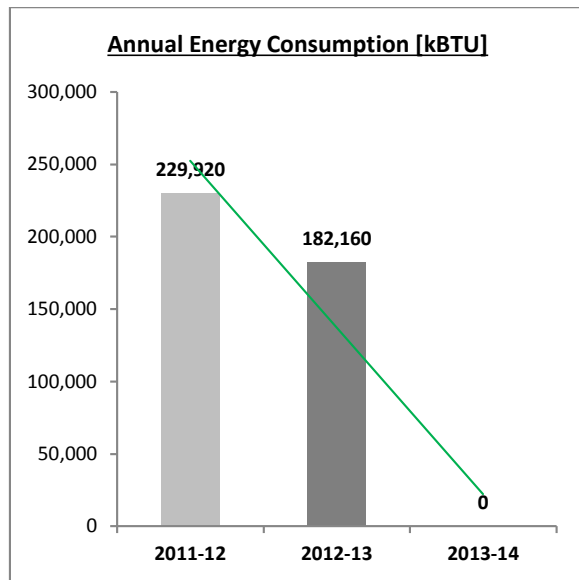


Figure 14: AHCA-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

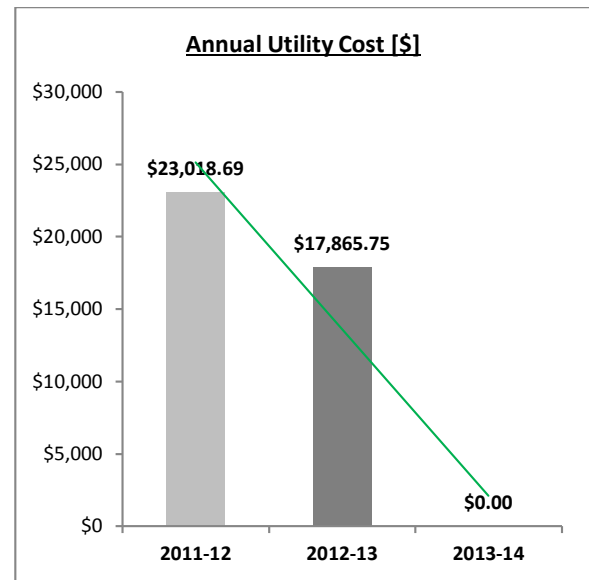


Figure 15: AHCA-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

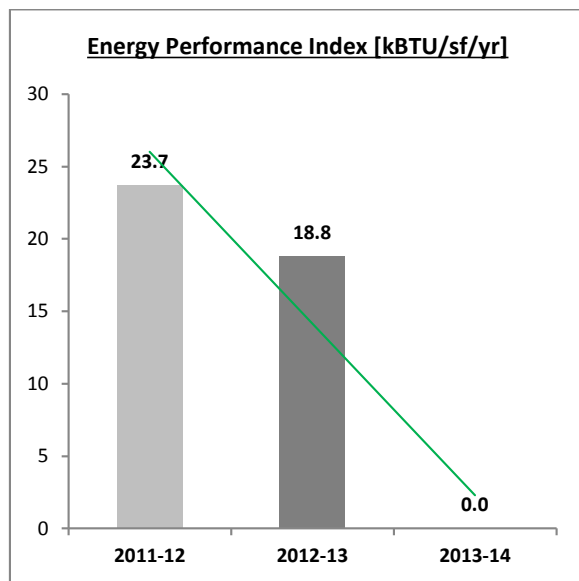


Figure 16: AHCA-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

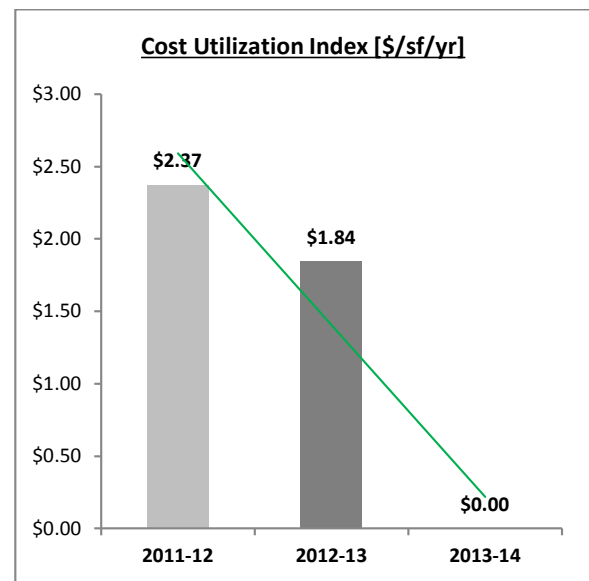


Figure 17: AHCA-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

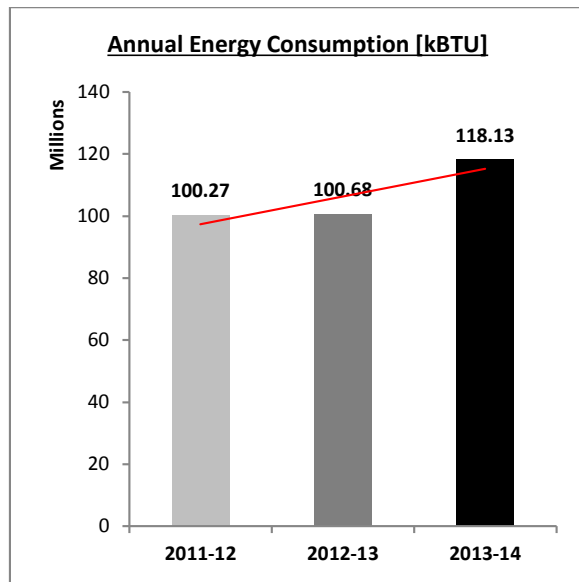


Figure 18: APD-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

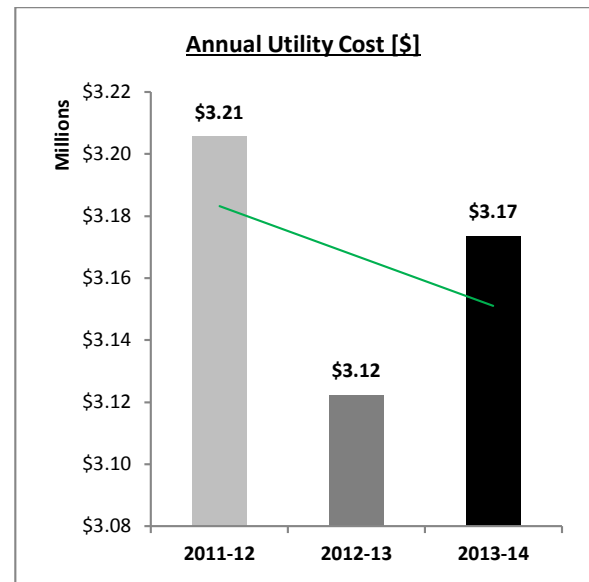


Figure 19: APD-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

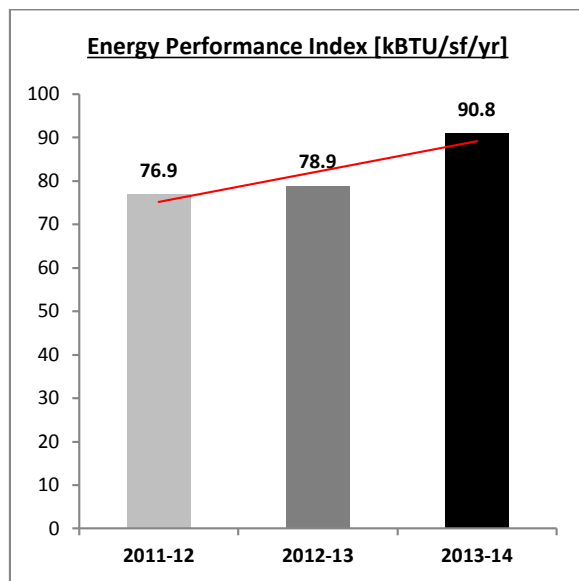


Figure 20: APD-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

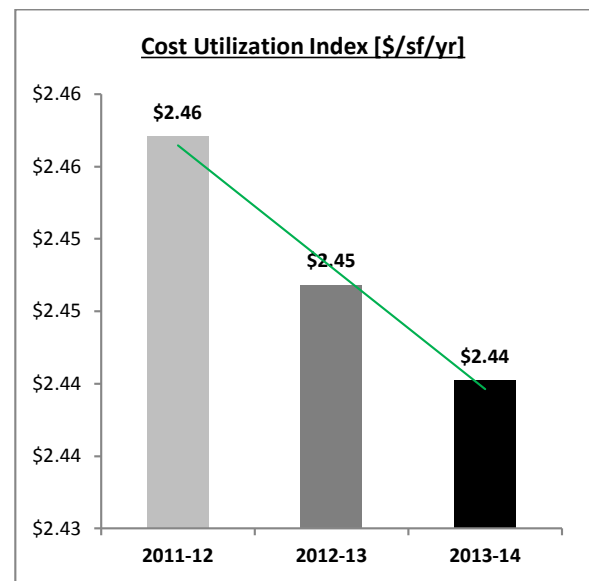


Figure 21: APD-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

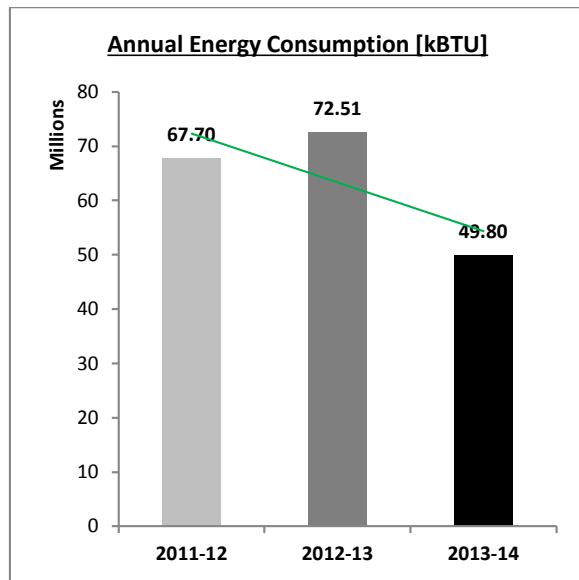


Figure 22: DACS-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

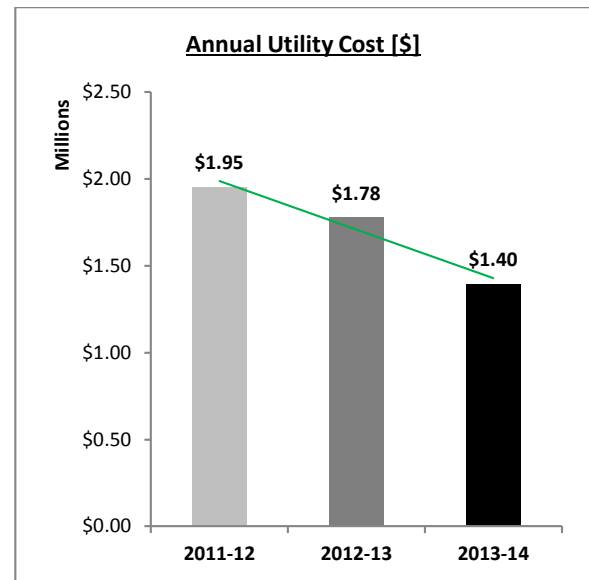


Figure 23: DACS-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

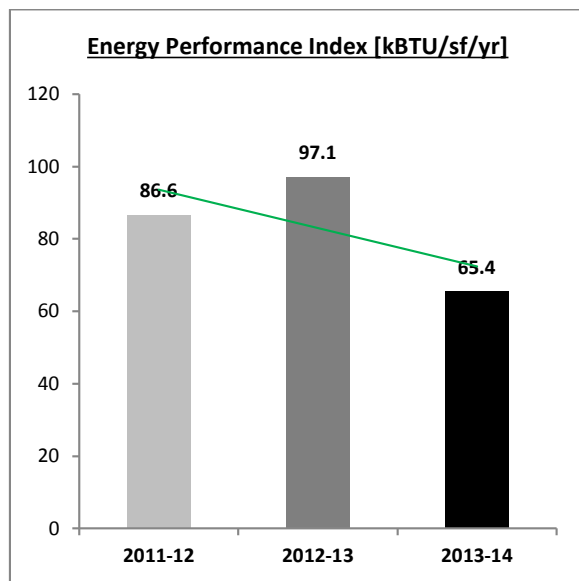


Figure 24: DACS-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

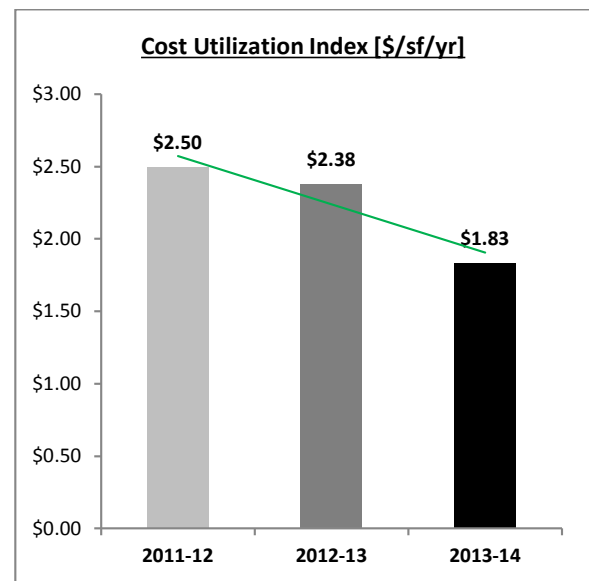


Figure 25: DACS-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

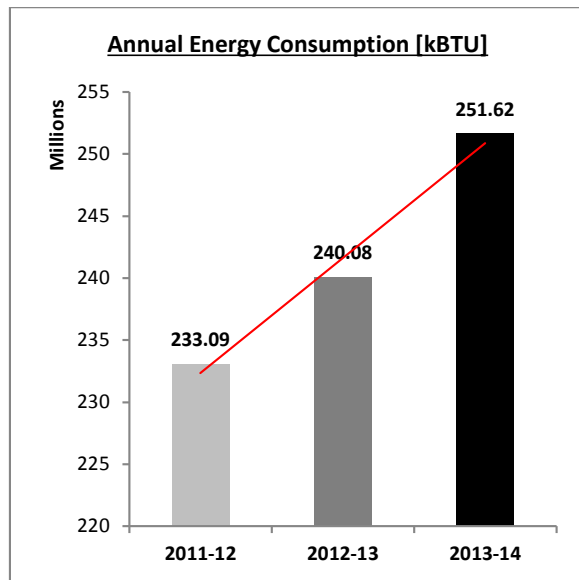


Figure 26: DCF-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

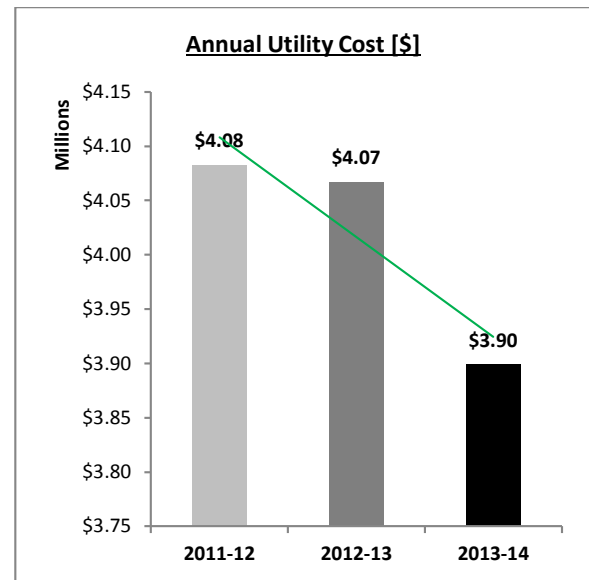


Figure 27: DCF-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

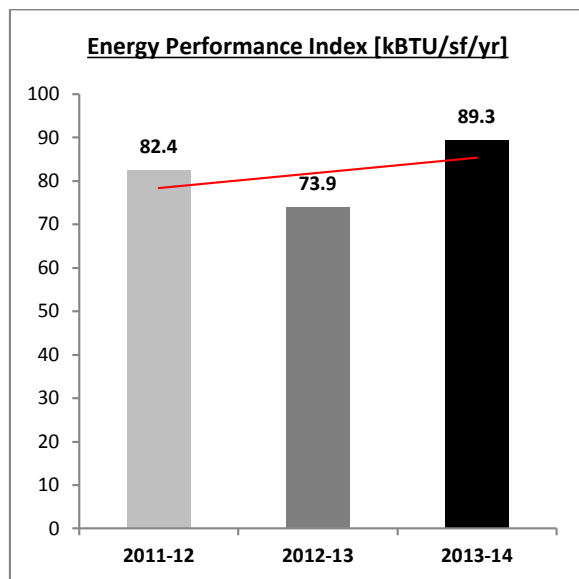


Figure 28: DCF-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

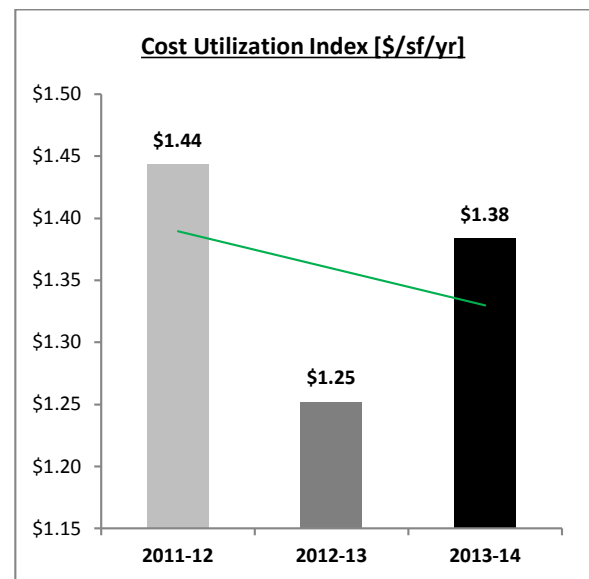


Figure 29: DCF-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

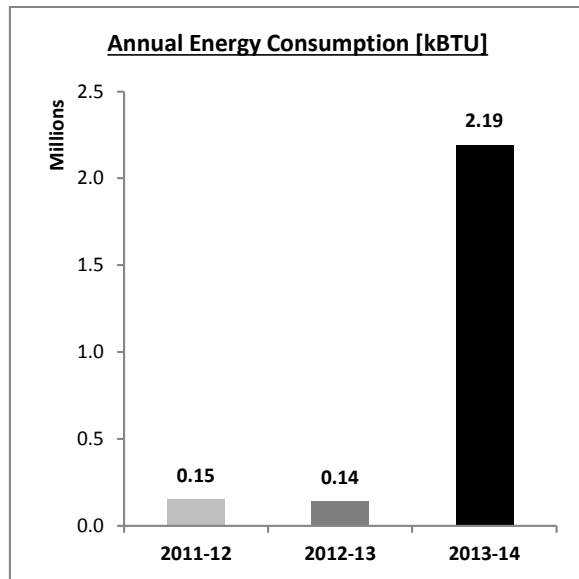


Figure 30: Citrus-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

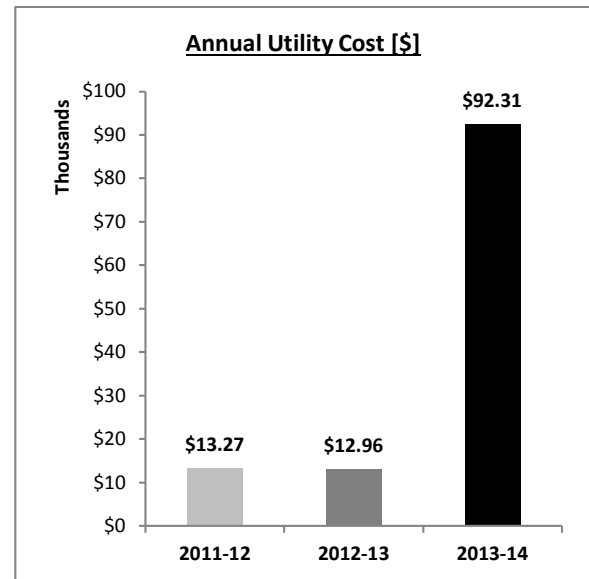


Figure 31: Citrus-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

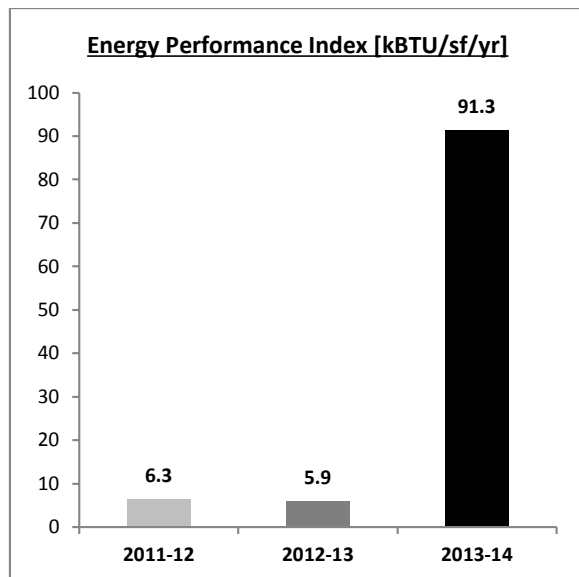


Figure 32: Citrus-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

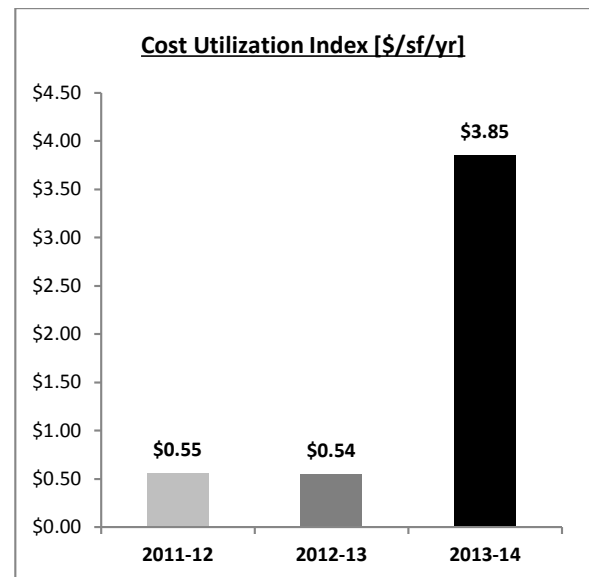


Figure 33: Citrus-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

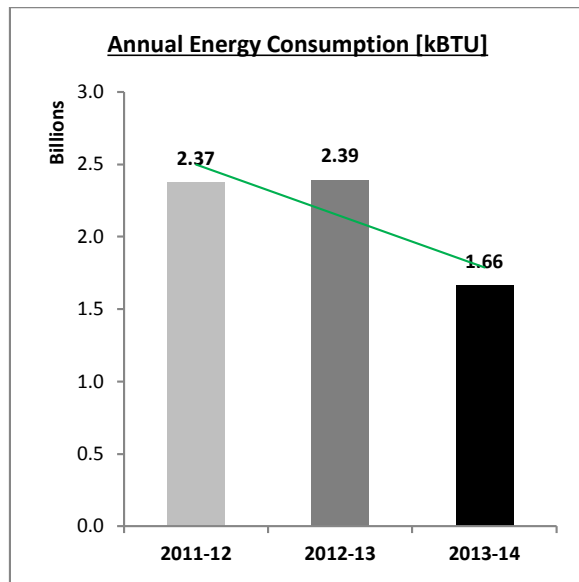


Figure 34: DOC-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

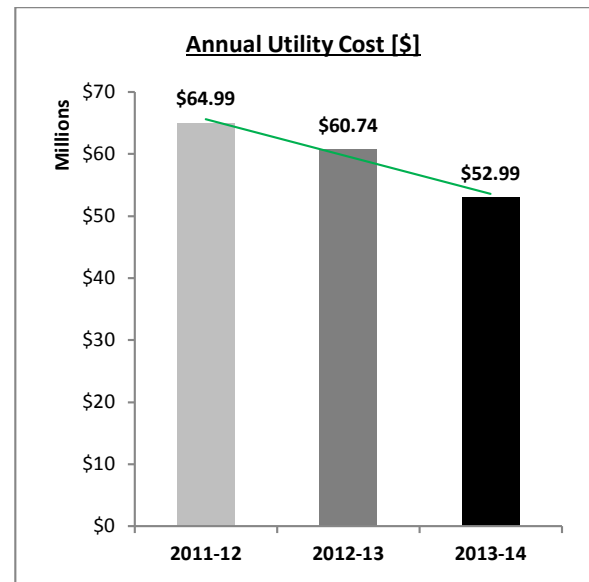


Figure 35: DOC-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

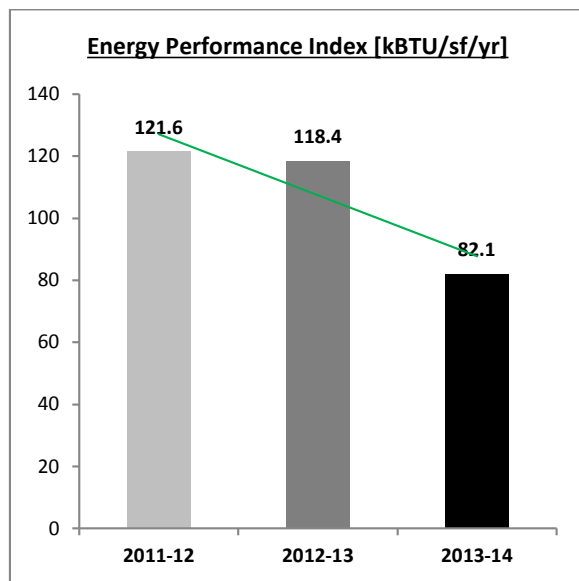


Figure 36: DOC-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

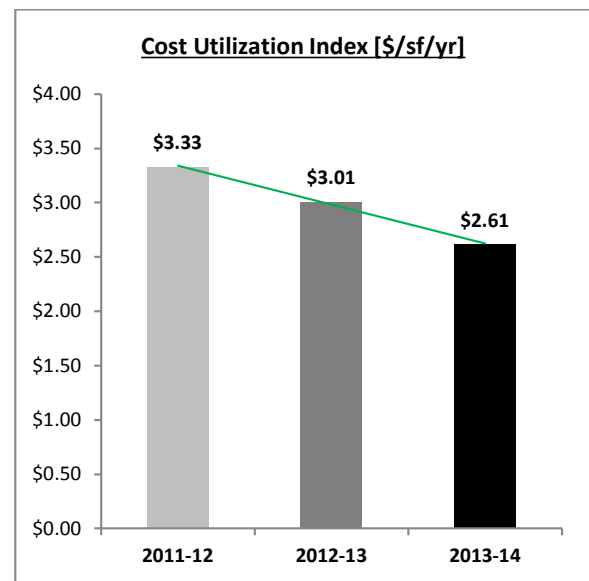


Figure 37: DOC-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

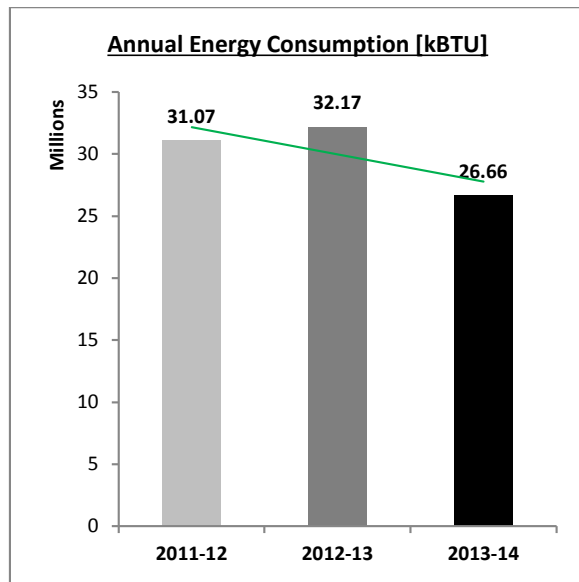


Figure 38: DEO-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

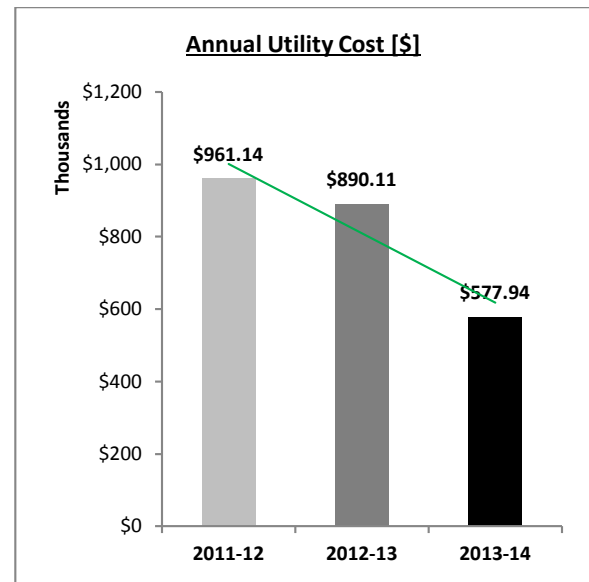


Figure 39: DEO-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

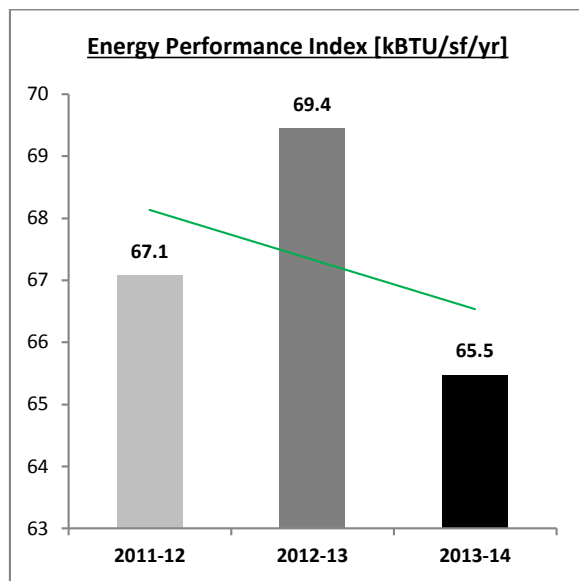


Figure 40: DEO-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

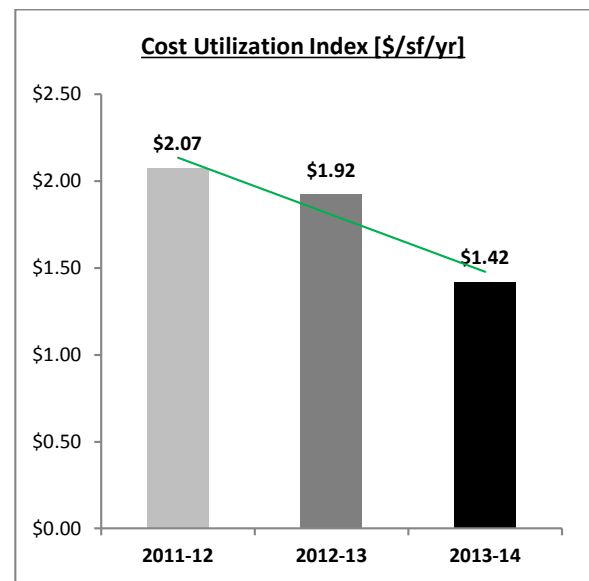


Figure 41: DEO-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

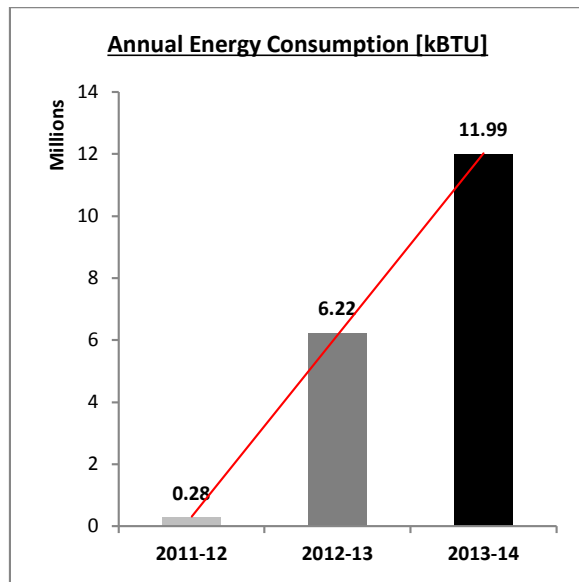


Figure 42: DOE-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

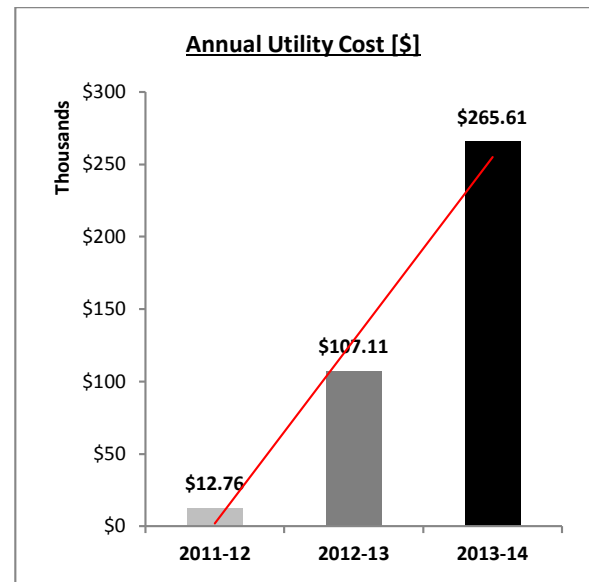


Figure 43: DOE-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

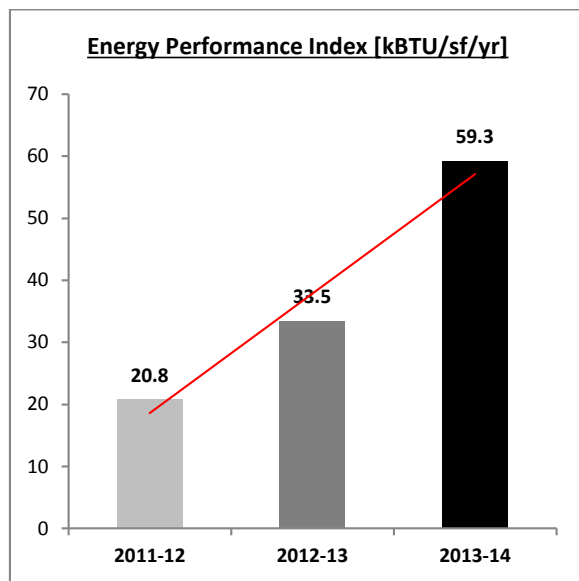


Figure 44: DOE-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

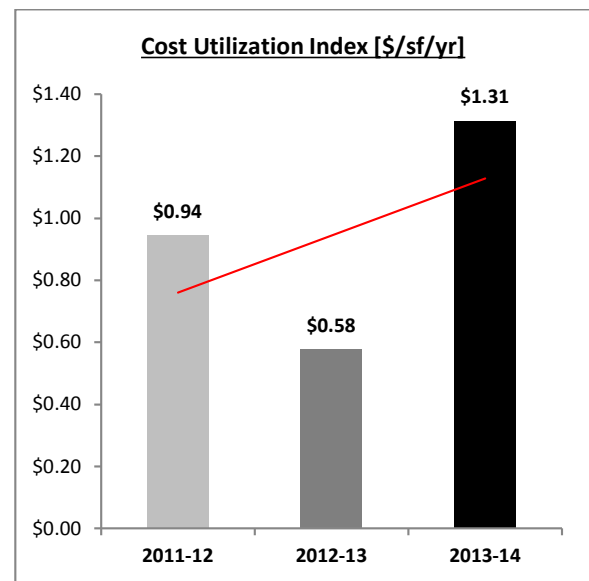


Figure 45: DOE-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

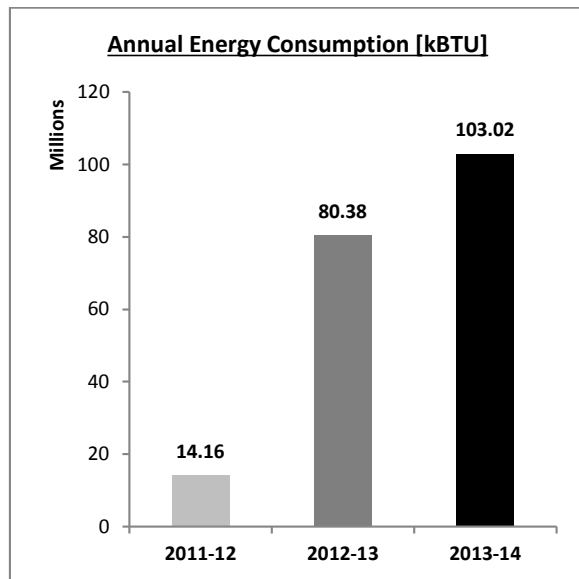


Figure 46: DEP-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

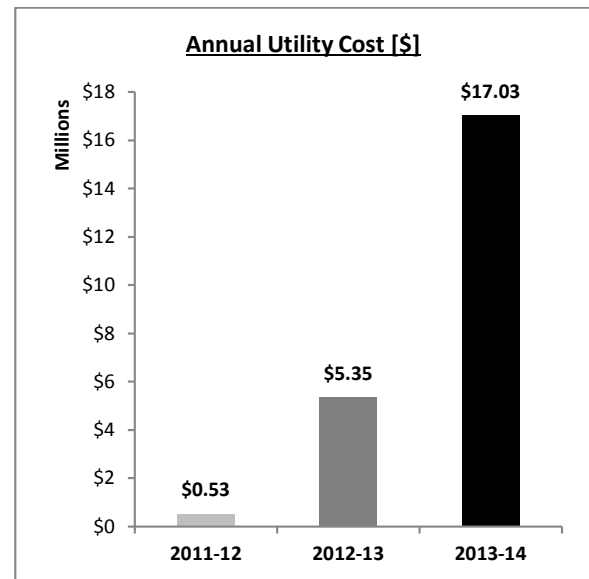


Figure 47: DEP-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

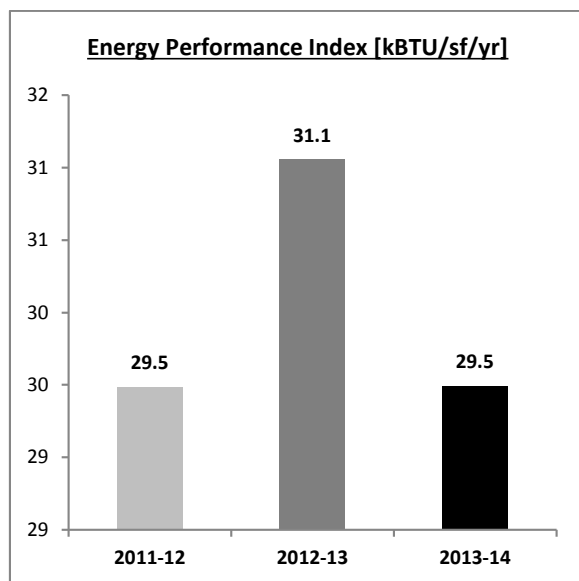


Figure 48: DEP-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

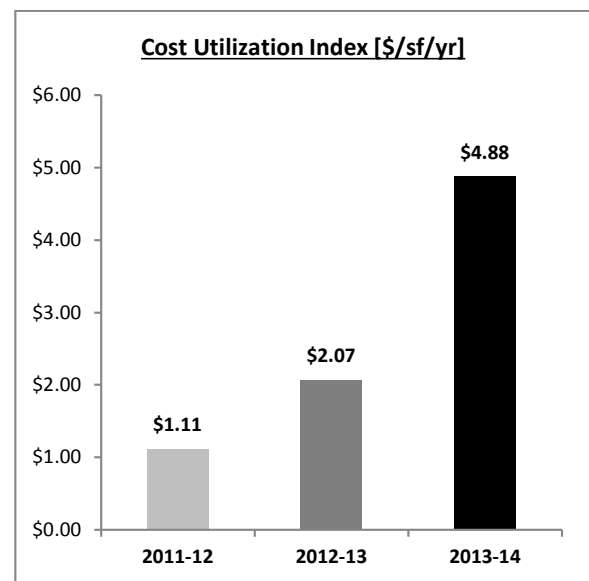


Figure 49: DEP-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

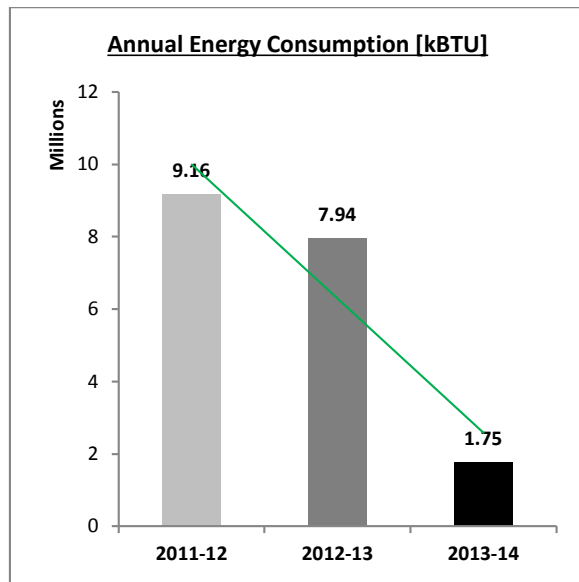


Figure 50: DFS-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

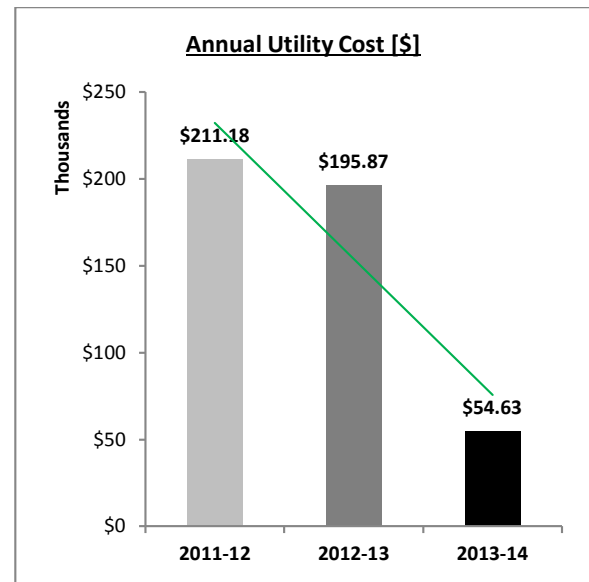


Figure 51: DFS-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

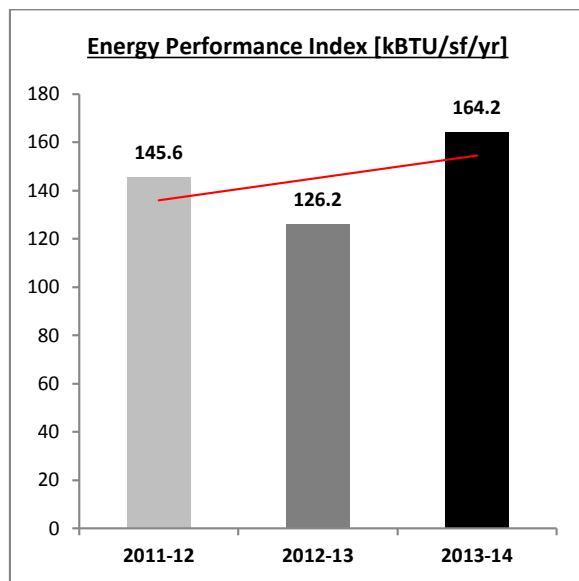


Figure 52: DFS-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

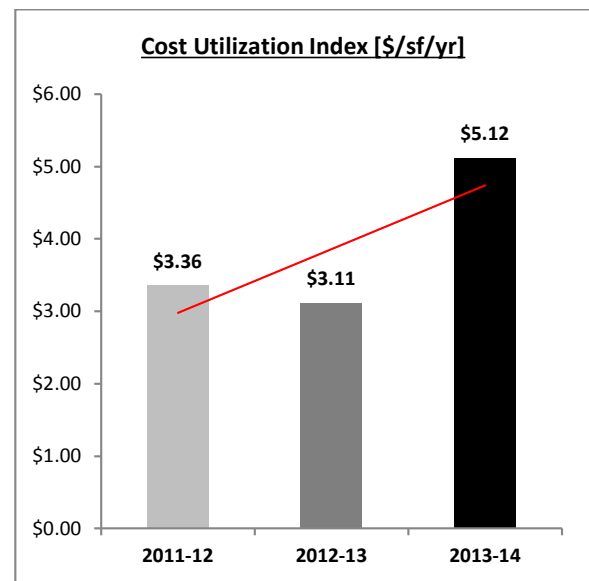


Figure 53: DFS-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

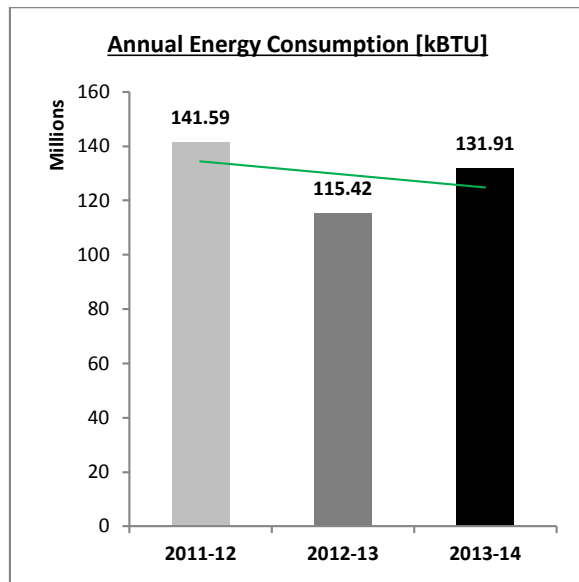


Figure 54: DOH-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

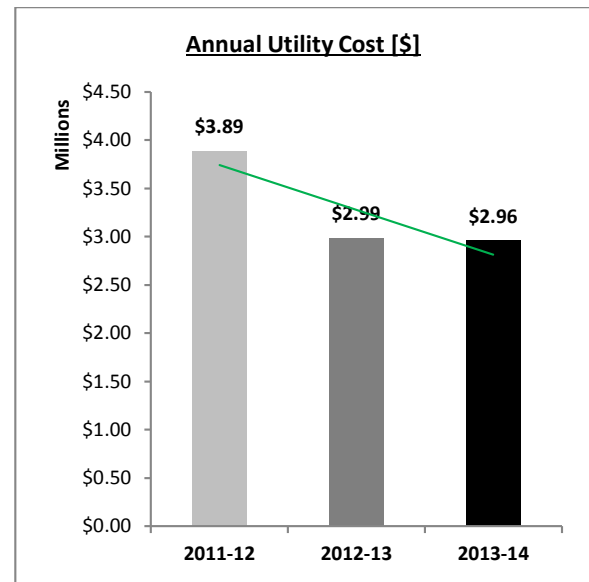


Figure 55: DOH-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

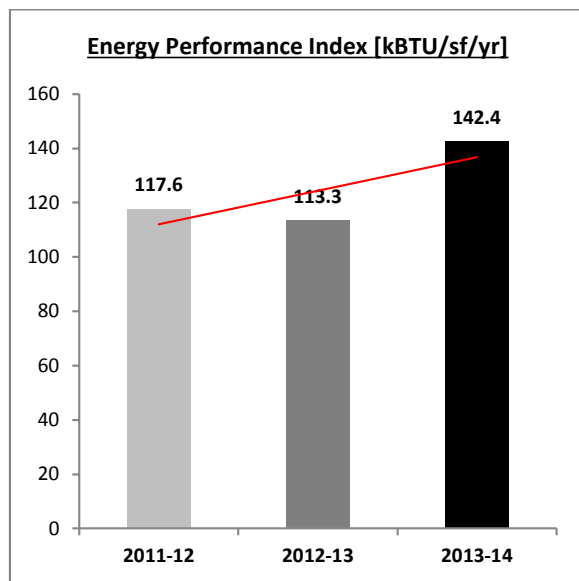


Figure 56: DOH-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

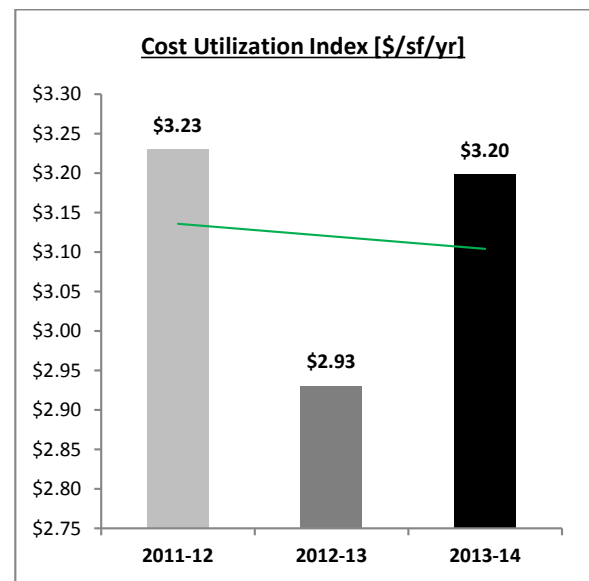


Figure 57: DOH-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

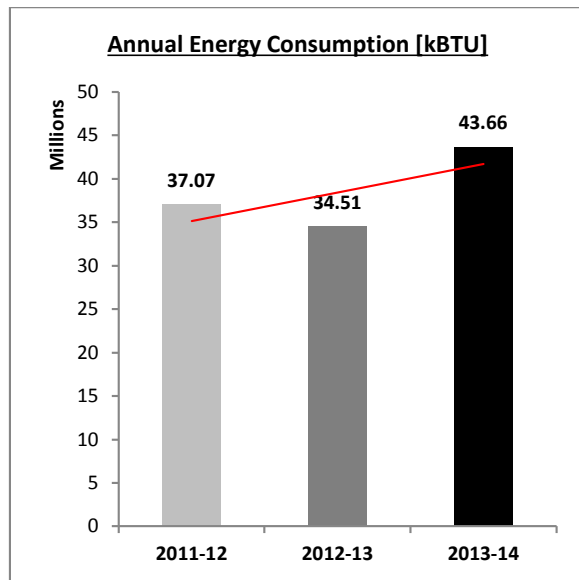


Figure 58: DHSMV-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

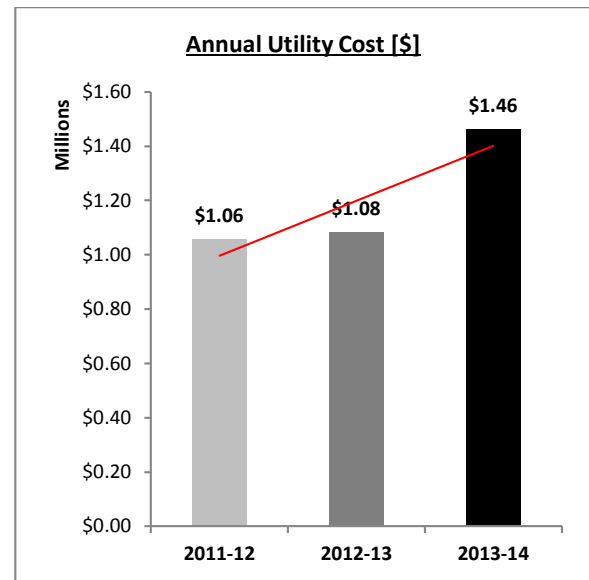


Figure 59: DHSMV-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

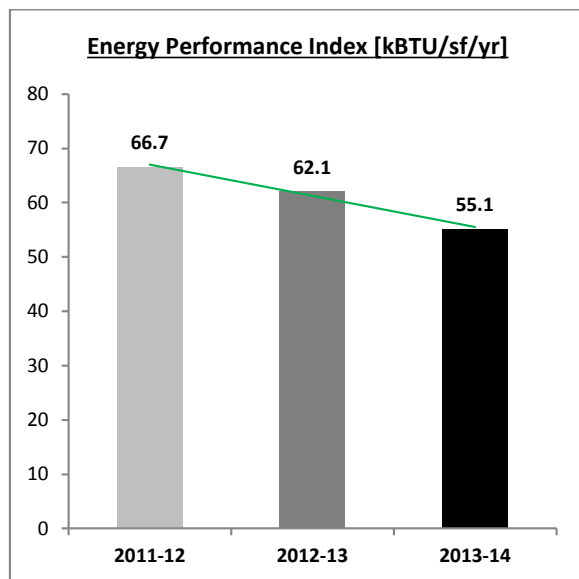


Figure 60: DHSMV-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

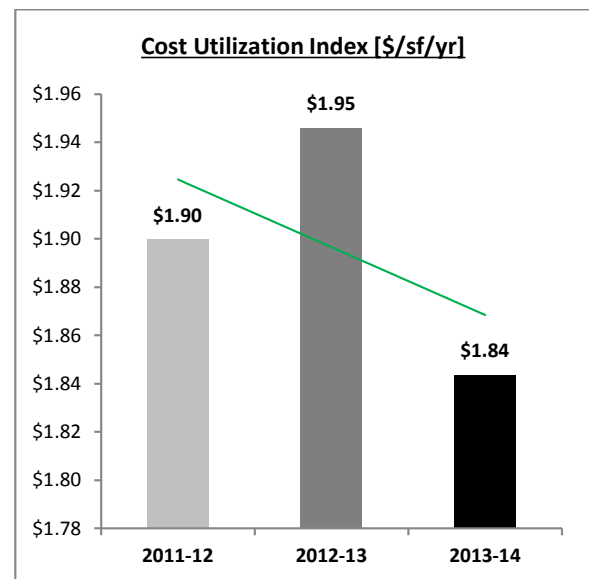


Figure 61: DHSMV-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

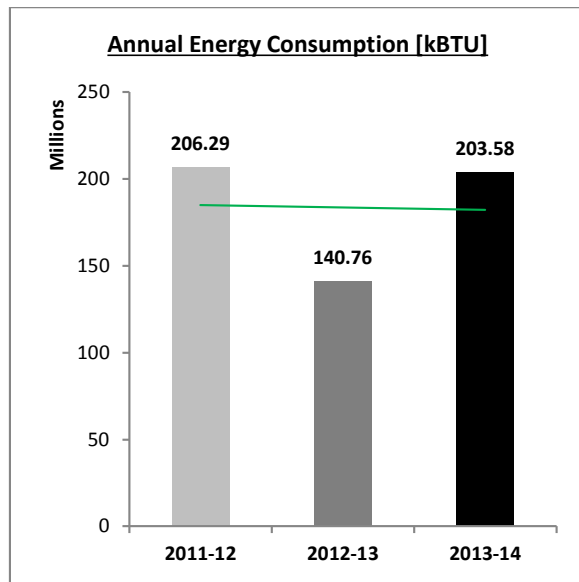


Figure 62: DJJ-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

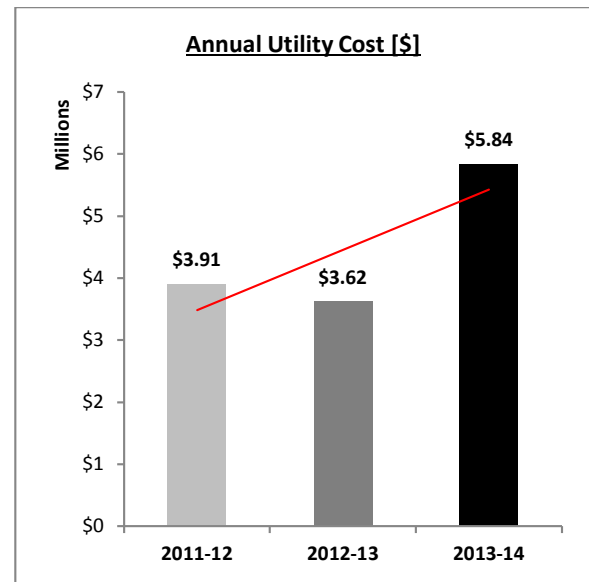


Figure 63: DJJ-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

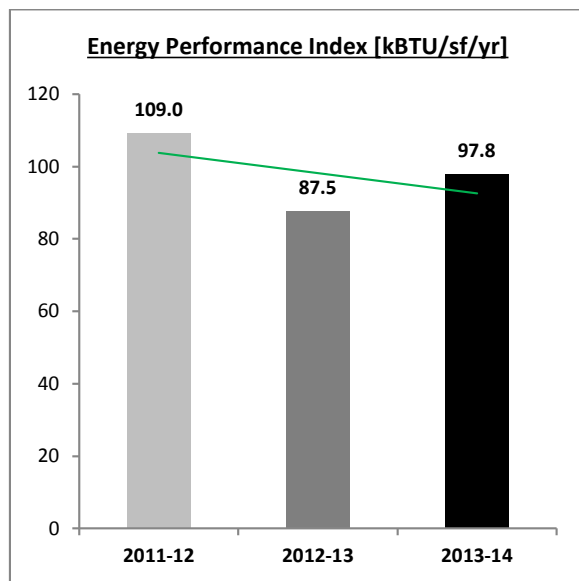


Figure 64: DJJ-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

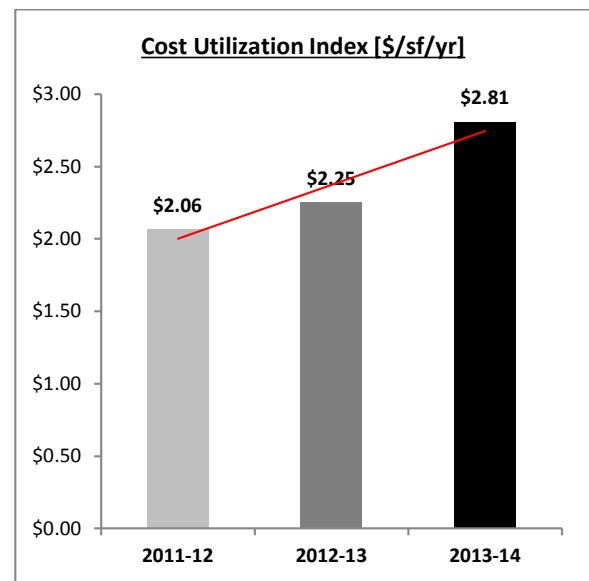


Figure 65: DJJ-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

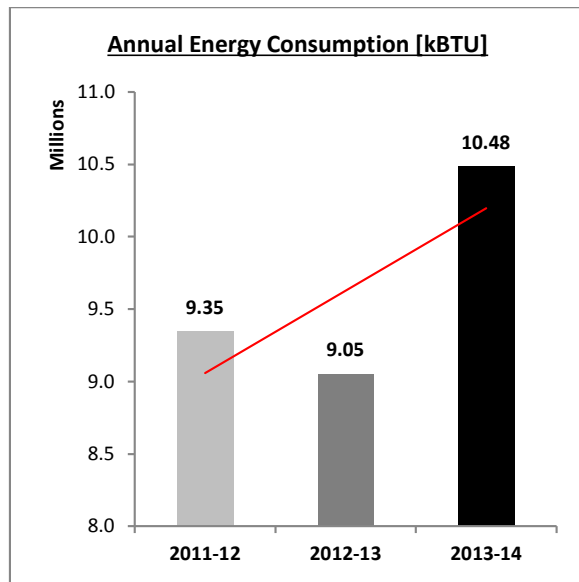


Figure 66: FDLE-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

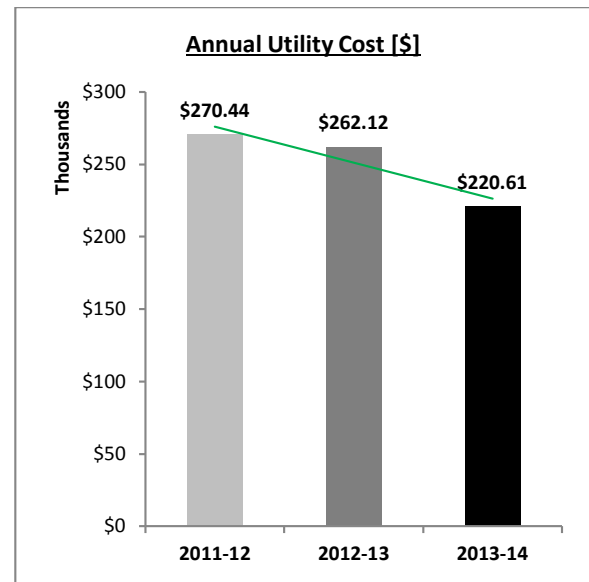


Figure 67: FDLE-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

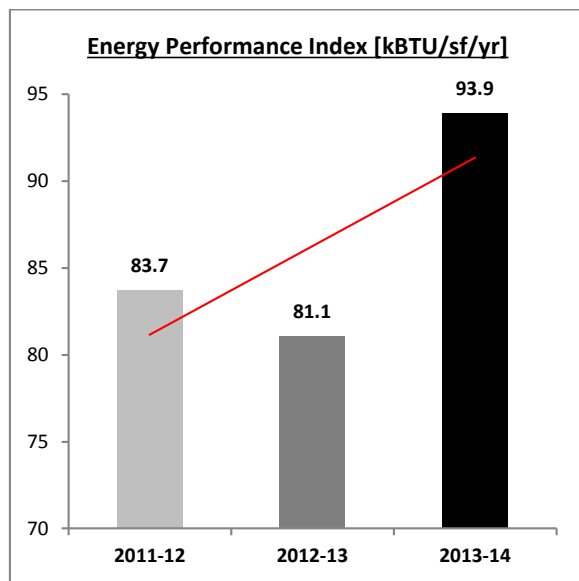


Figure 68: FDLE-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

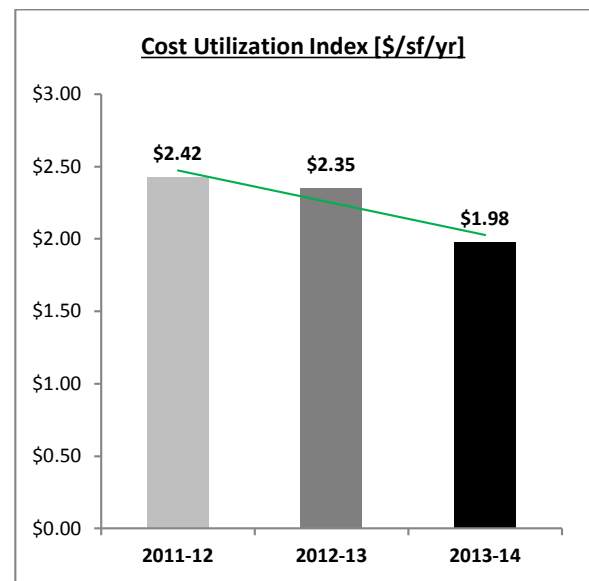


Figure 69: FDLE-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

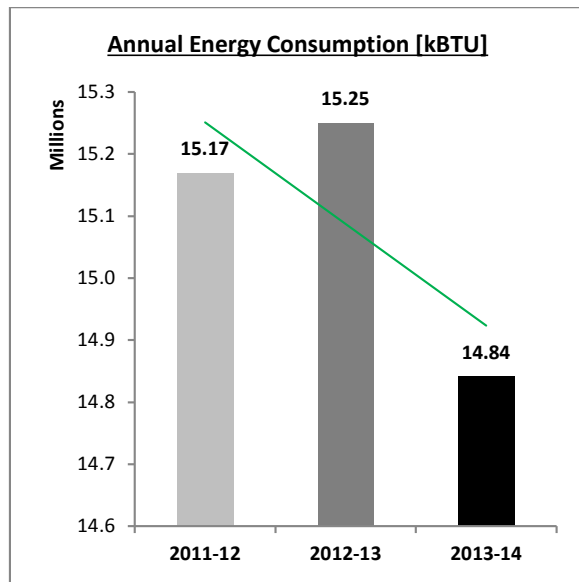


Figure 70: Lottery-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

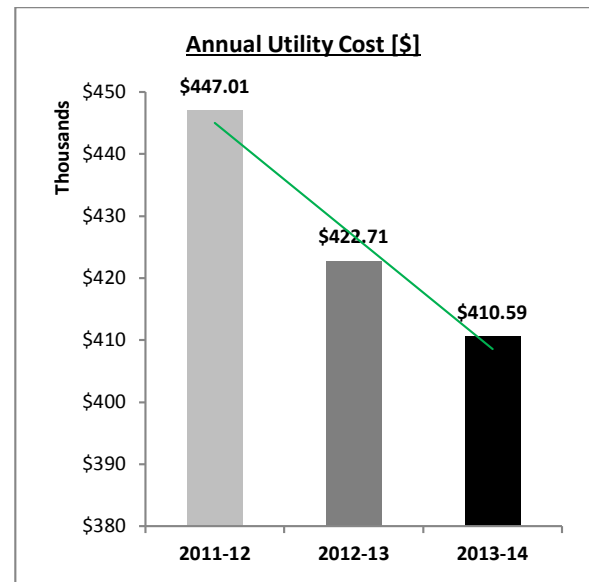


Figure 71: Lottery-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

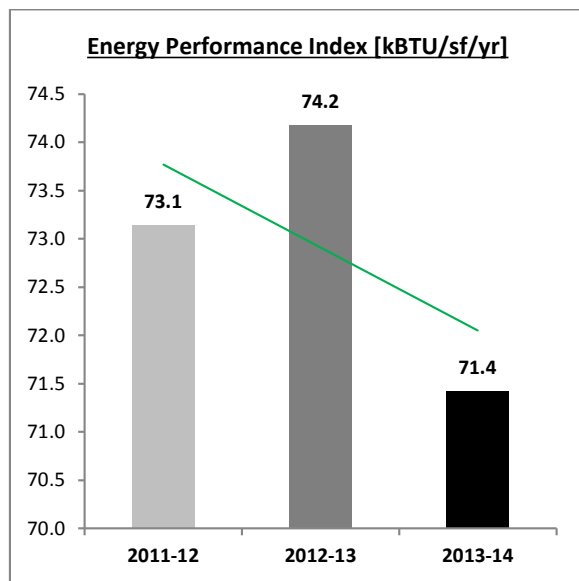


Figure 72: Lottery-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

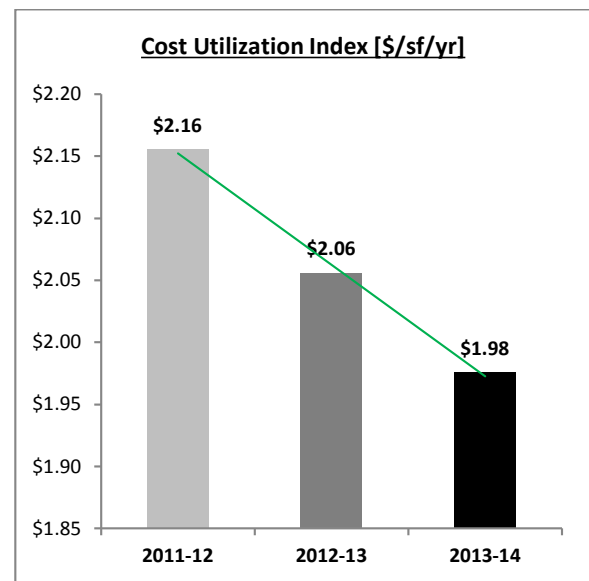


Figure 73: Lottery-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

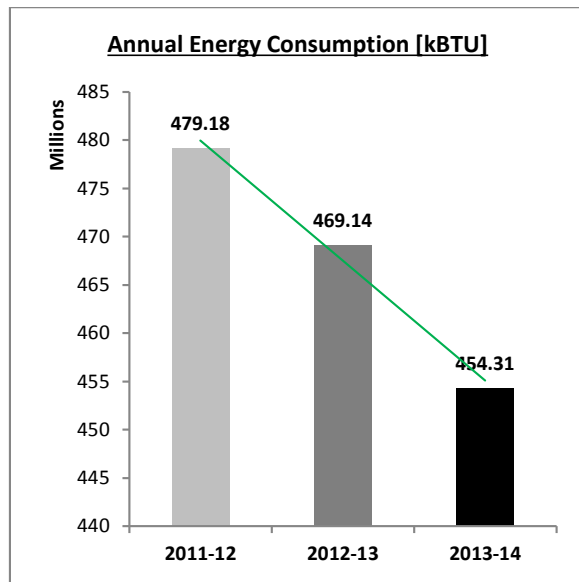


Figure 74: DMS-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

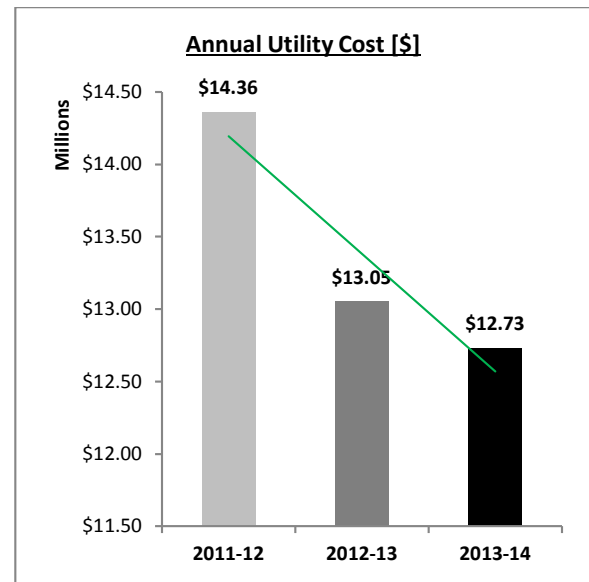


Figure 75: DMS-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

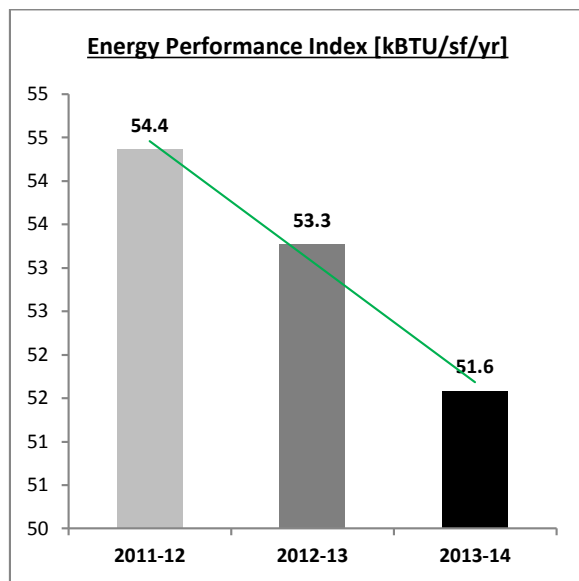


Figure 76: DMS-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

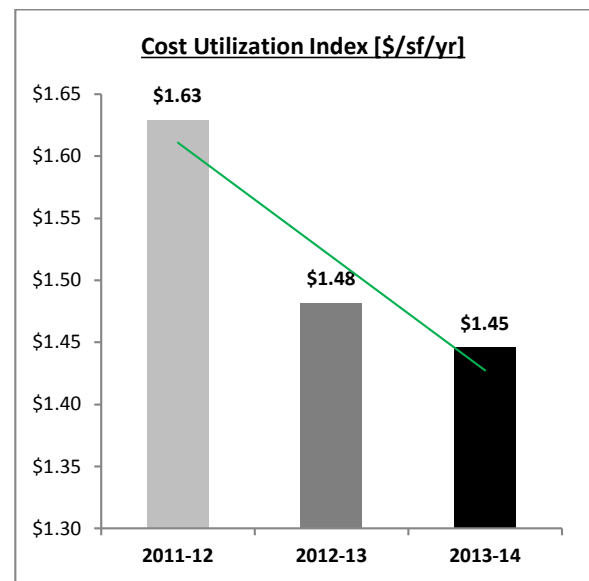


Figure 77: DMS-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

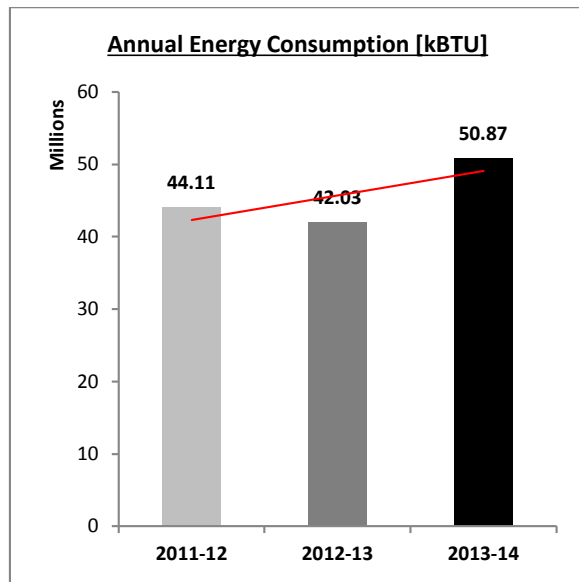


Figure 78: DMA-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

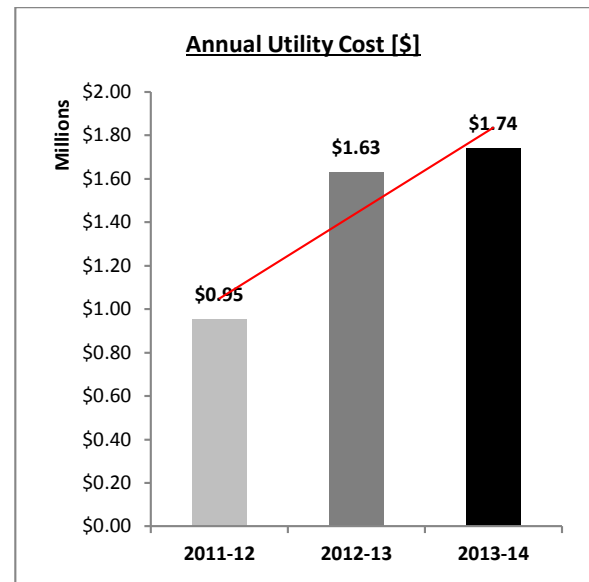


Figure 79: DMA-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

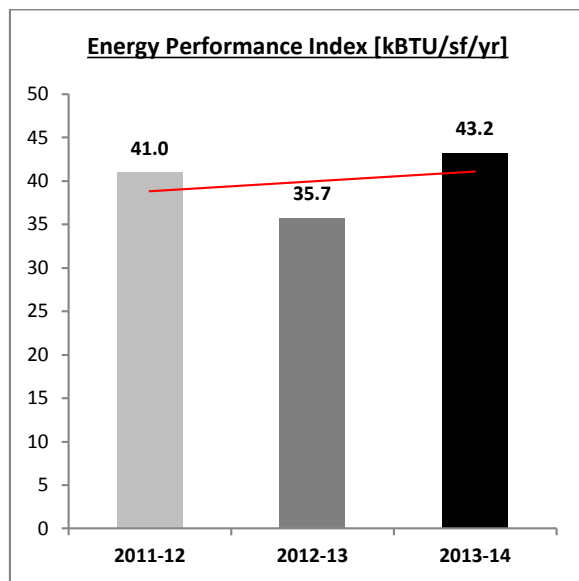


Figure 80: DMA-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

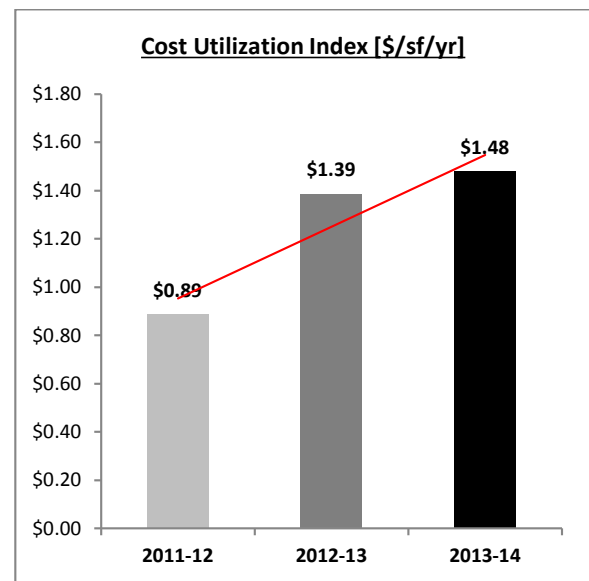


Figure 81: DMA-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

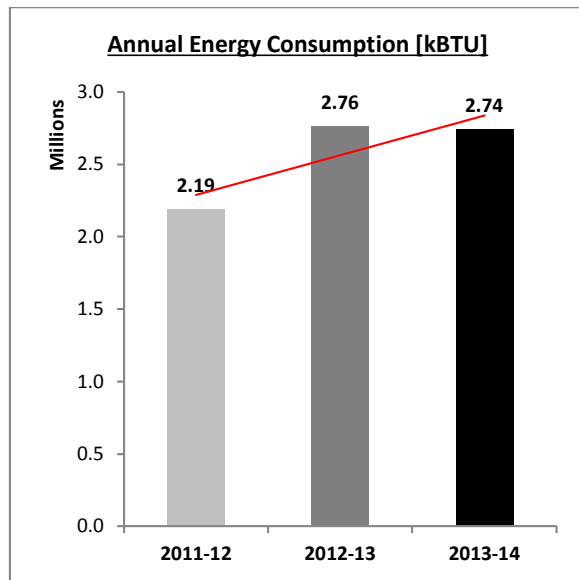


Figure 82: DOS-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

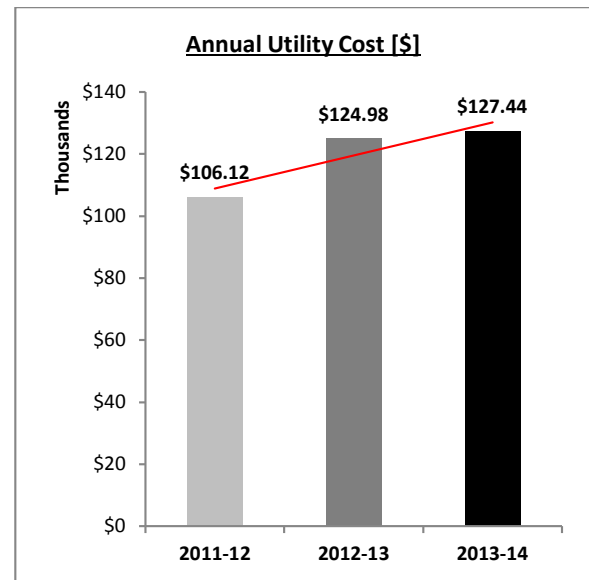


Figure 83: DOS-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

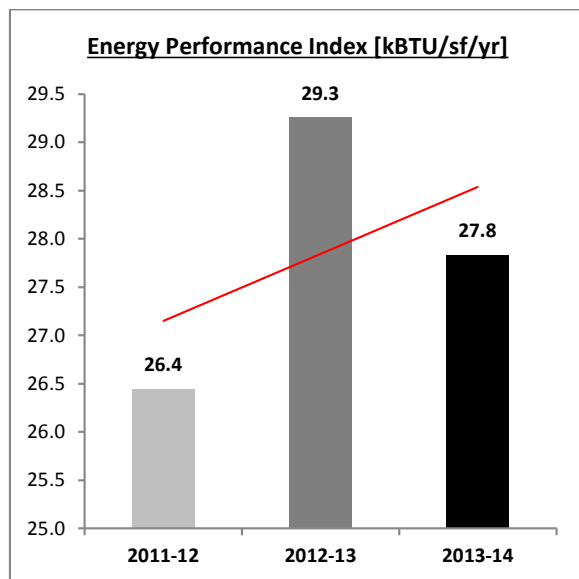


Figure 84: DOS-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

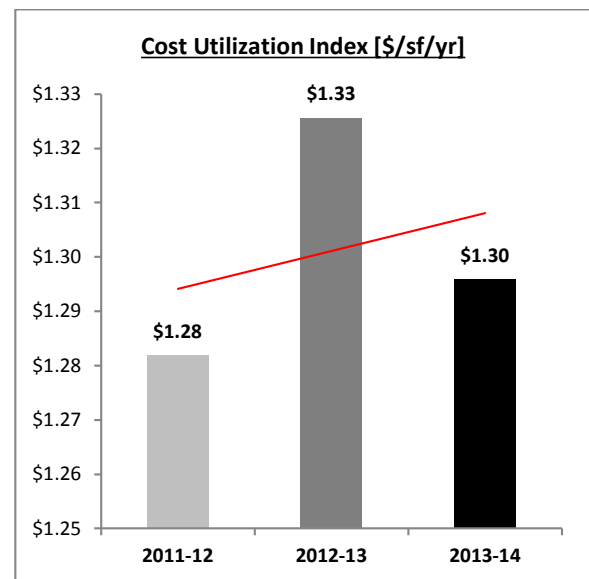


Figure 85: DOS-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

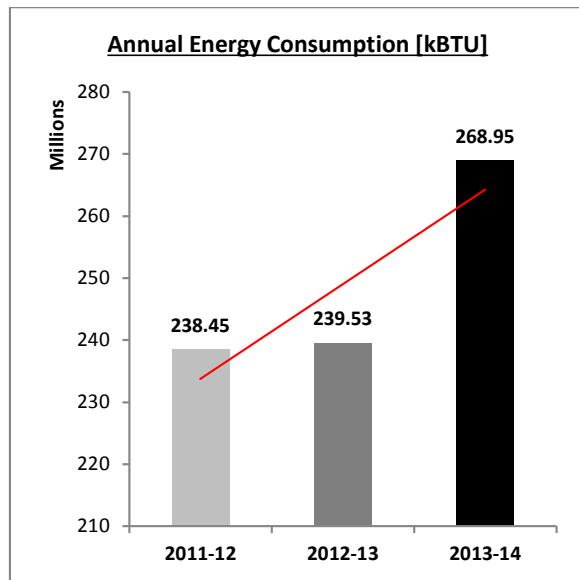


Figure 86: DOT-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

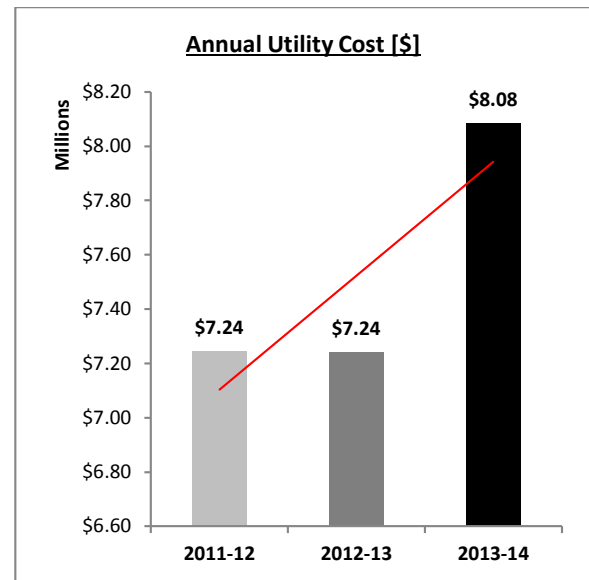


Figure 87: DOT-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

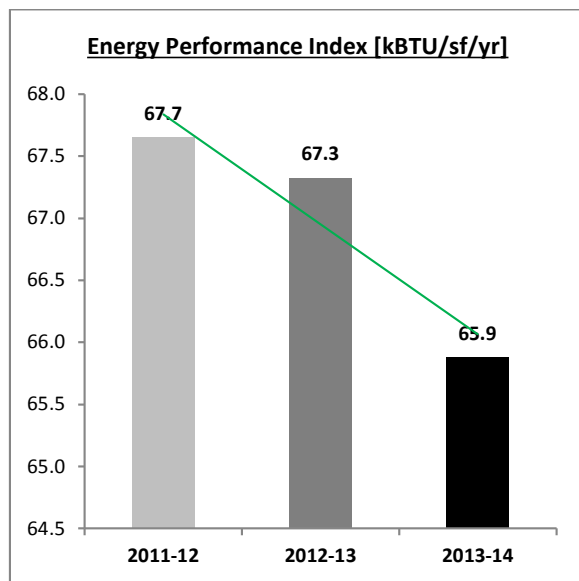


Figure 88: DOT-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

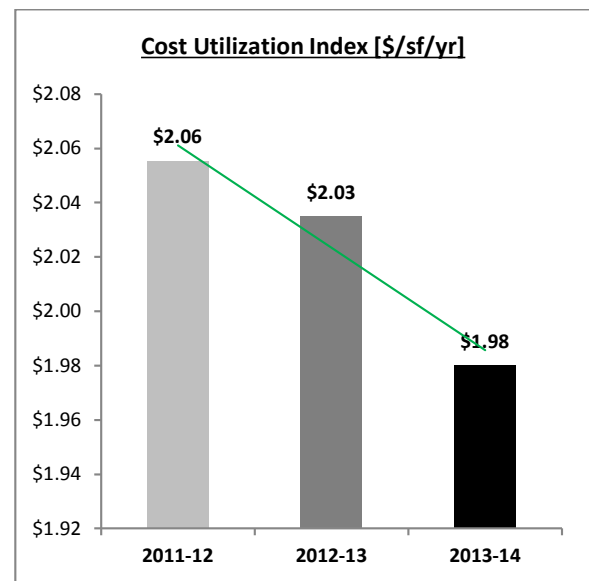


Figure 89: DOT-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

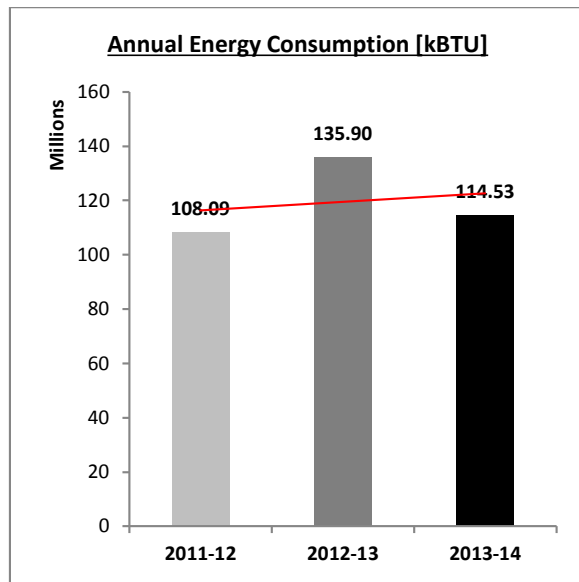


Figure 90: DVA-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

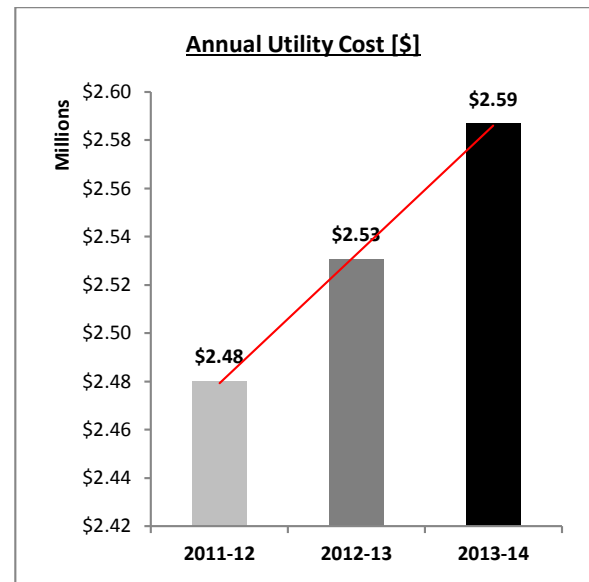


Figure 91: DVA-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

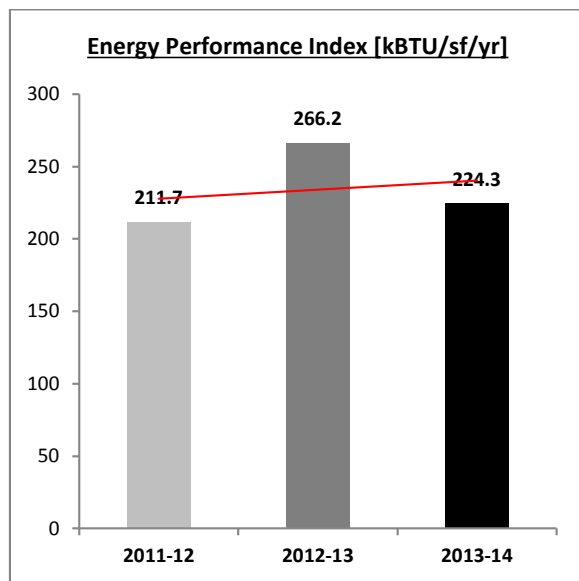


Figure 92: DVA-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

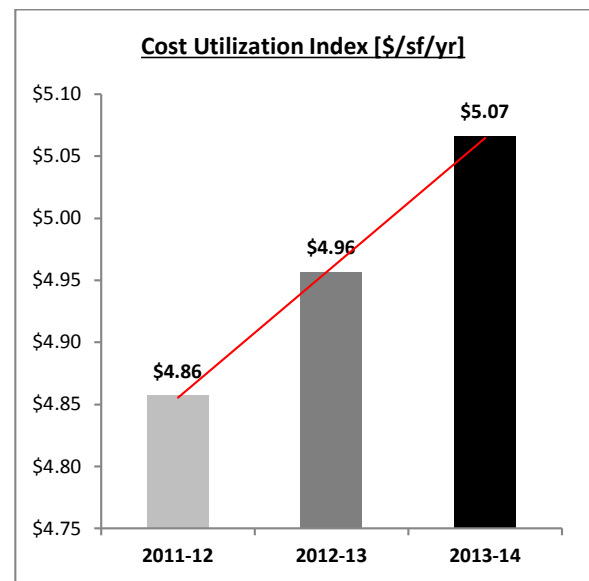


Figure 93: DVA-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

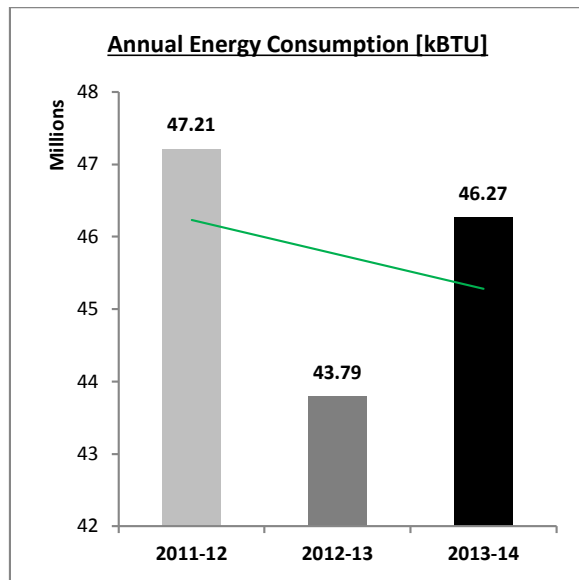


Figure 94: FWCC-AEC, 3-Year Comparison

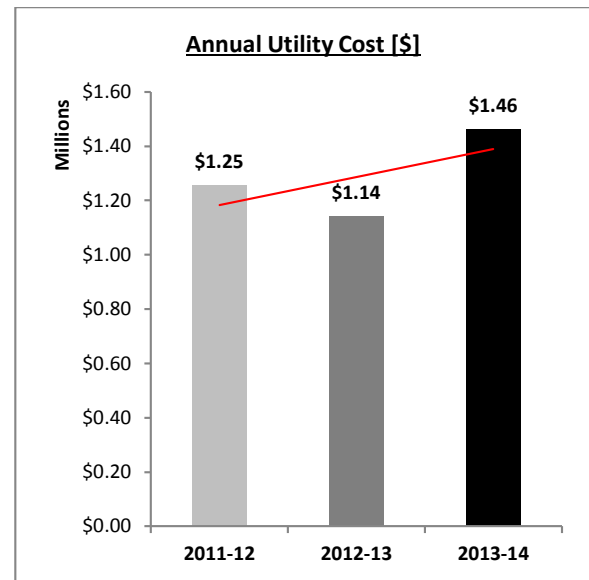


Figure 95: FWCC-AUC, 3-Year Comparison

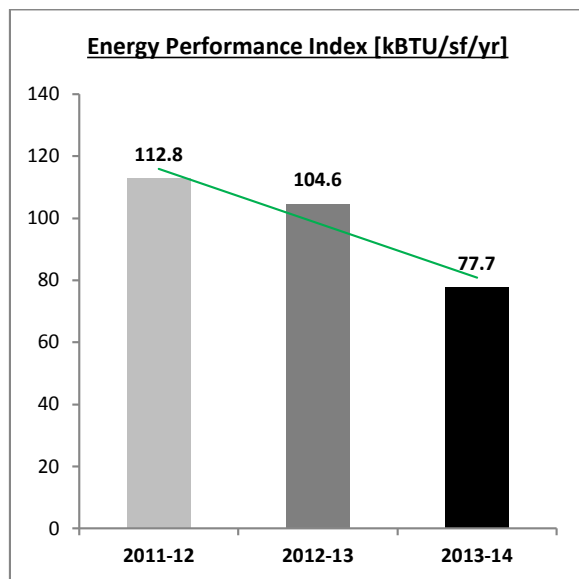


Figure 96: FWCC-EPI, 3-Year Comparison

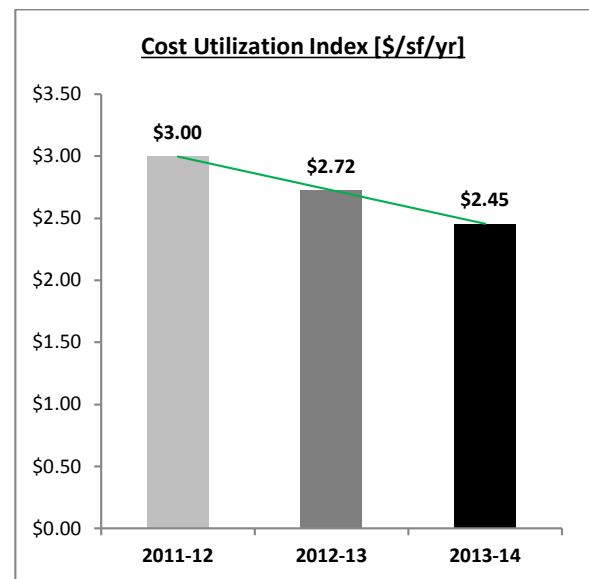


Figure 97: FWCC-CUI, 3-Year Comparison

Conclusions

In conclusion, the State of Florida is making positive strides each year reducing utility consumption and costs within its properties. The state as a whole and the majority of agencies are moving in a positive direction and showing downward trends in most, if not all, of the critical metrics (consumption, costs, EPI and CUI).

Recommendations

Agencies should continue to monitor their energy consumption and use this data as a guide for continual improvement in energy management. In addition to previously available methods for reducing energy consumption and costs, agencies now have at their disposal a new shared savings contracting process which will allow reductions to be gained on a shared cost basis with the contractor. This process will allow for energy savings without a capital outlay or third party financing. DMS will be holding a workshop for agencies and contractors to learn about the process, which will benefit the state in multiple ways, including:

- Project costs are paid out of savings generated from energy efficiency upgrades
- Contractor assumes risk for project funding
- Contractor is incentivized to maximize savings
- State and agencies not required to negotiate 3rd party financing

The Department of Management Services has prepared an Energy Strategy Flowchart to assist with preliminary identification of such opportunities, with supporting documentation (Request for Qualifications, Model Shared Savings Proposal Agreement, and Model Shared Savings Contract) to assist with implementation.

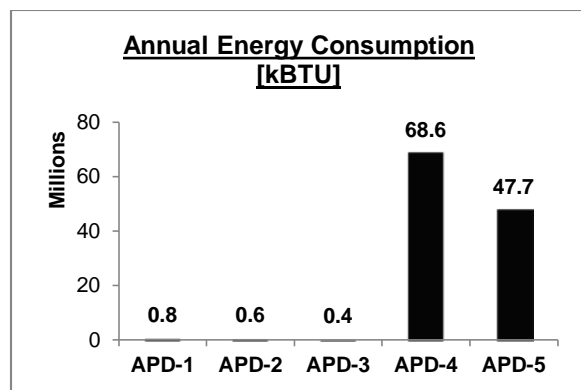


Figure 98: APD, Facility AEC

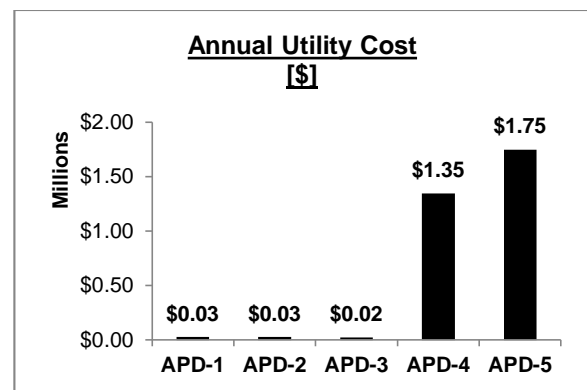


Figure 99: APD, Facility AUC

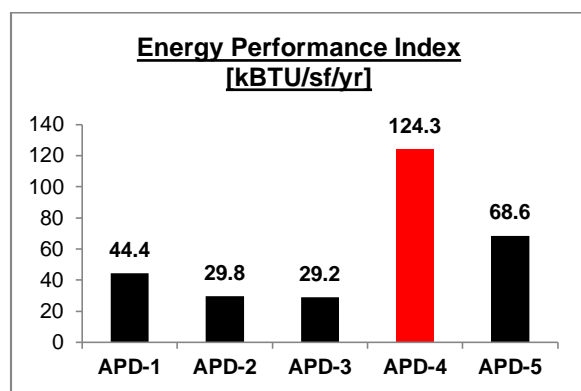


Figure 100: APD, Facility EPI

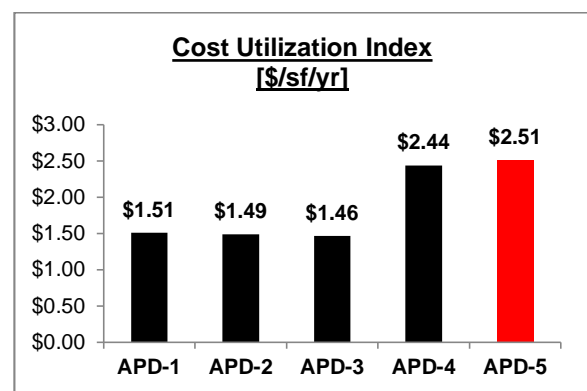


Figure 101: APD, Facility CUI

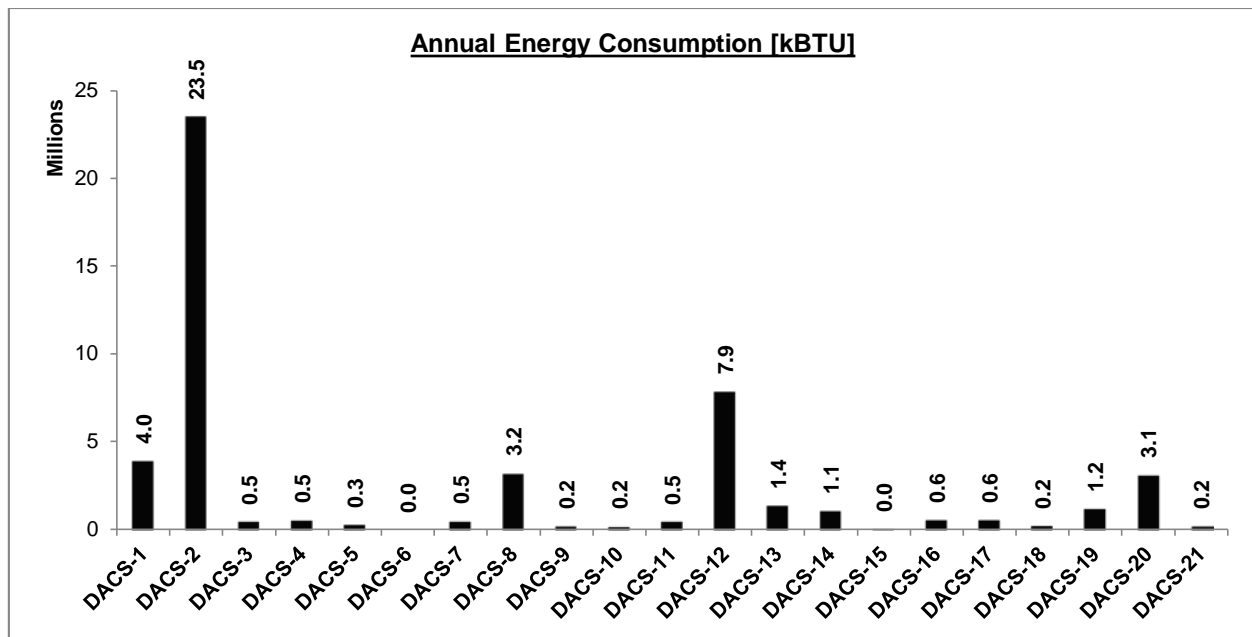


Figure 102: DACS Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

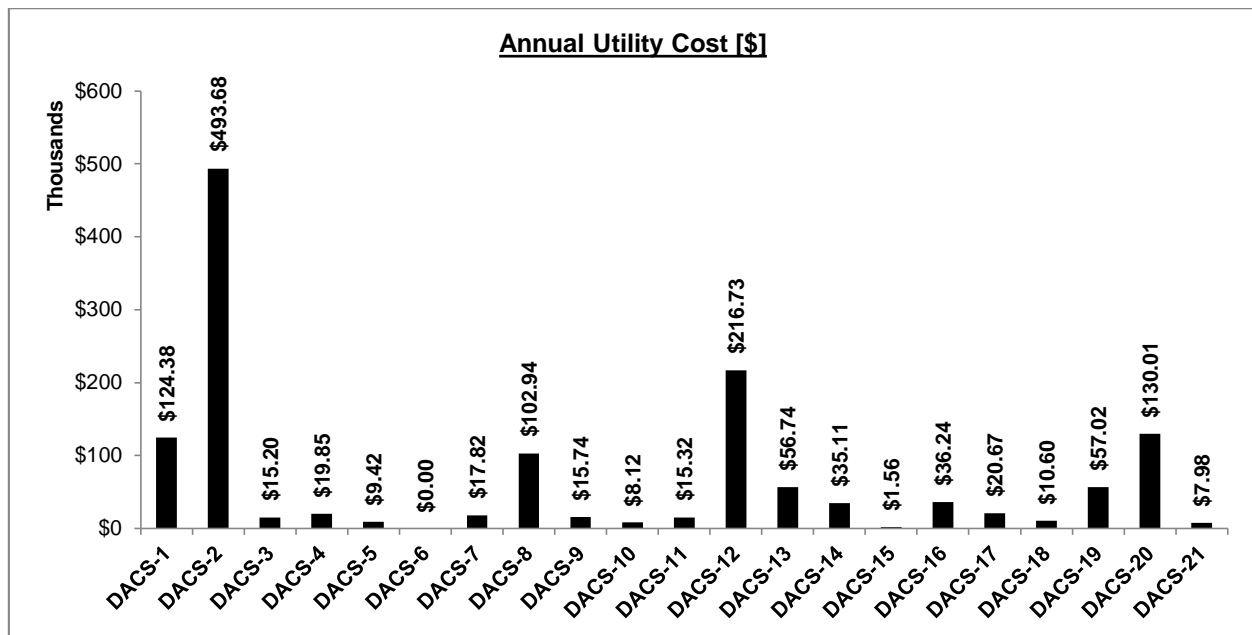


Figure 103: DACS Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

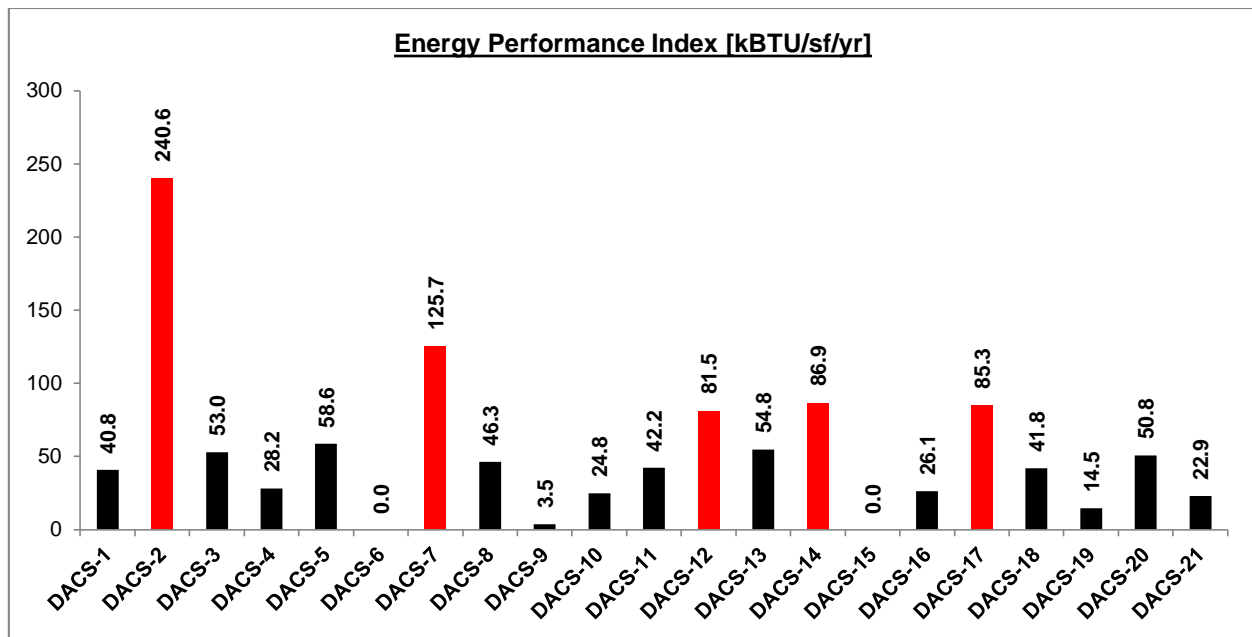


Figure 104: DACS Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

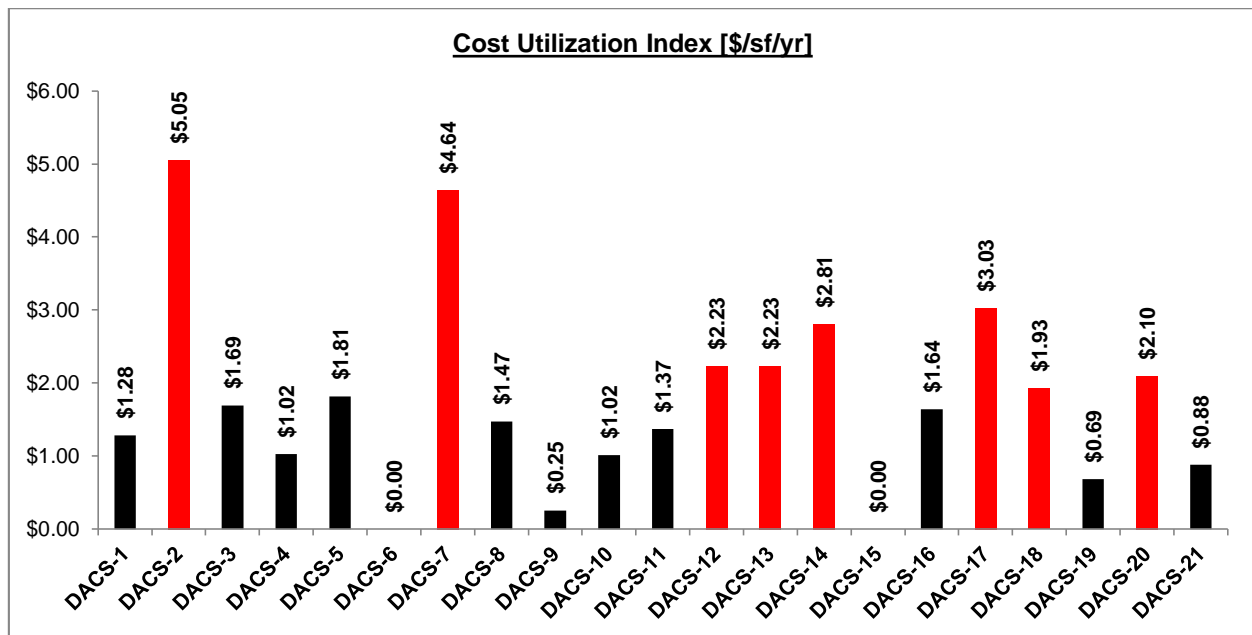


Figure 105: DACS Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

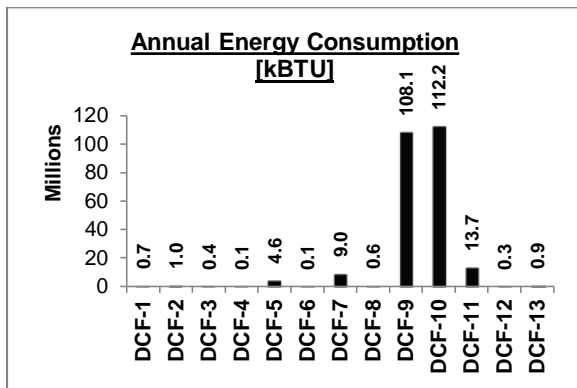


Figure 106: DCF, Facility AEC

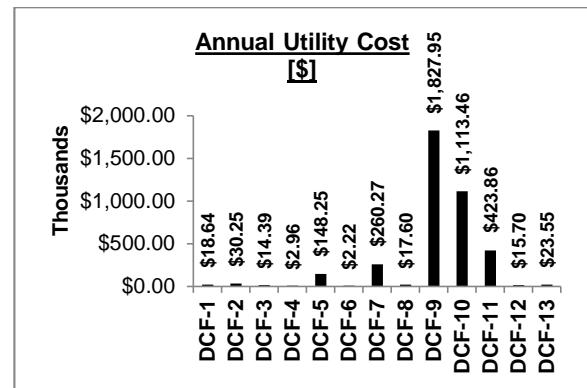


Figure 107: DCF, Facility AUC

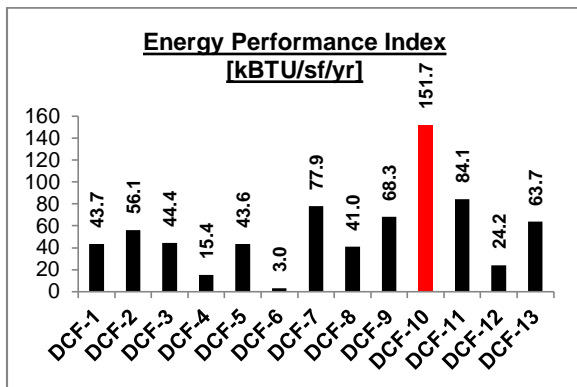


Figure 108: DCF, Facility EPI

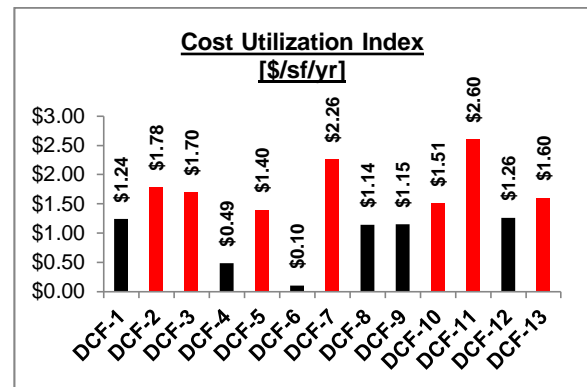


Figure 109: DCF, Facility CUI

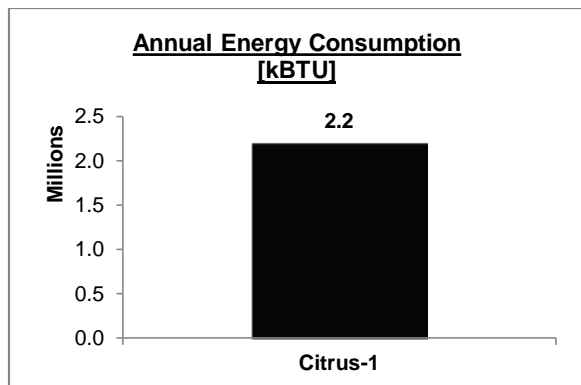


Figure 110: DCF, Facility AEC

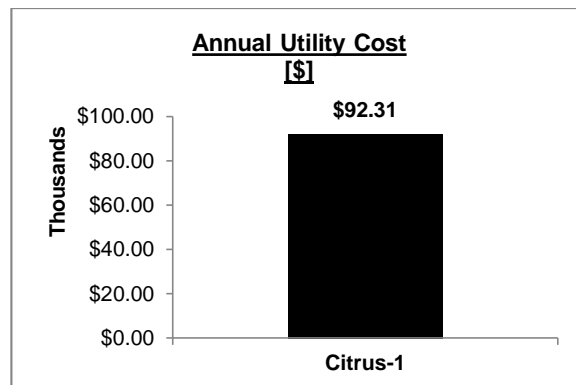


Figure 111: DCF, Facility AUC

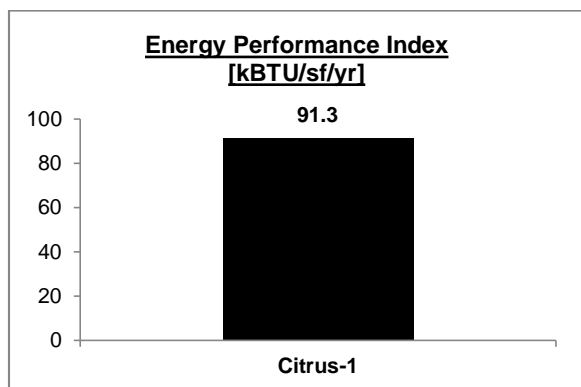


Figure 112: DCF, Facility EPI

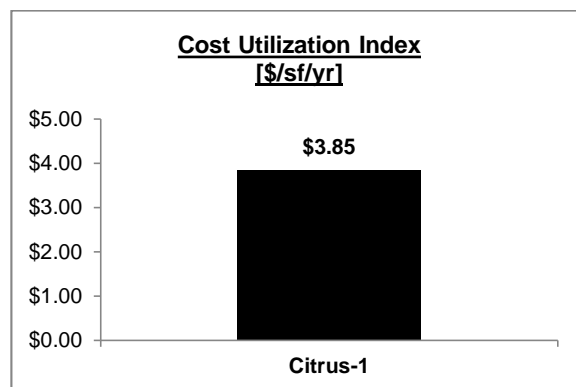


Figure 113: DCF, Facility CUI

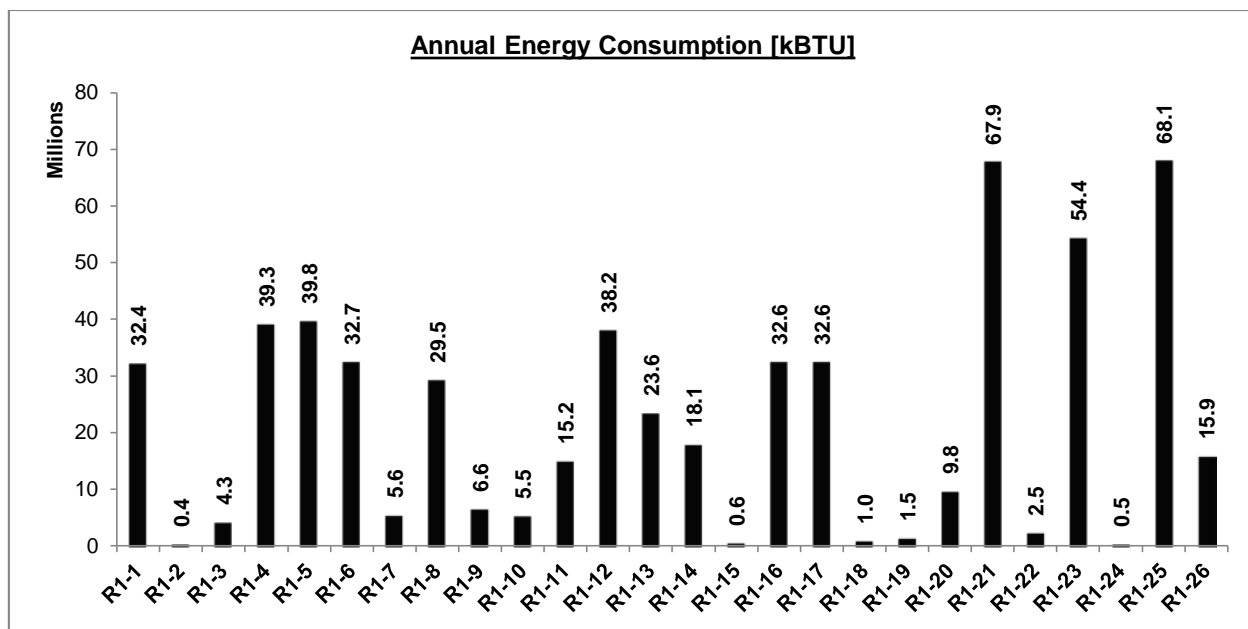


Figure 114: DOC-R1 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

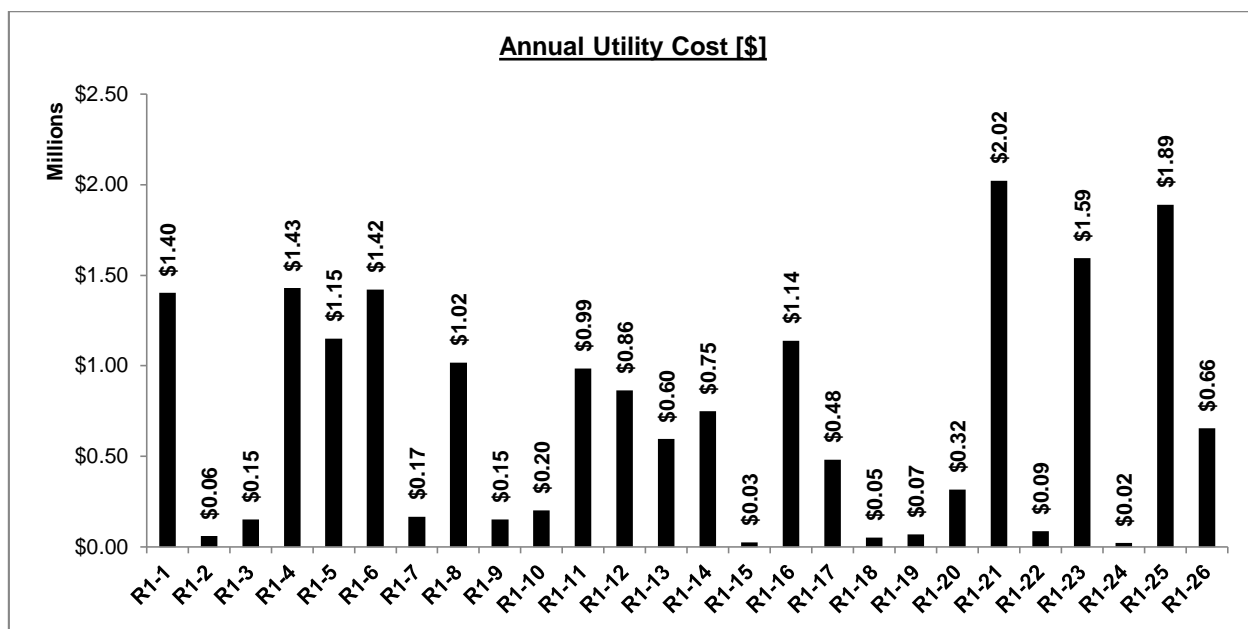


Figure 115: DOC-R1 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

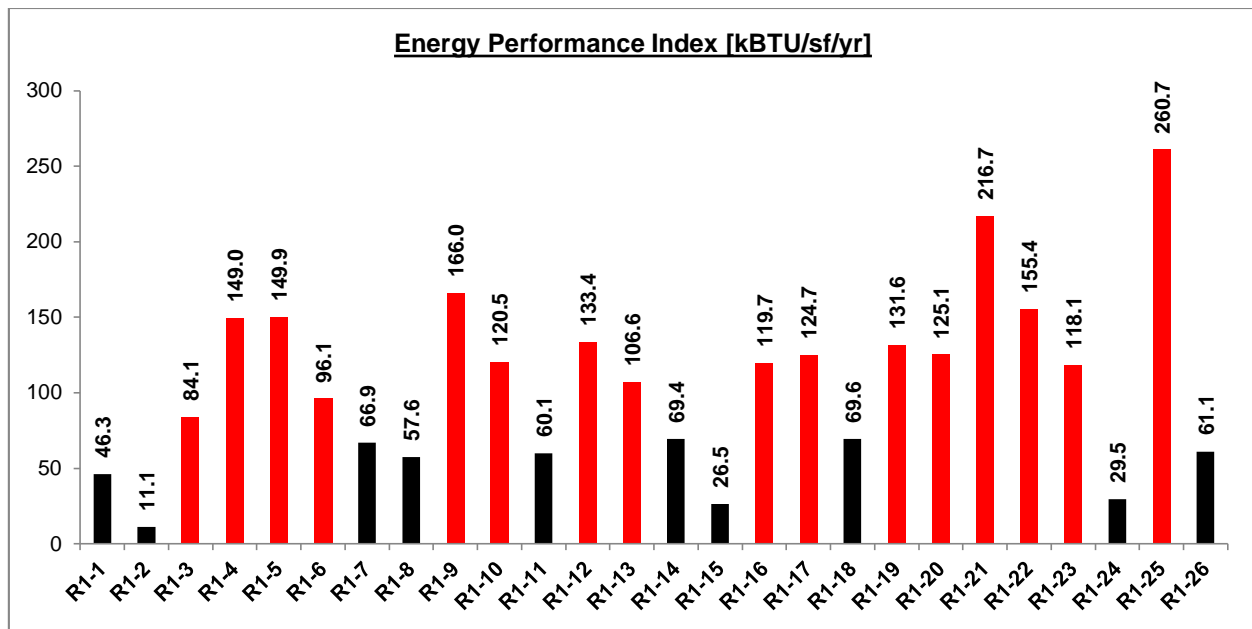


Figure 116: DOC-R1 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

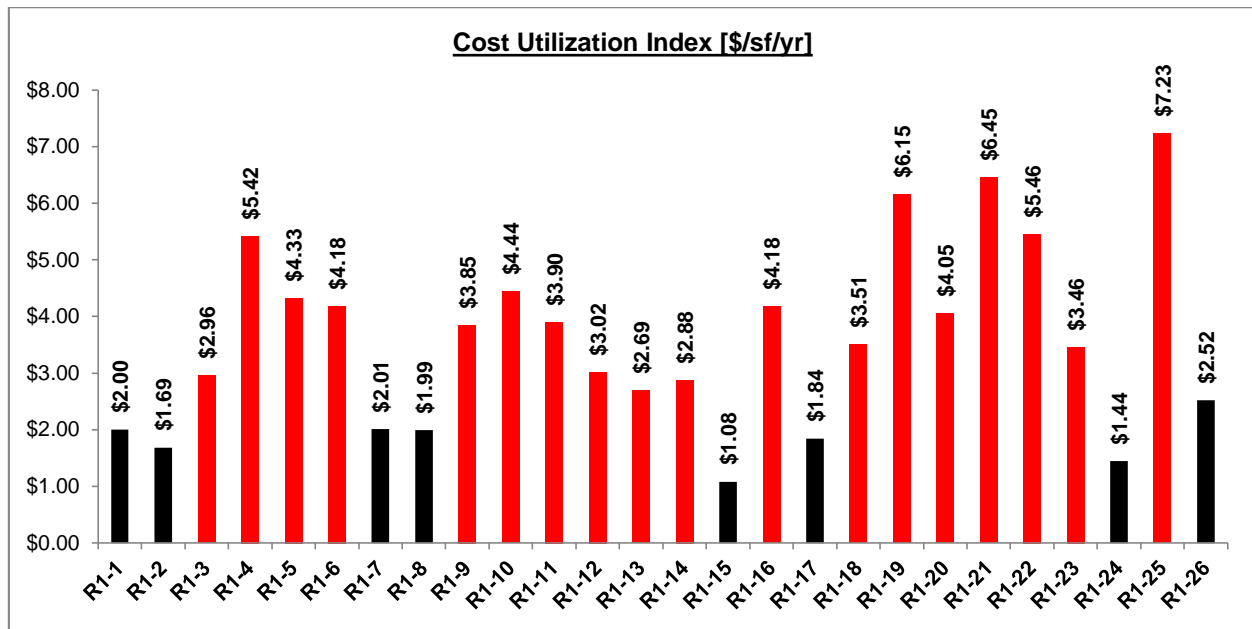


Figure 117: DOC-R1 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

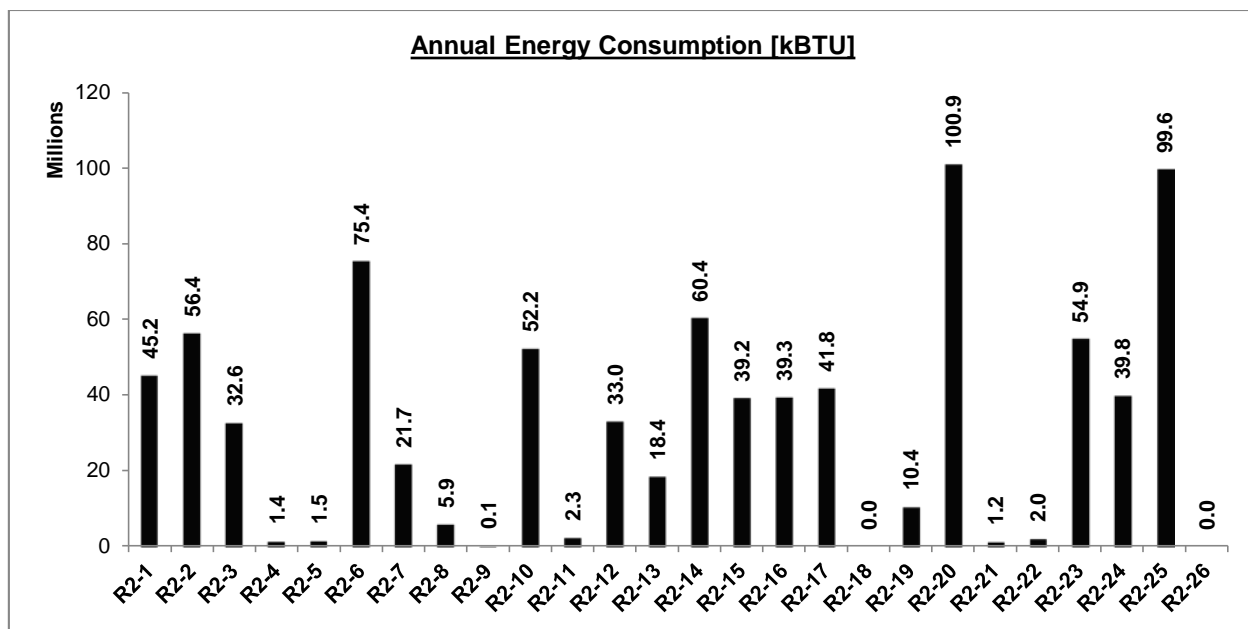


Figure 118: DOC-R2 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

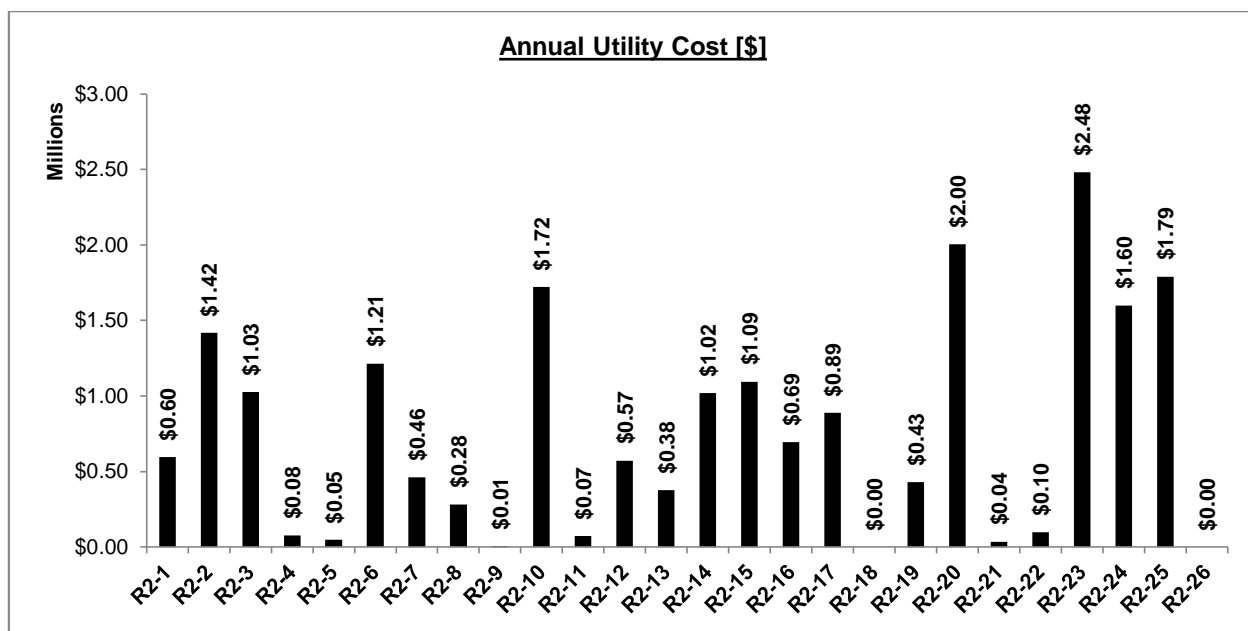


Figure 119: DOC-R2 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

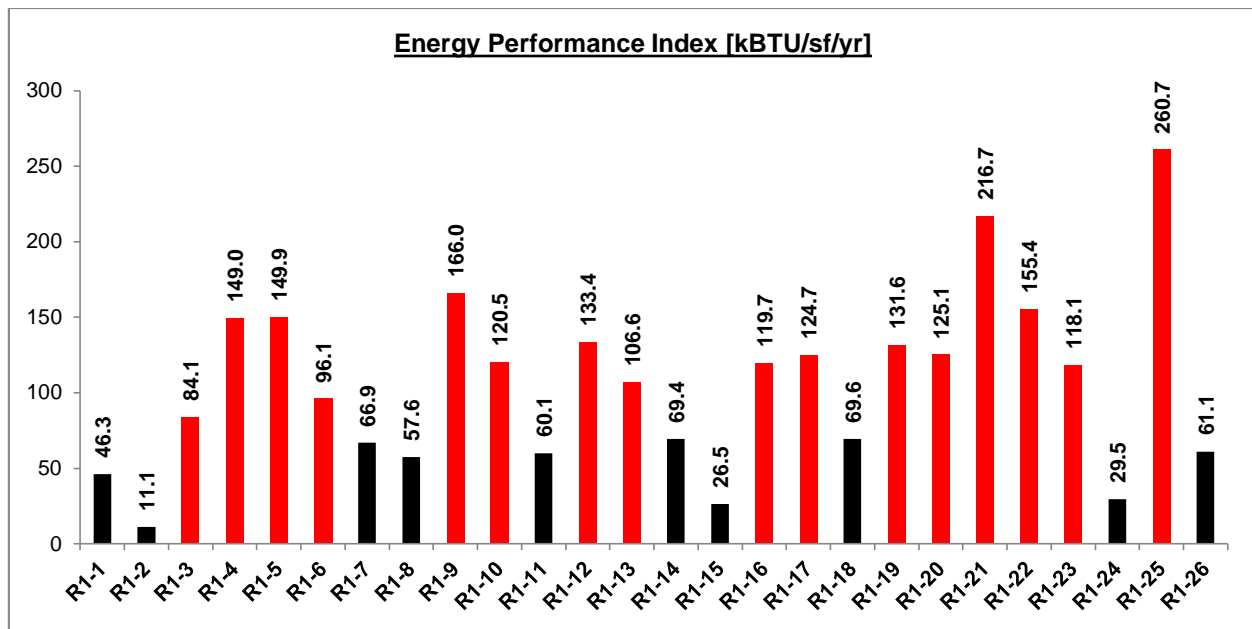


Figure 120: DOC-R2 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

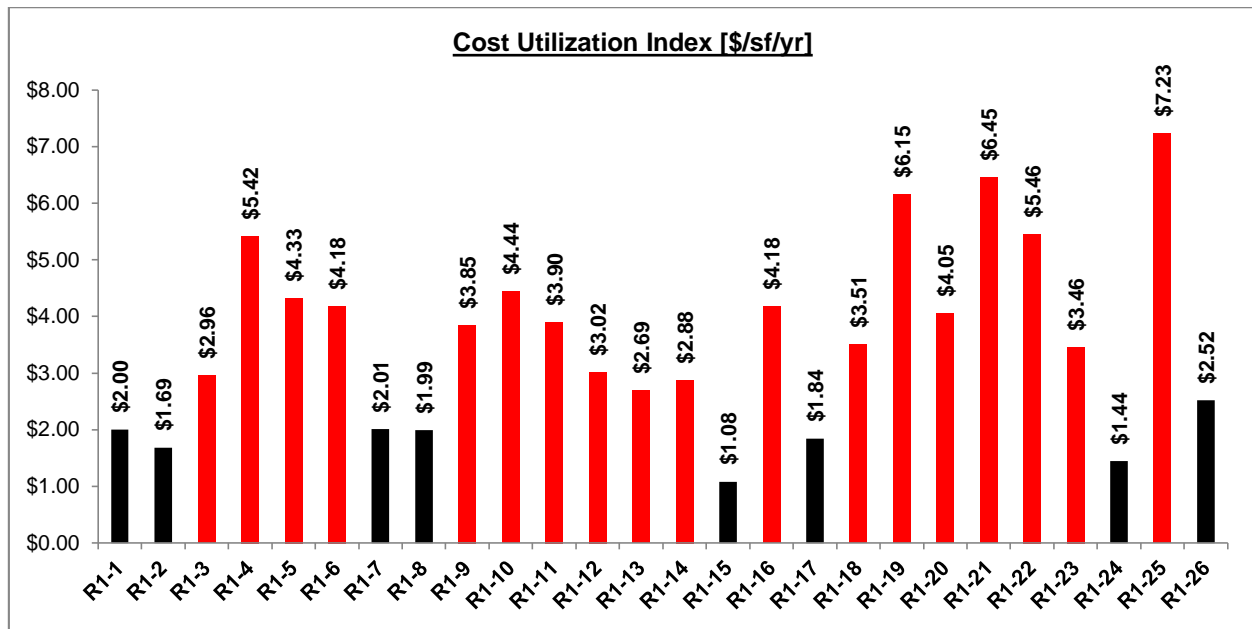


Figure 121: DOC-R2 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

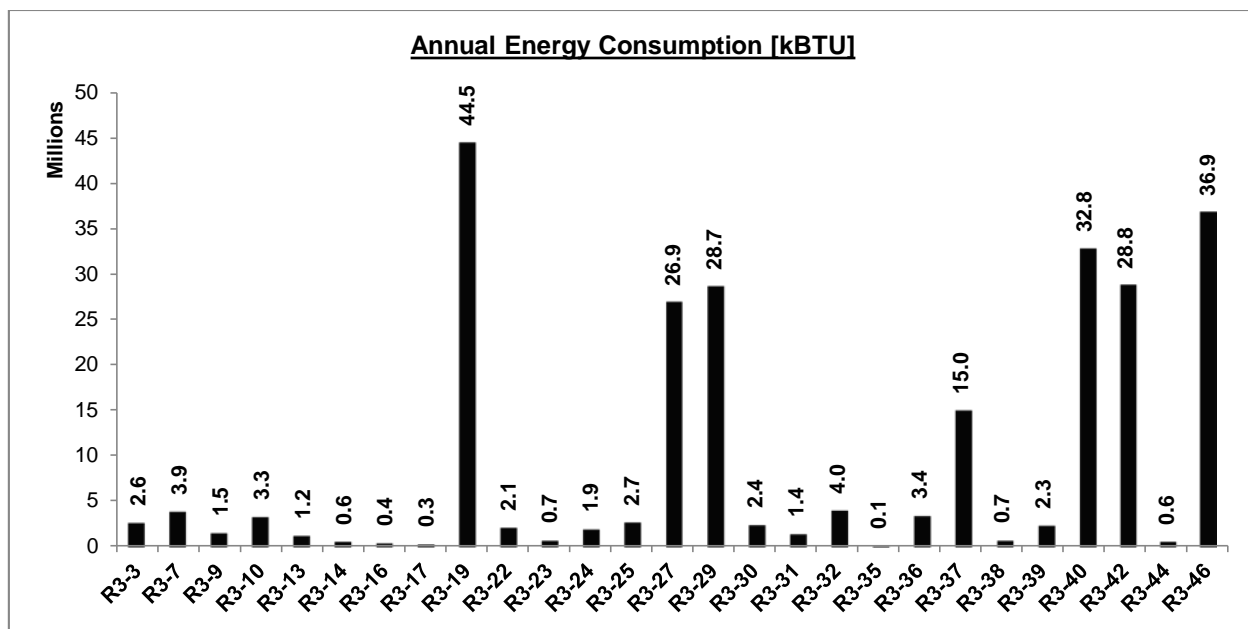


Figure 122: DOC-R3 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

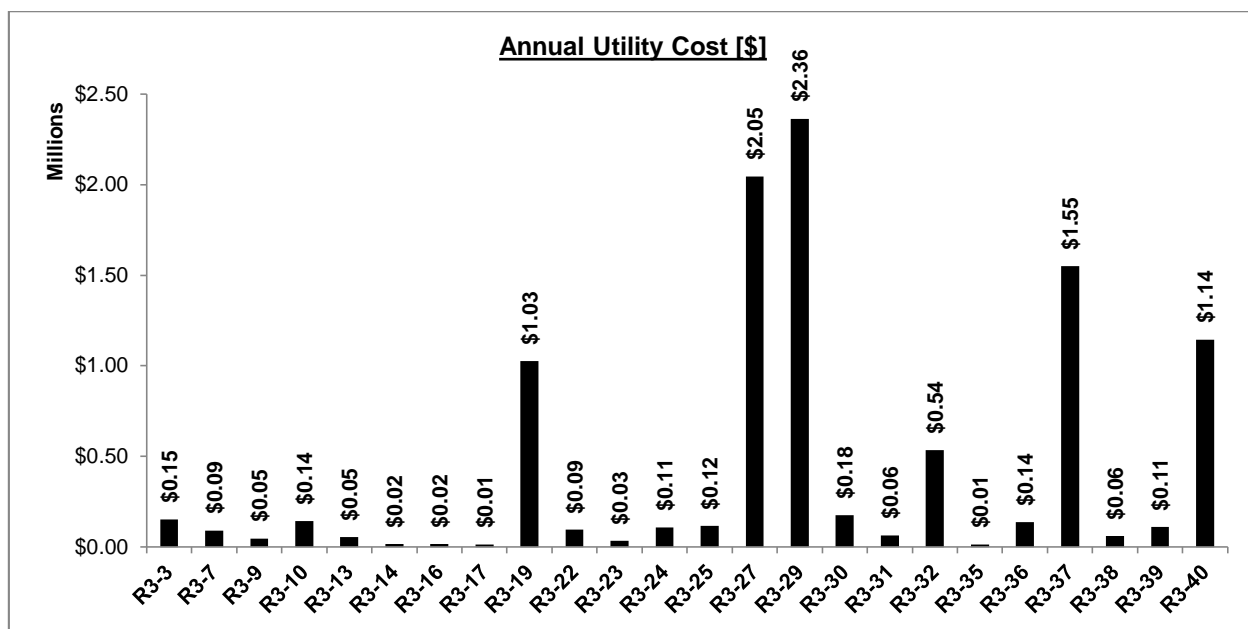


Figure 123: DOC-R3 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

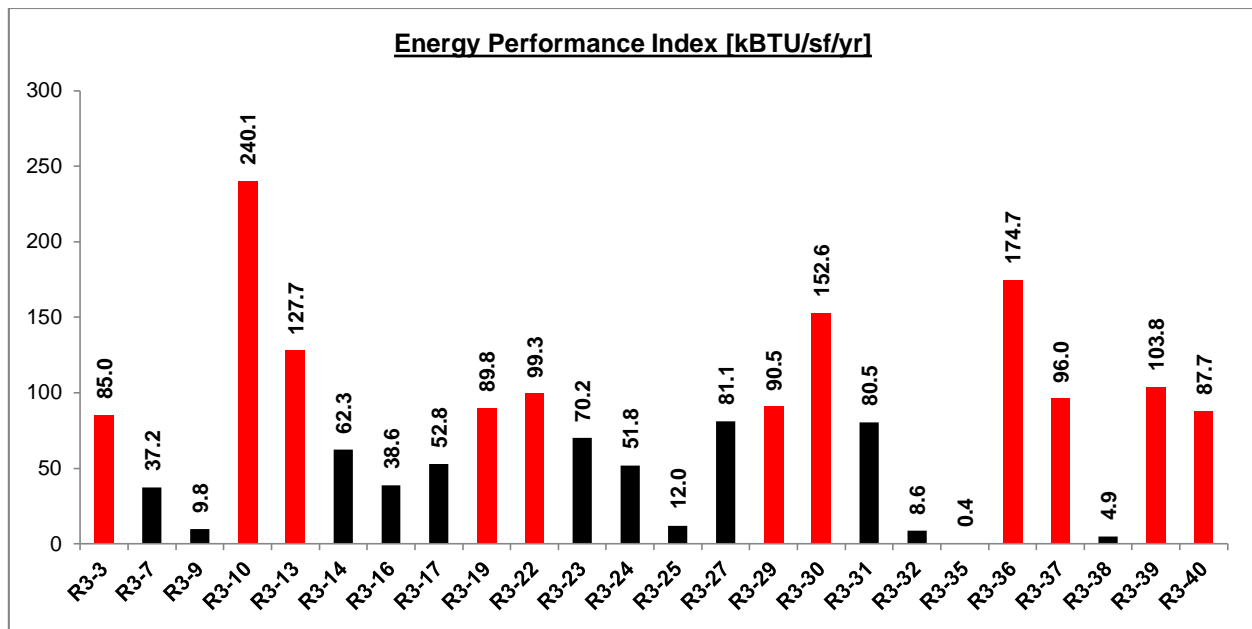


Figure 124: DOC-R3 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

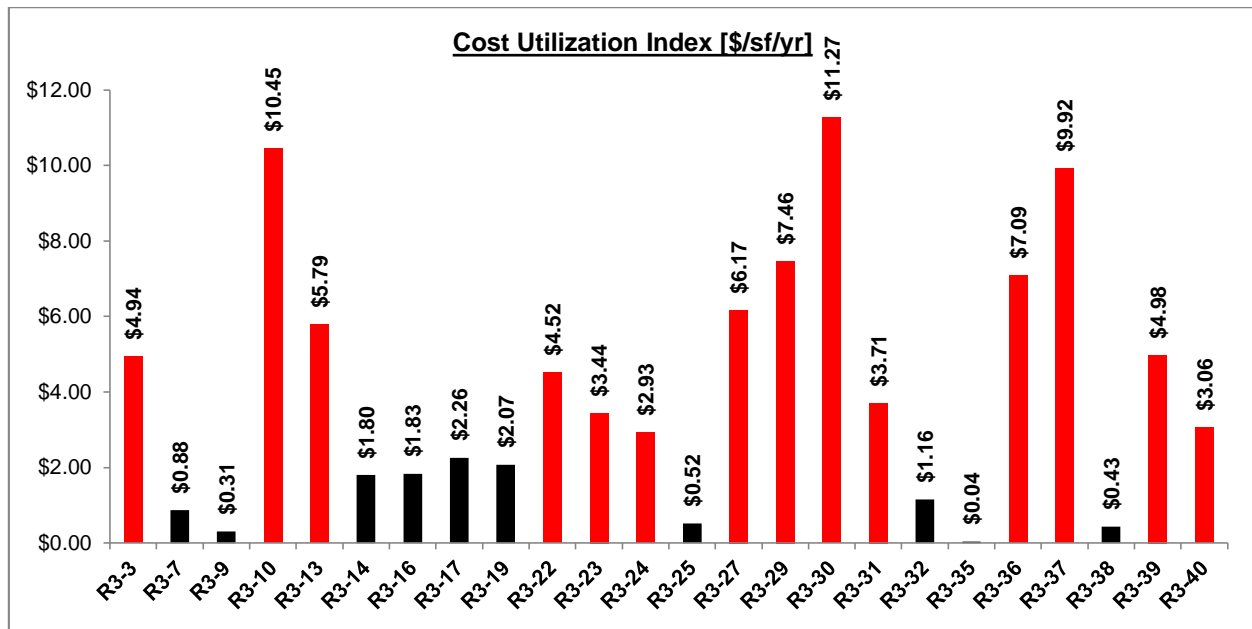


Figure 125: DOC-R3 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

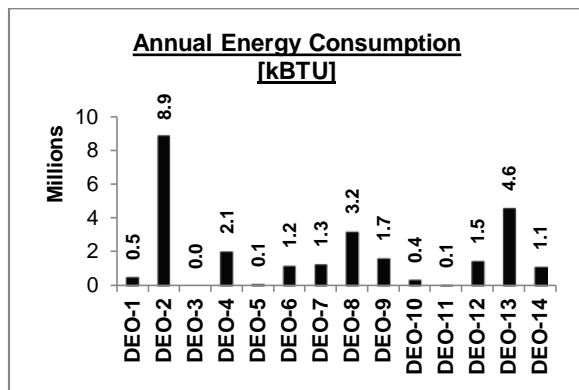


Figure 126: DEO, Facility AEC

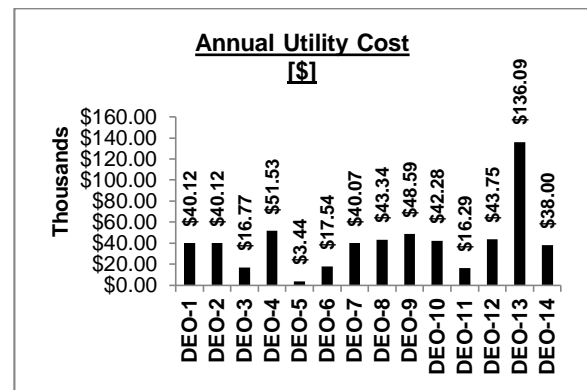


Figure 127: DEO, Facility AUC

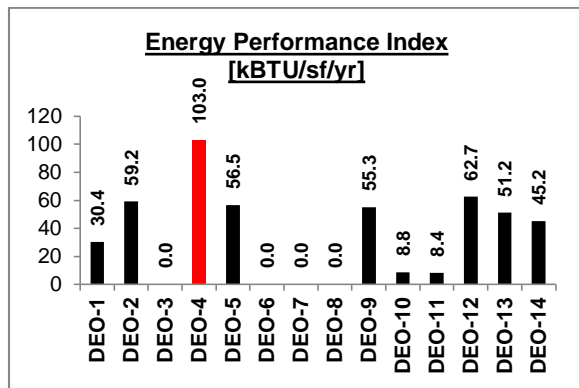


Figure 128: DEO, Facility EPI

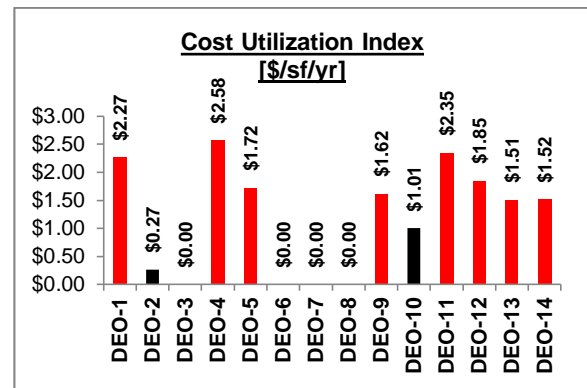


Figure 129: DEO, Facility CUI

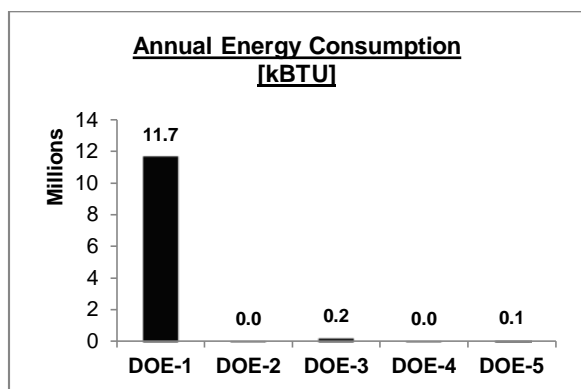


Figure 130: DOE, Facility AEC

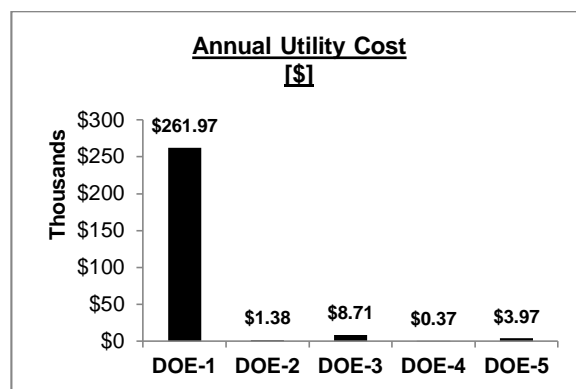


Figure 131: DOE, Facility AUC

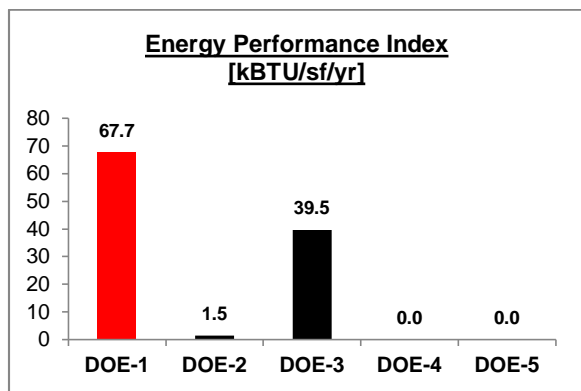


Figure 132: DOE, Facility EPI

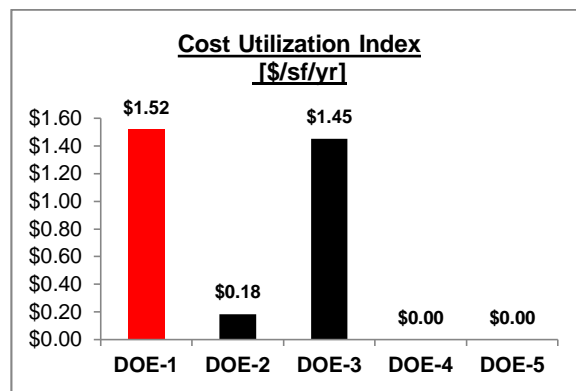


Figure 133: DOE, Facility CUI

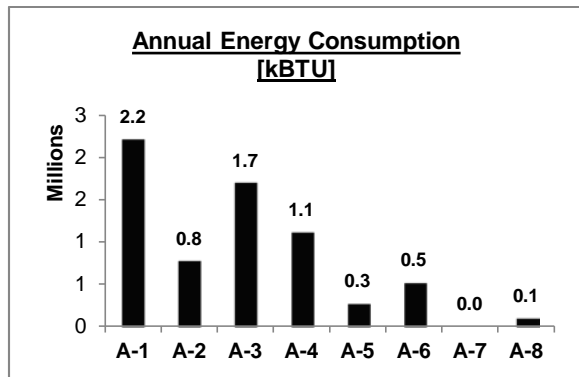


Figure 134: DEP-A, Facility AEC

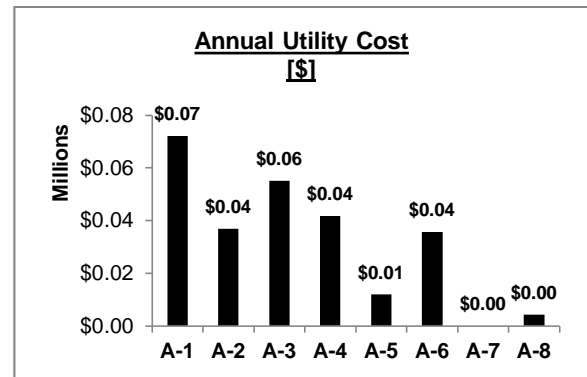


Figure 135: DEP-A, Facility AUC

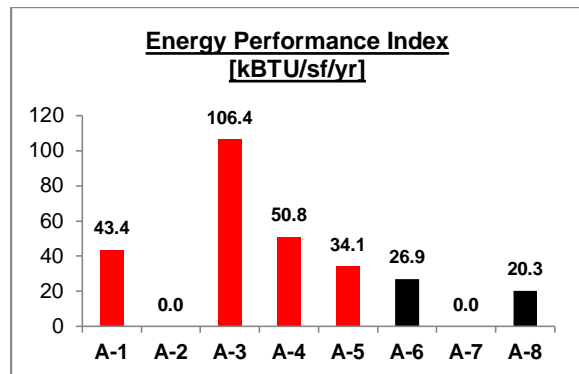


Figure 136: DEP-A, Facility EPI

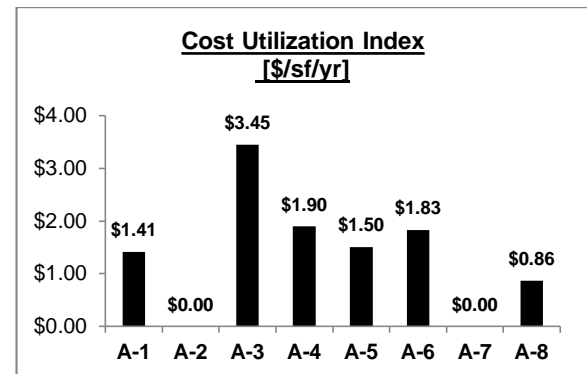


Figure 137: DEP-A, Facility CUI

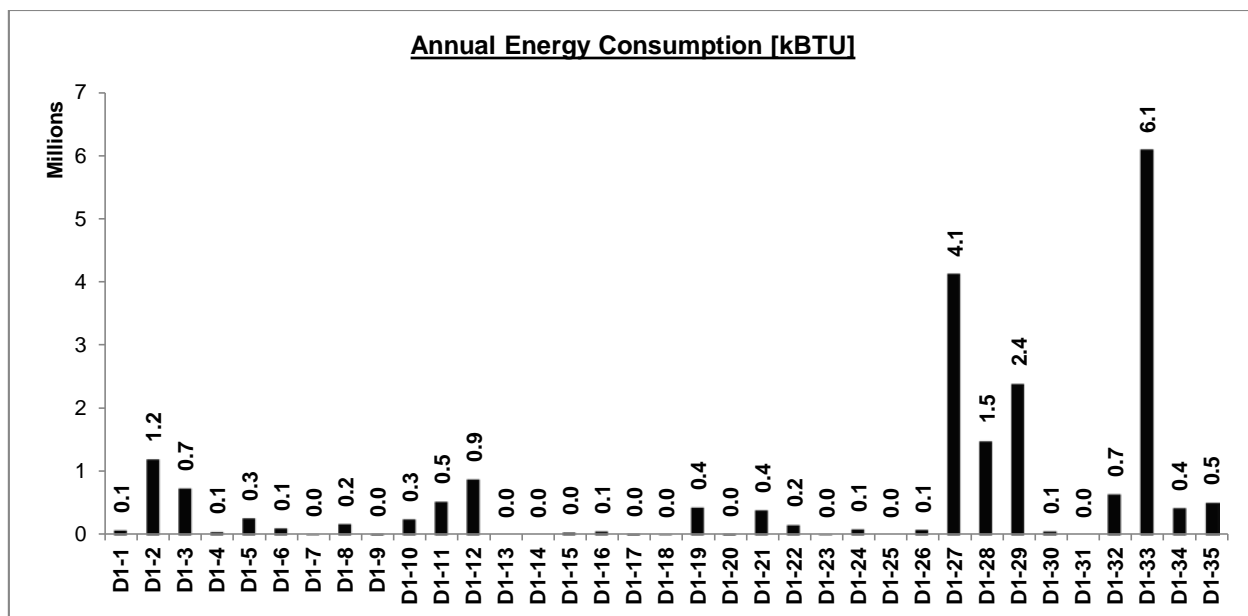


Figure 138: DEP-D1 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

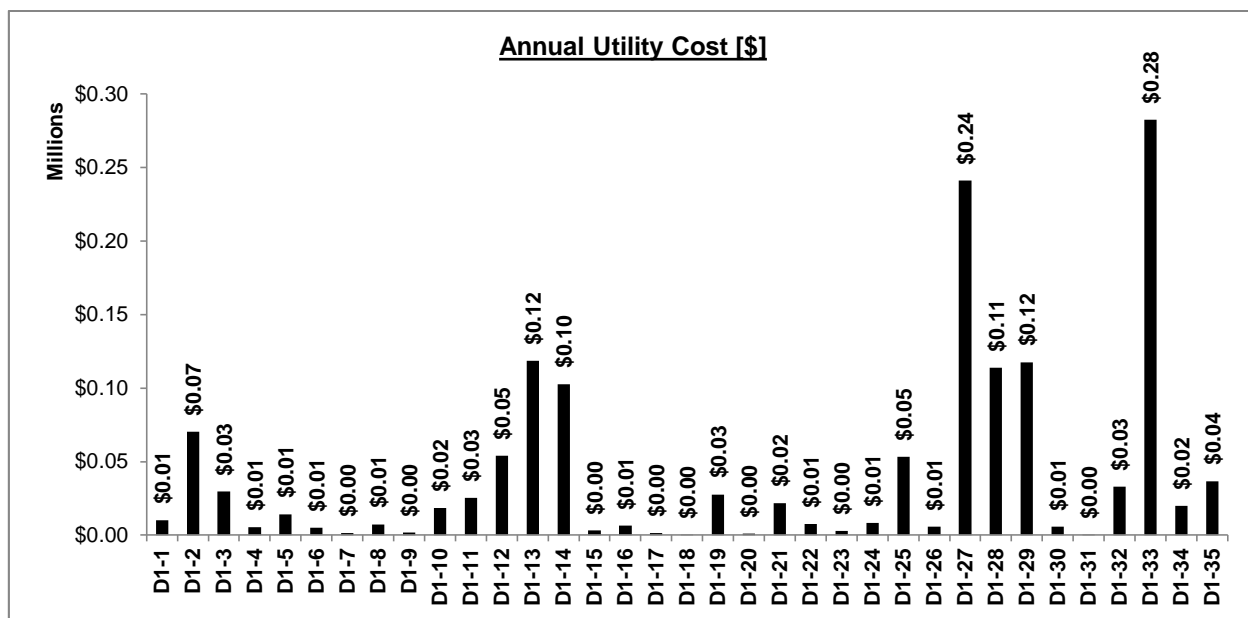


Figure 139: DEP-D1 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

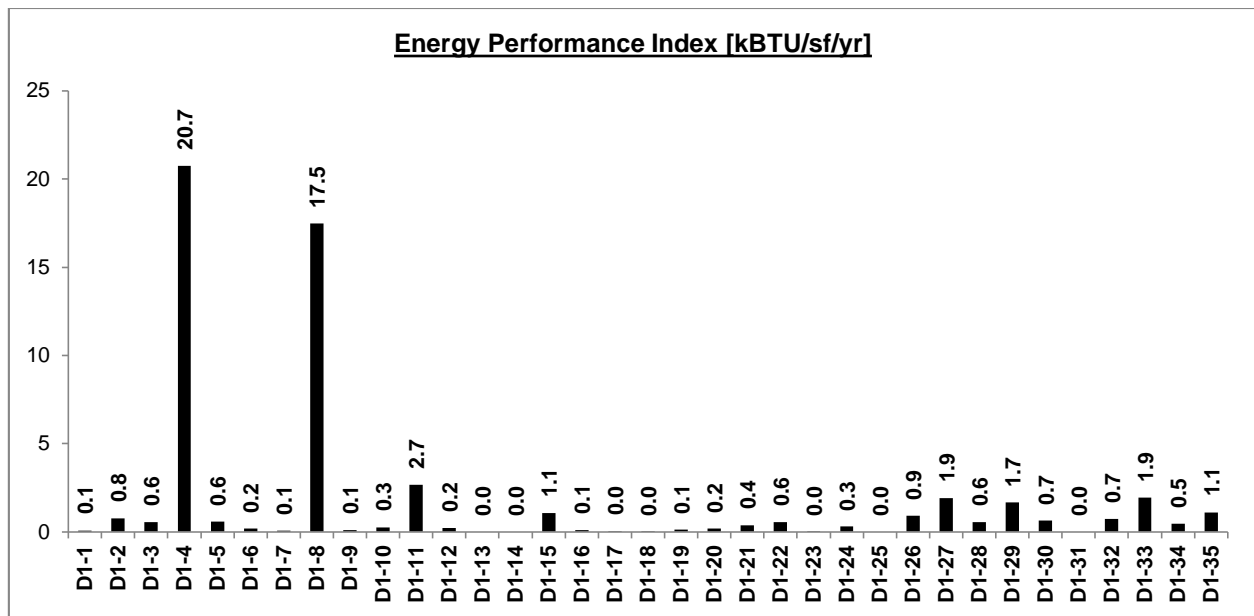


Figure 140: DEP-D1 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

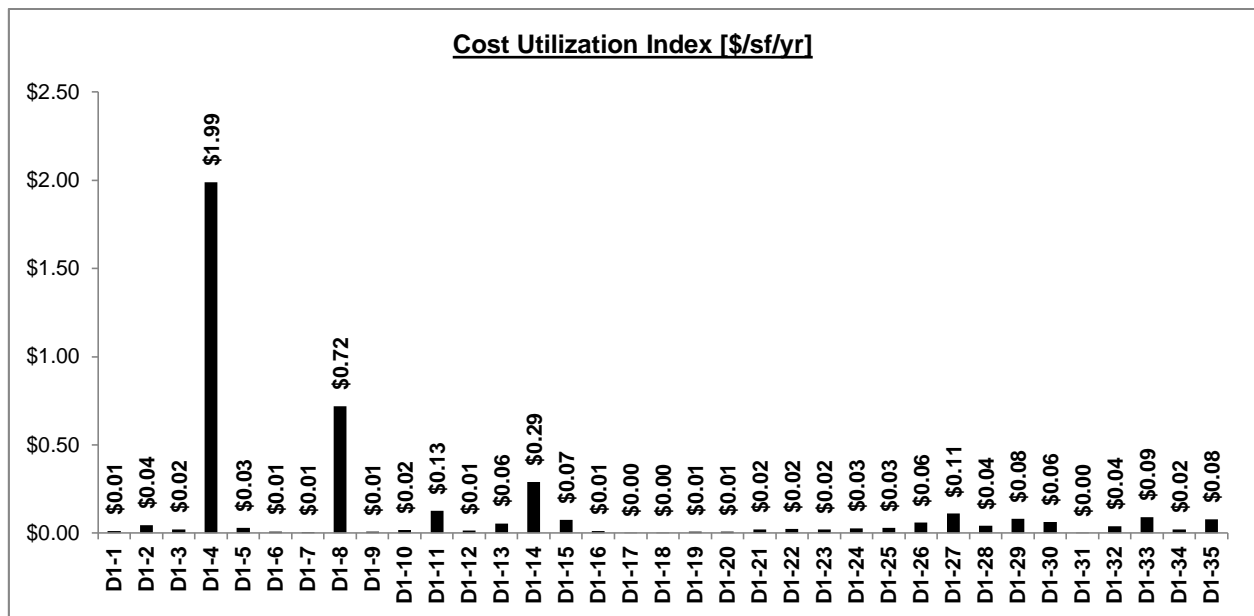


Figure 141: DEP-D1 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

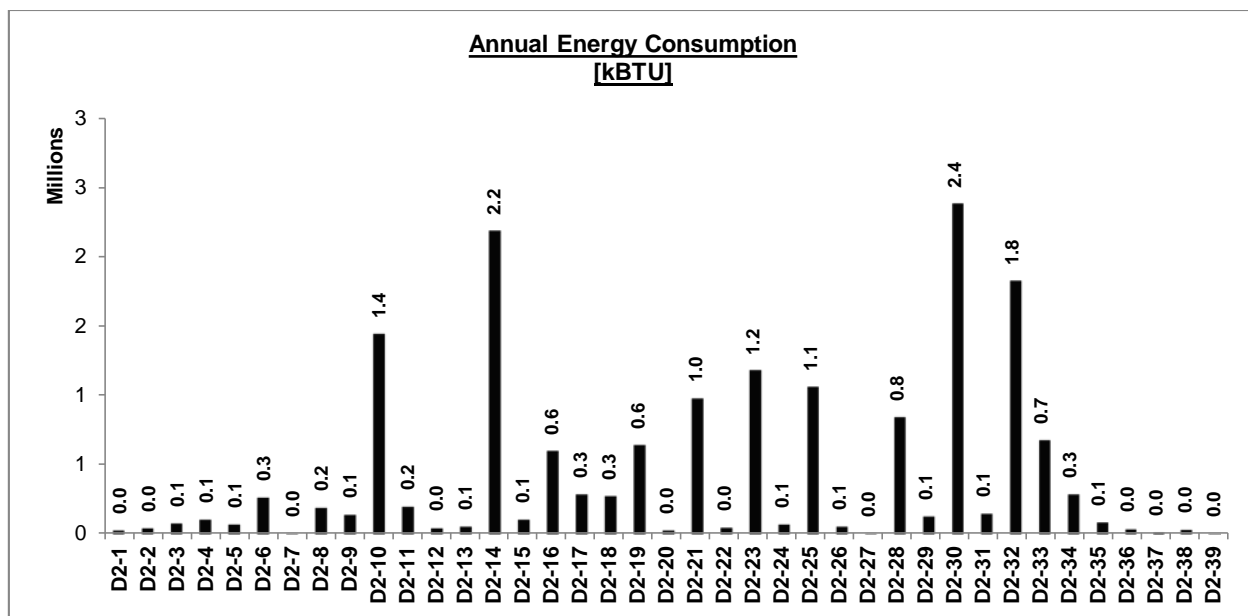


Figure 142: DEP-D2 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

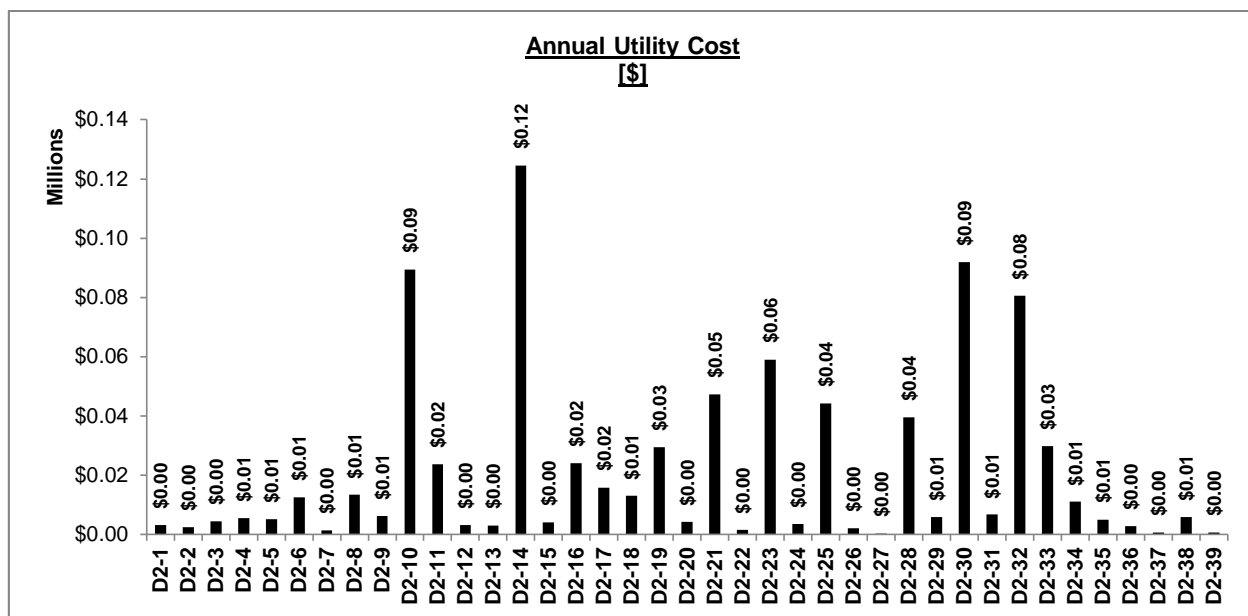


Figure 143: DEP-D2 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

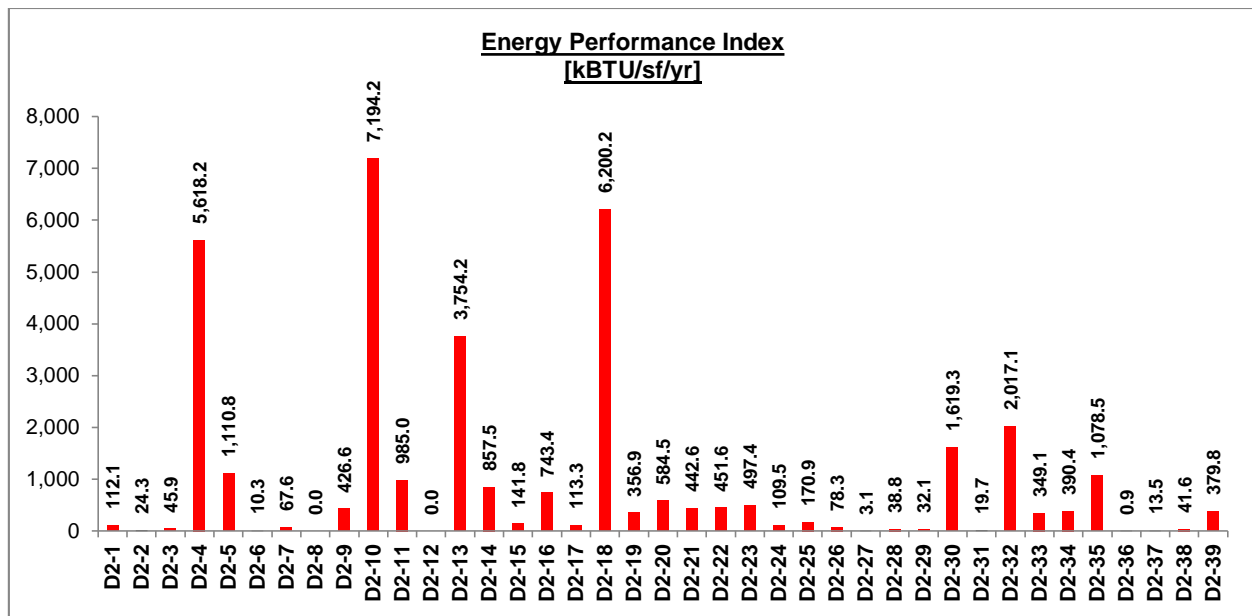


Figure 144: DEP-D2 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

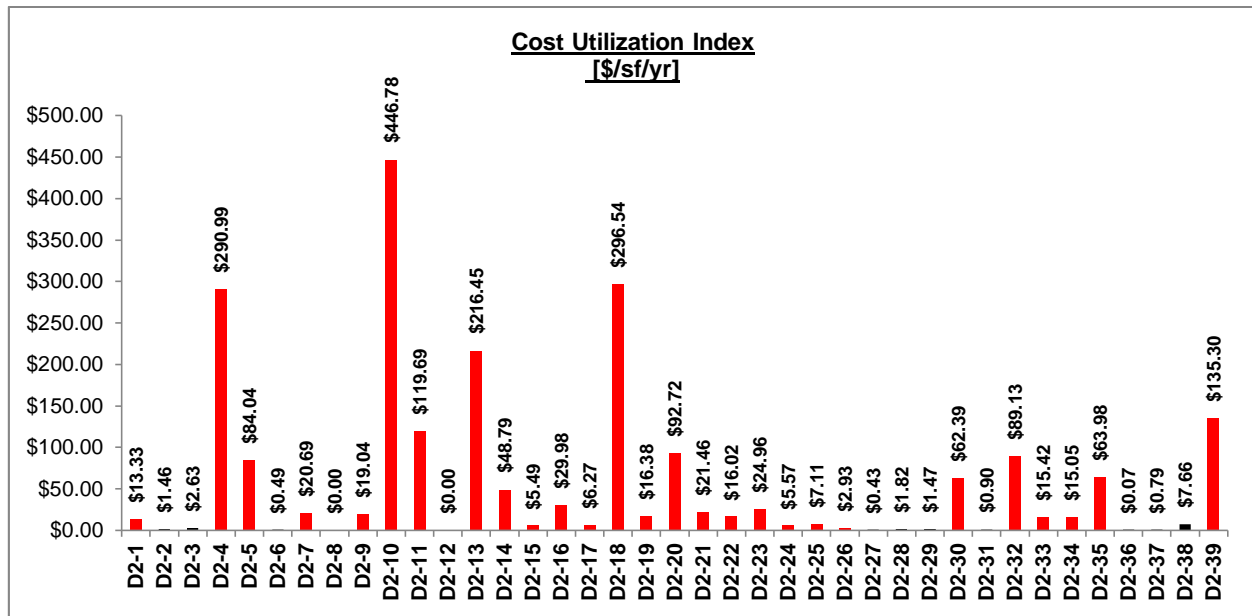


Figure 145: DEP-D2 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

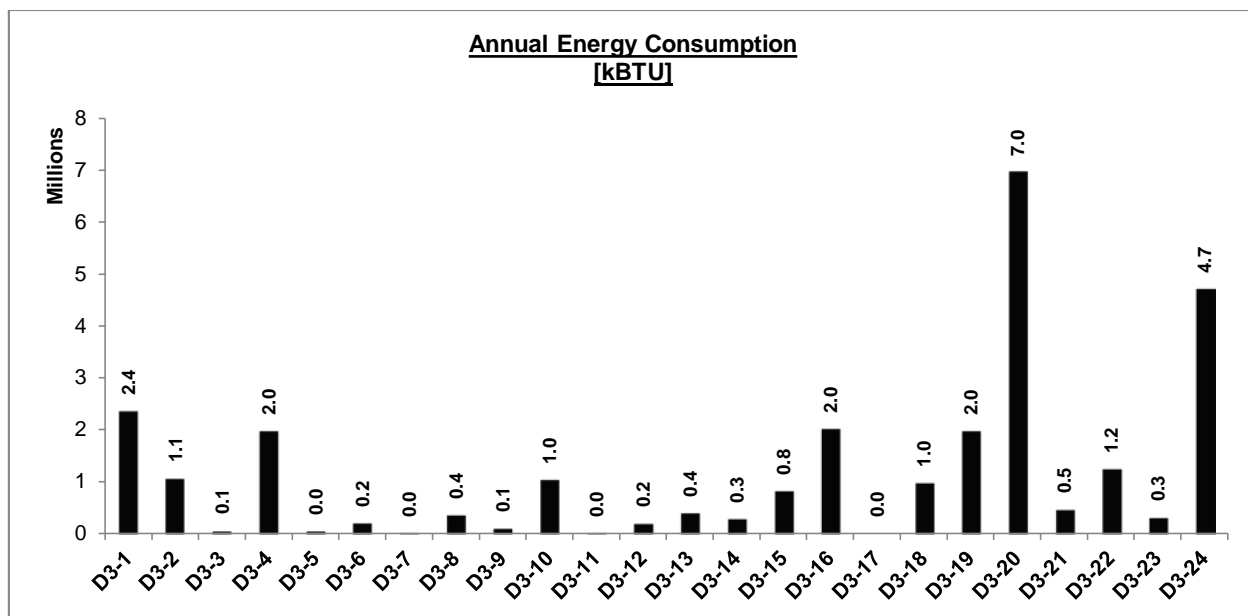


Figure 146: DEP-D3 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

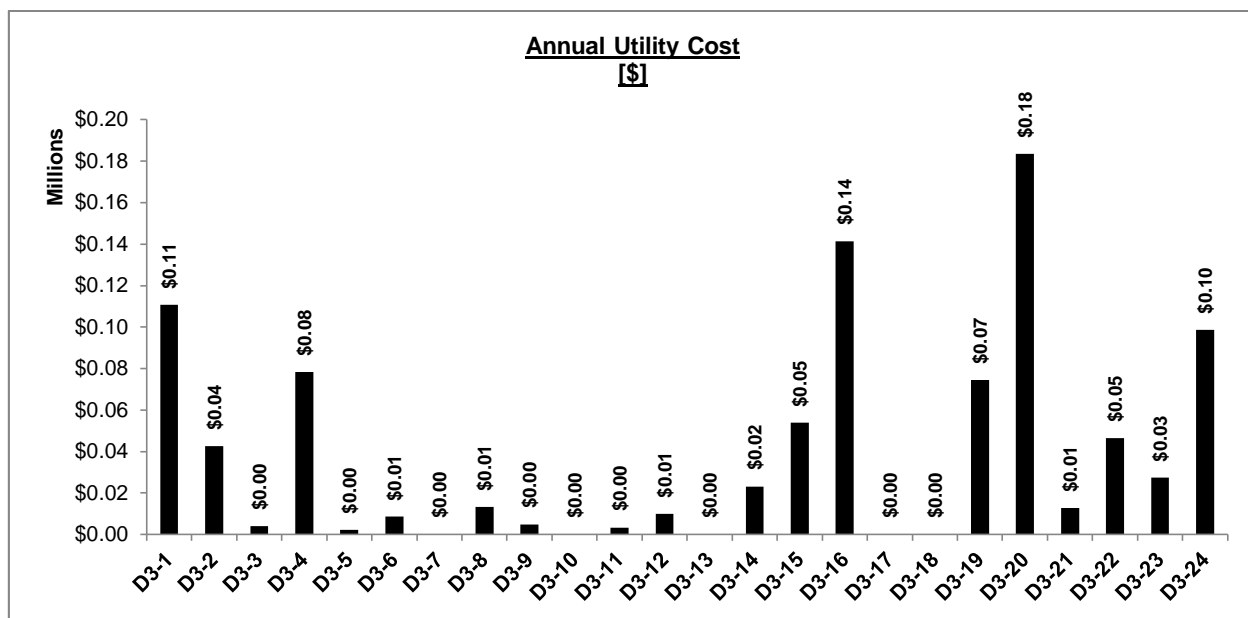


Figure 147: DEP-D3 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

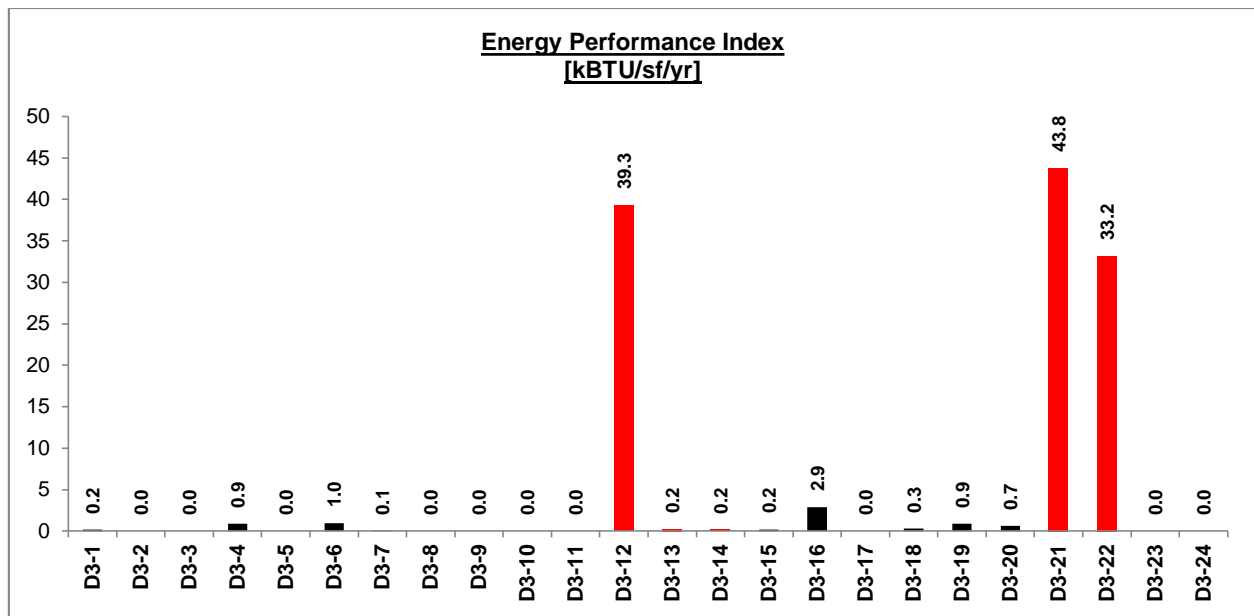


Figure 148: DEP-D3 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

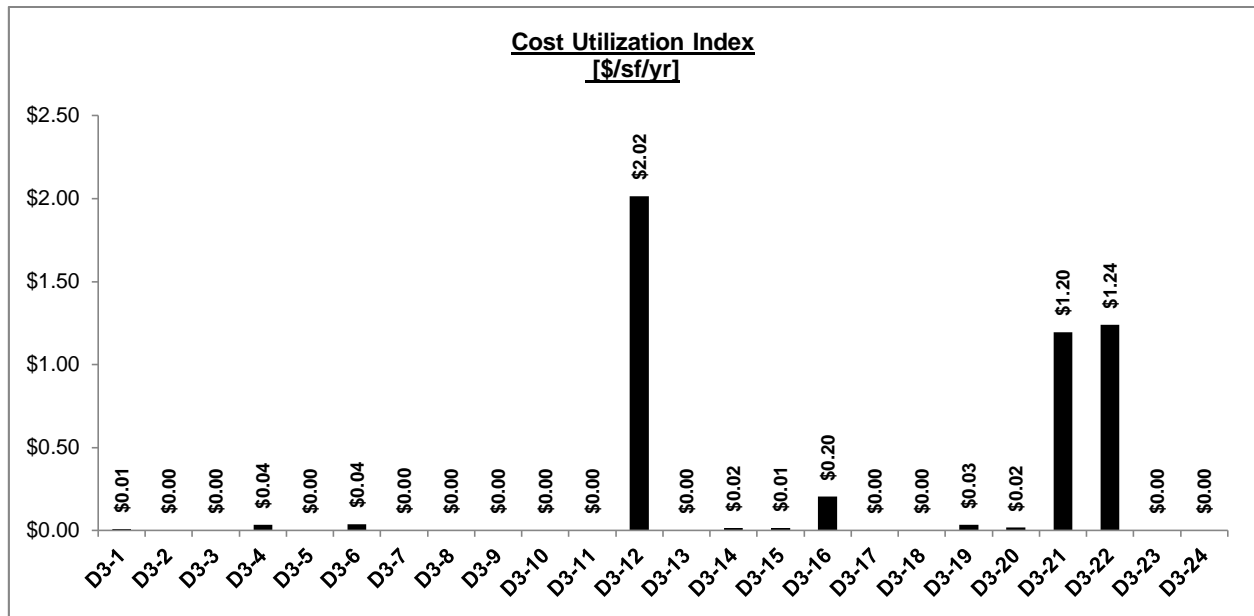


Figure 149: DEP-D3 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

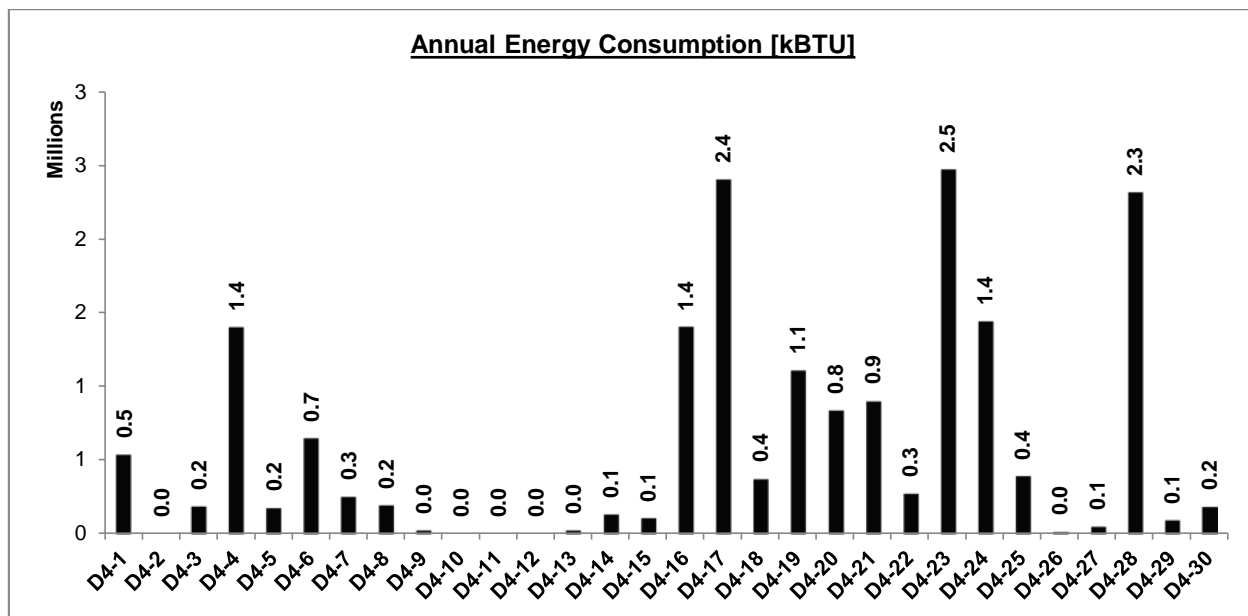


Figure 150: DEP-D4 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

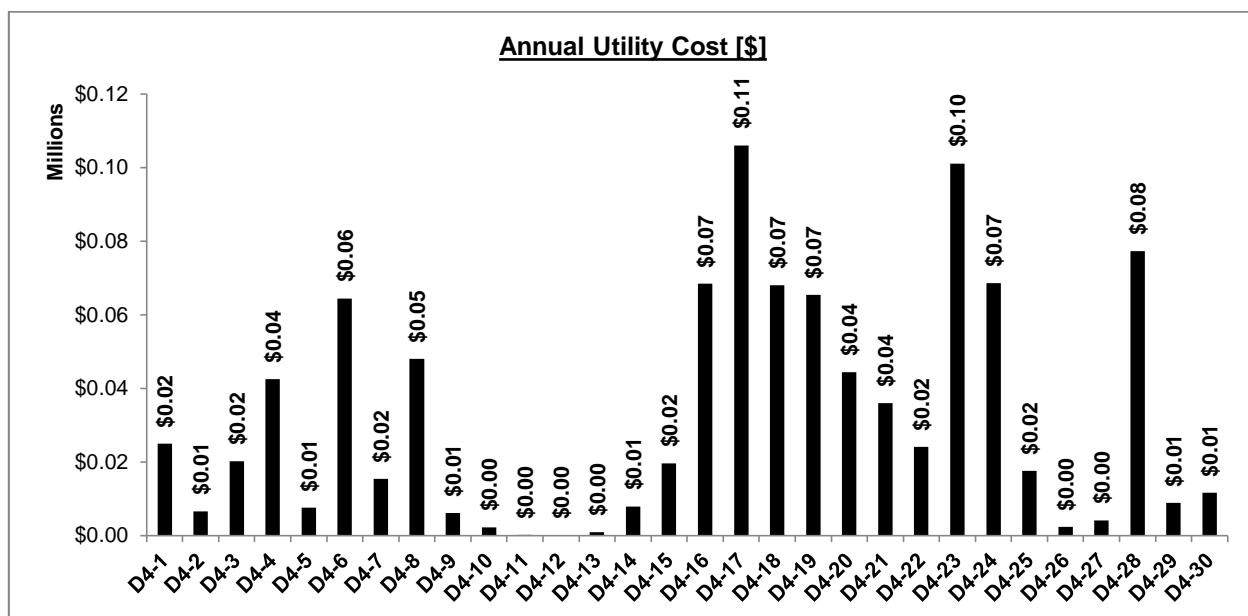


Figure 151: DEP-D4 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

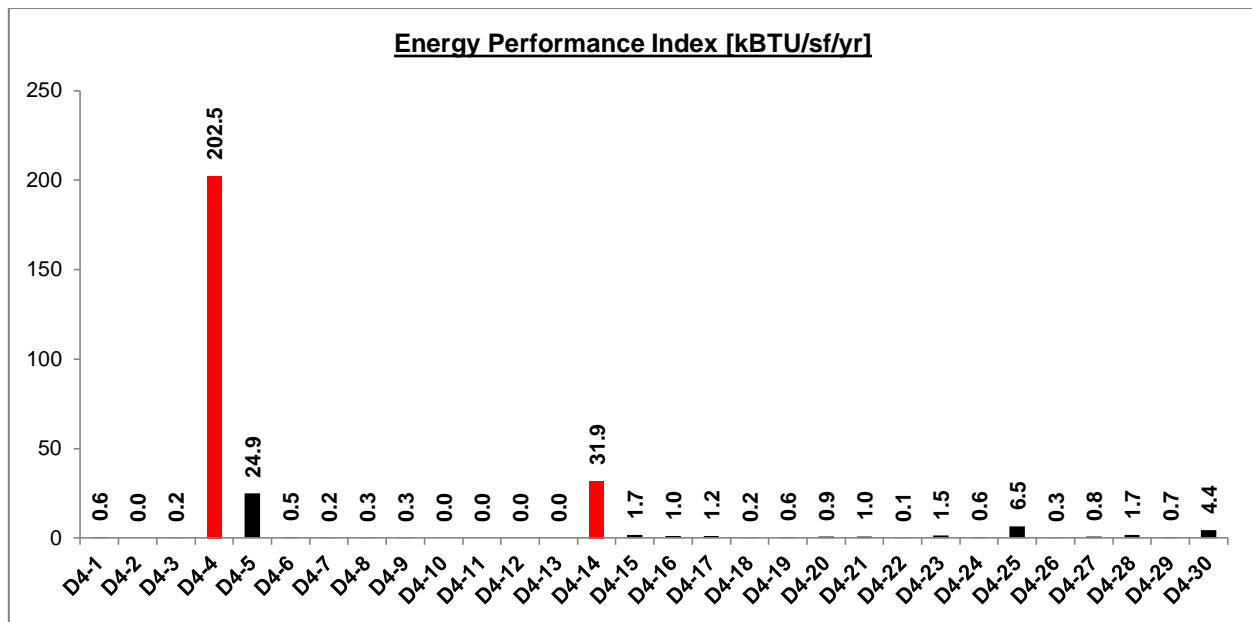


Figure 152: DEP-D4 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

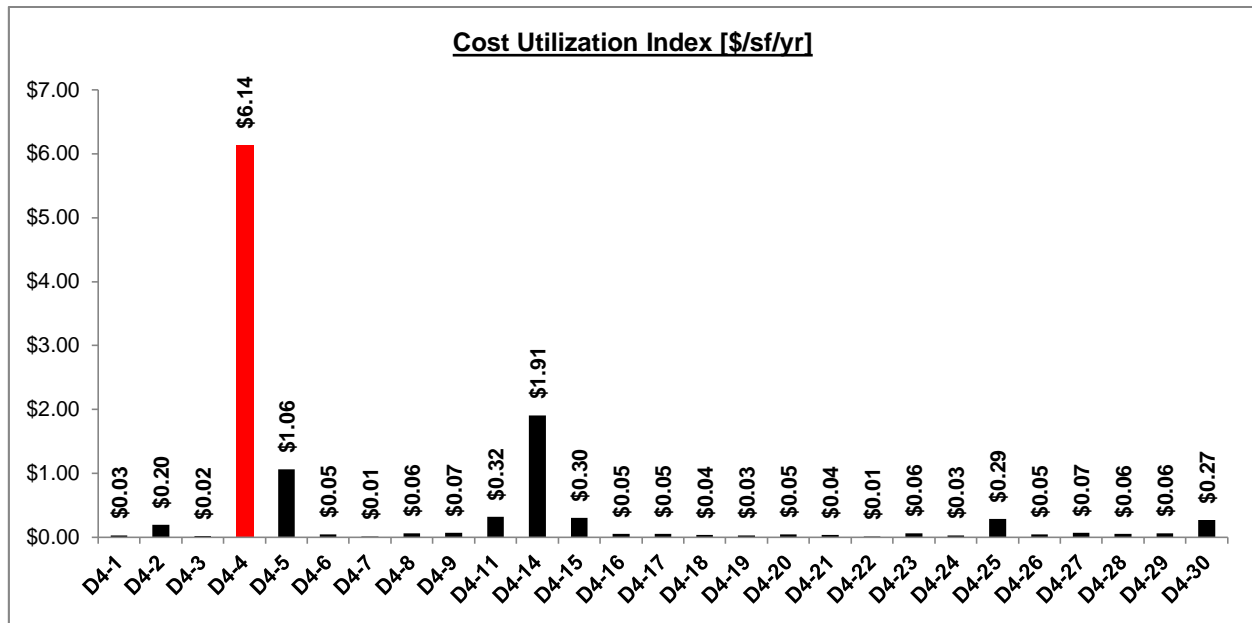


Figure 153: DEP-D4 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

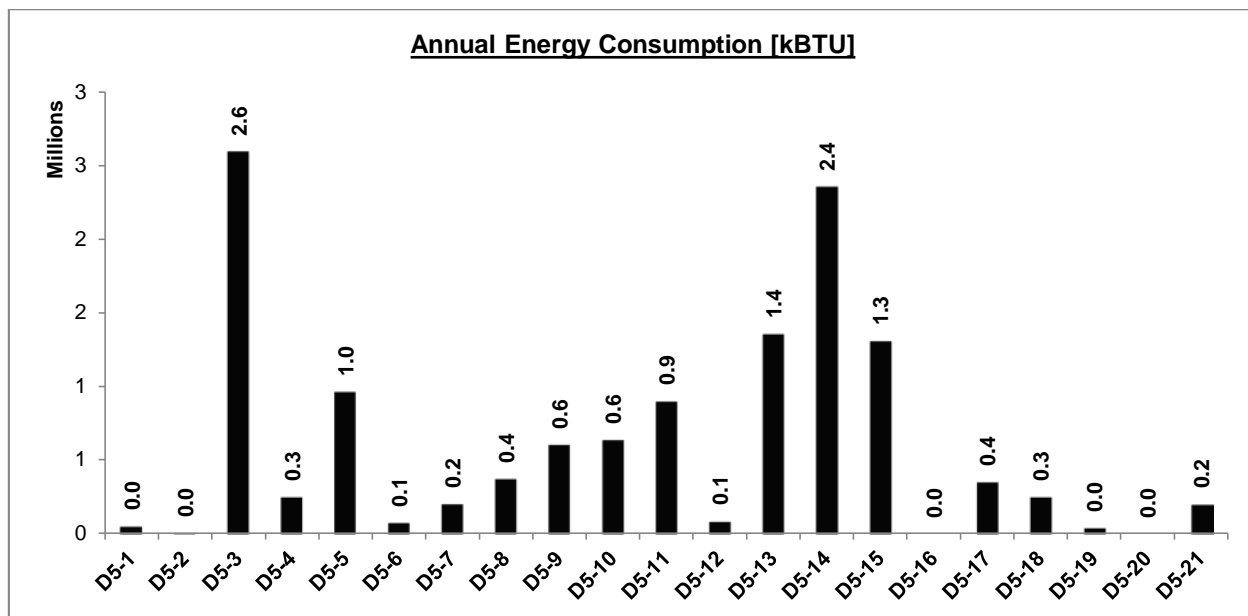


Figure 154: DEP-D5 Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

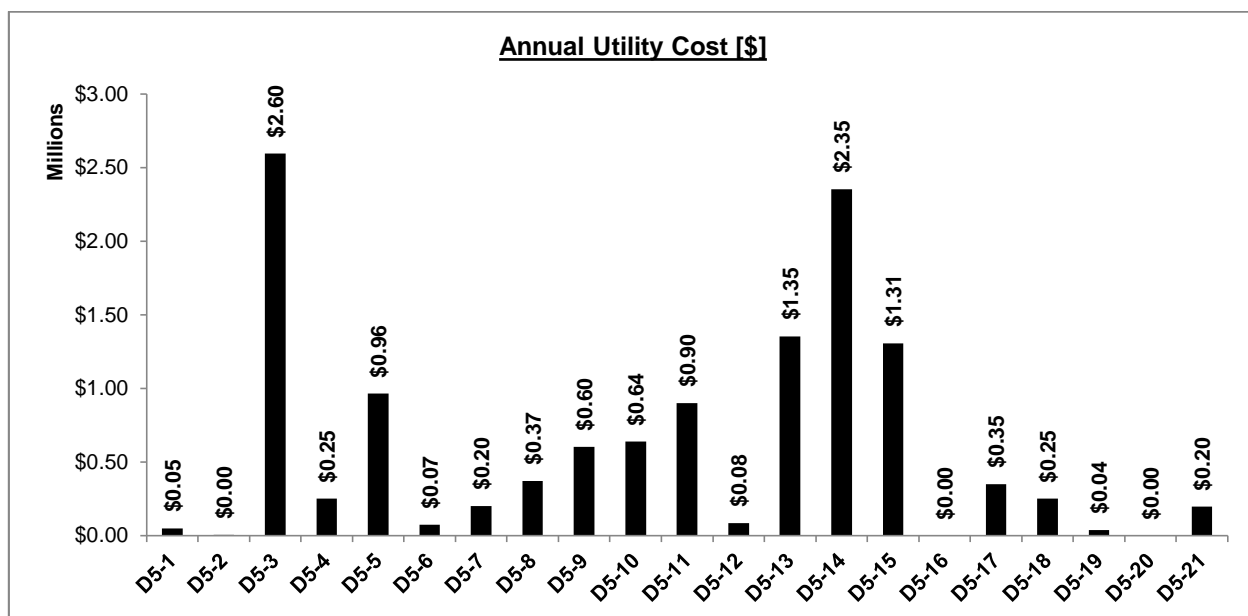


Figure 155: DEP-D5 Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

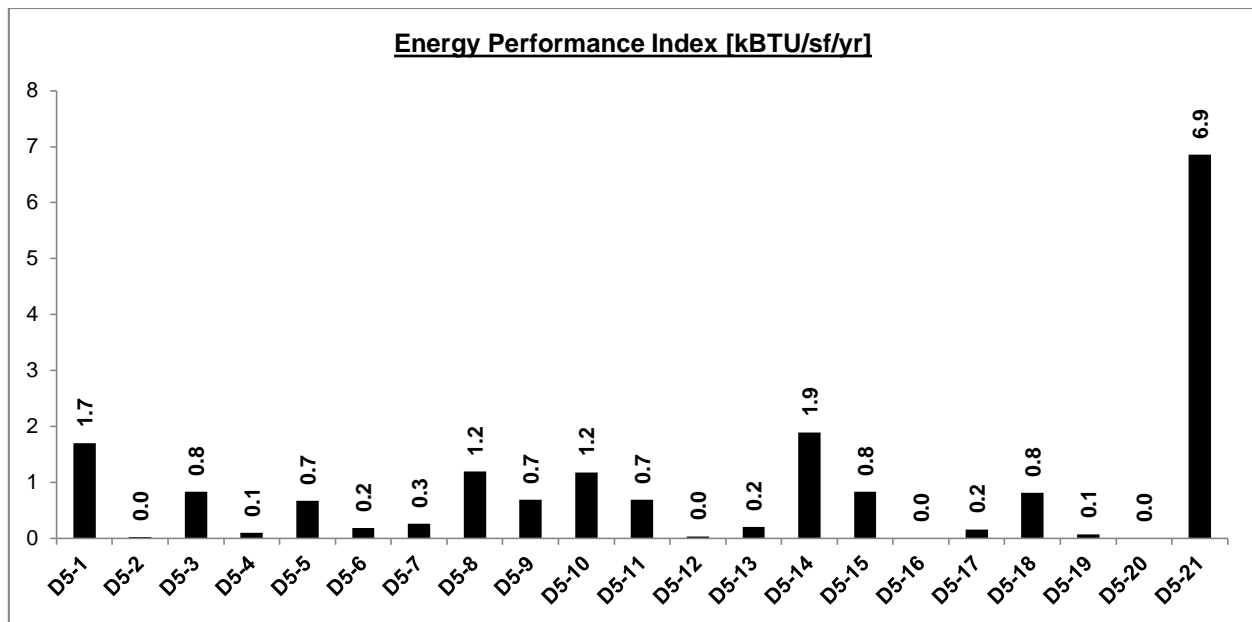


Figure 156: DEP-D5 Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

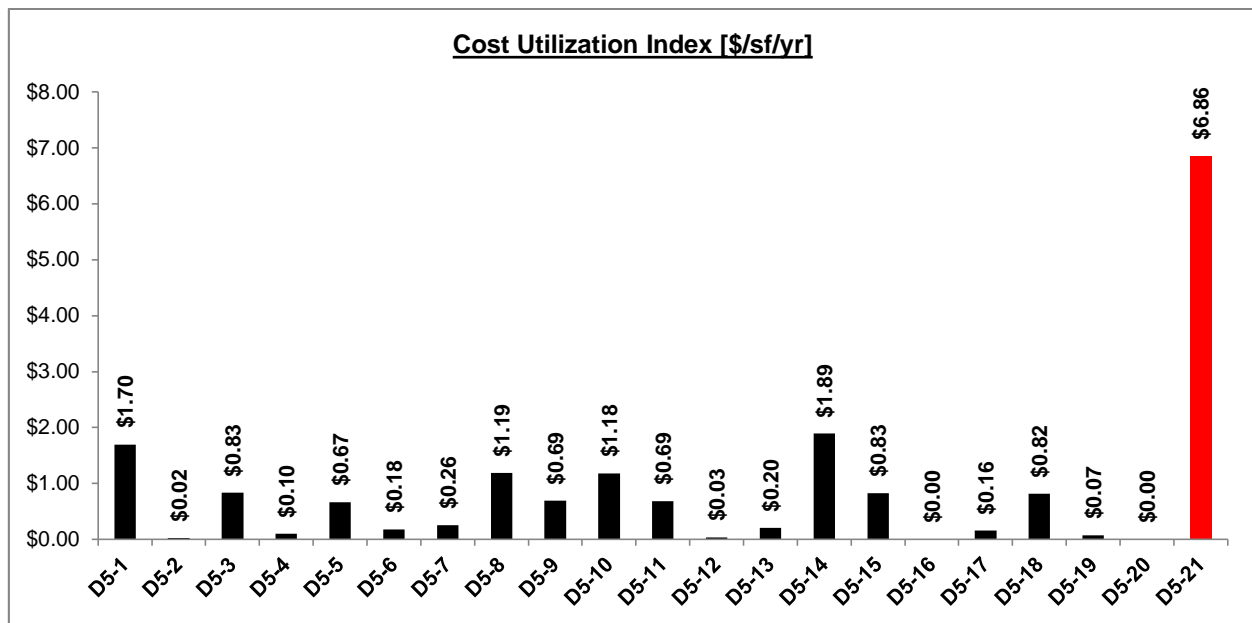


Figure 157: DEP-D5 Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

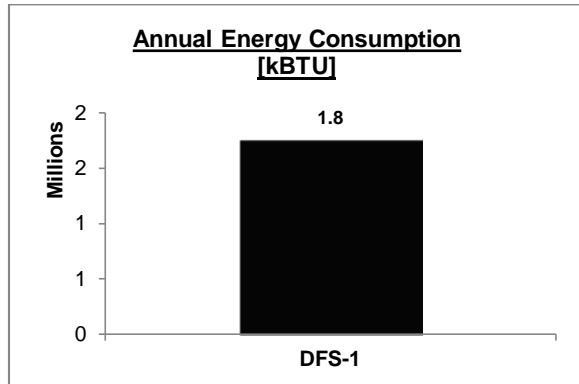


Figure 158: DFS, Facility AEC

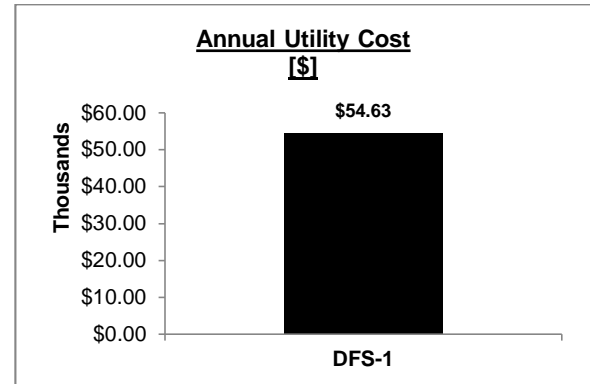


Figure 159: DFS, Facility AUC

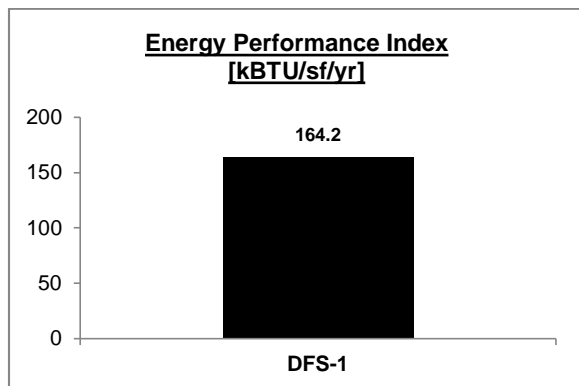


Figure 160: DFS, Facility EPI

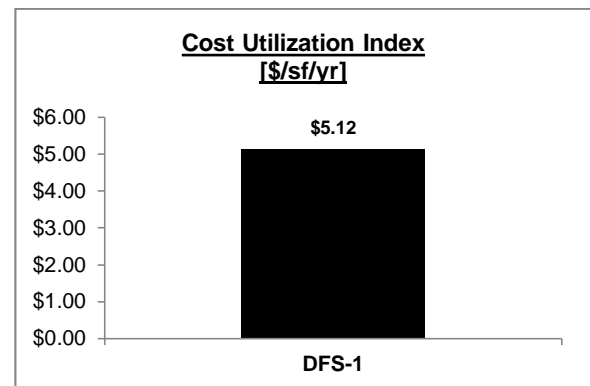


Figure 161: DFS, Facility CUI

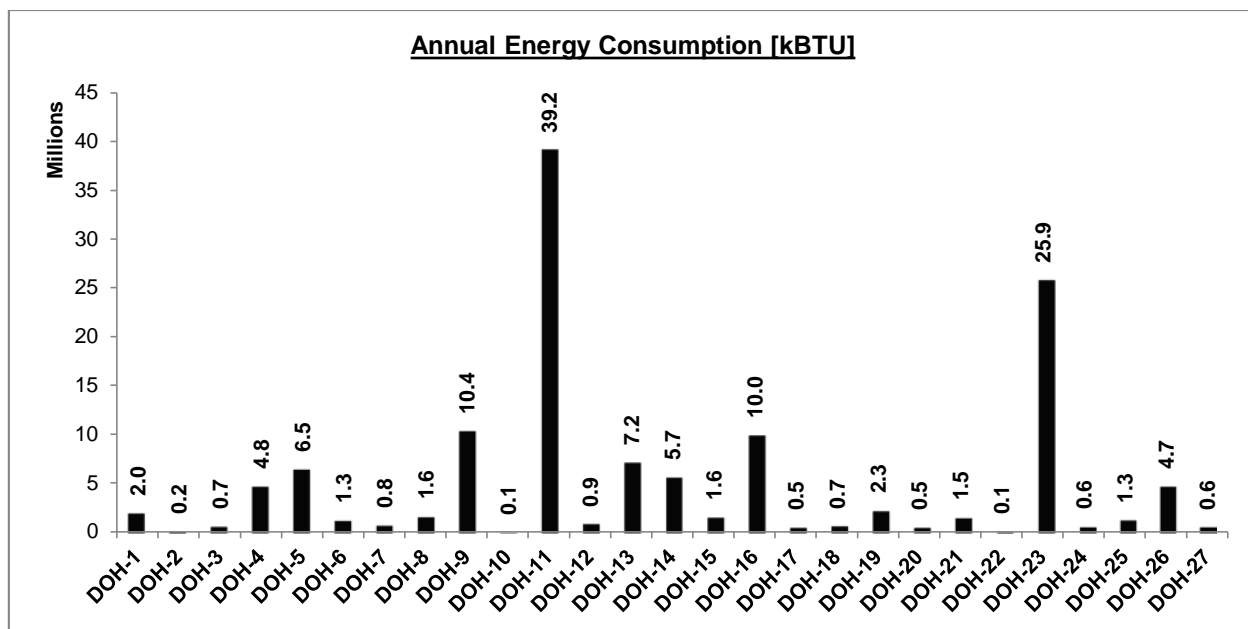


Figure 162: DOH Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

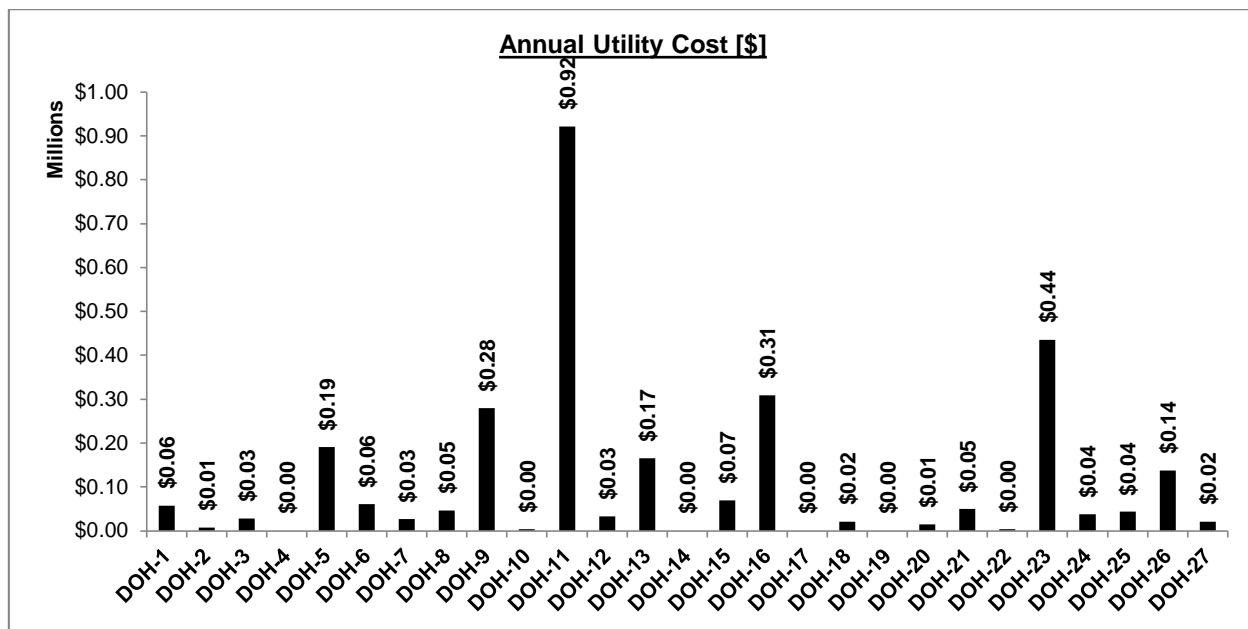


Figure 163: DOH Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

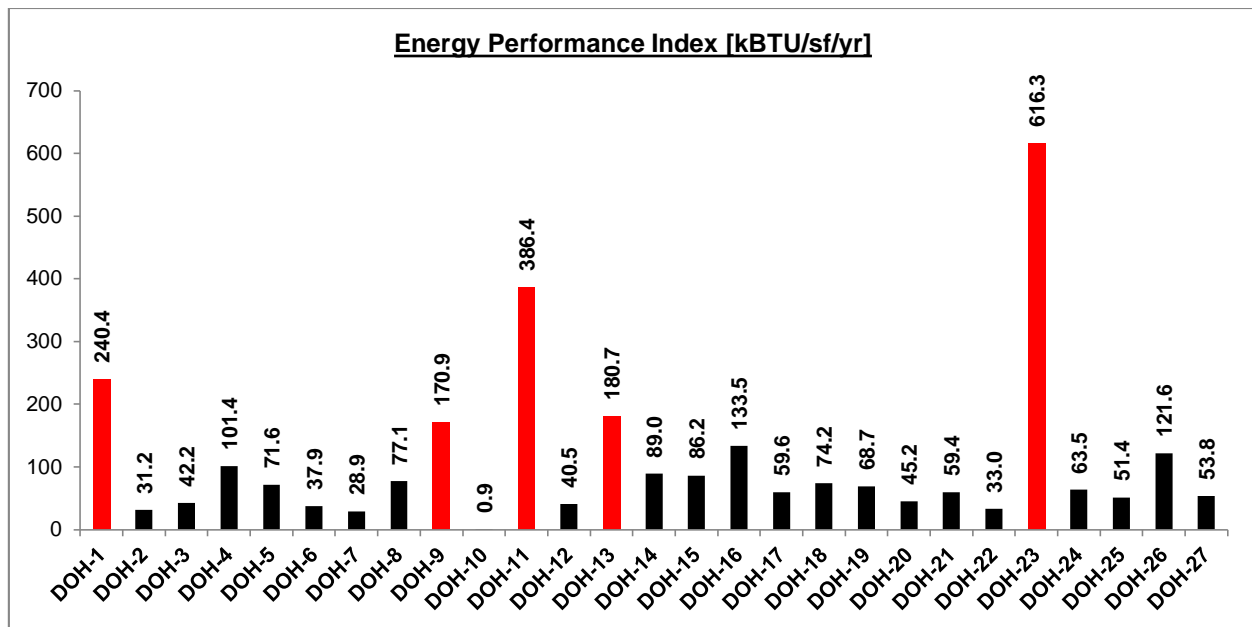


Figure 164: DOH Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

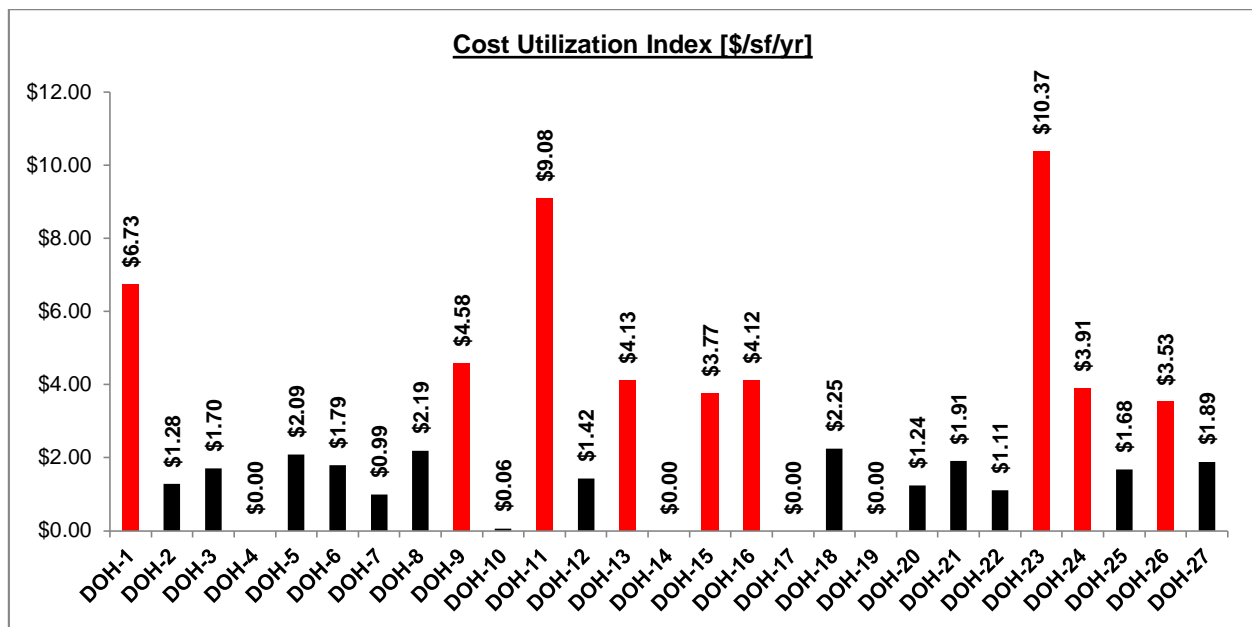


Figure 165: DOH Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

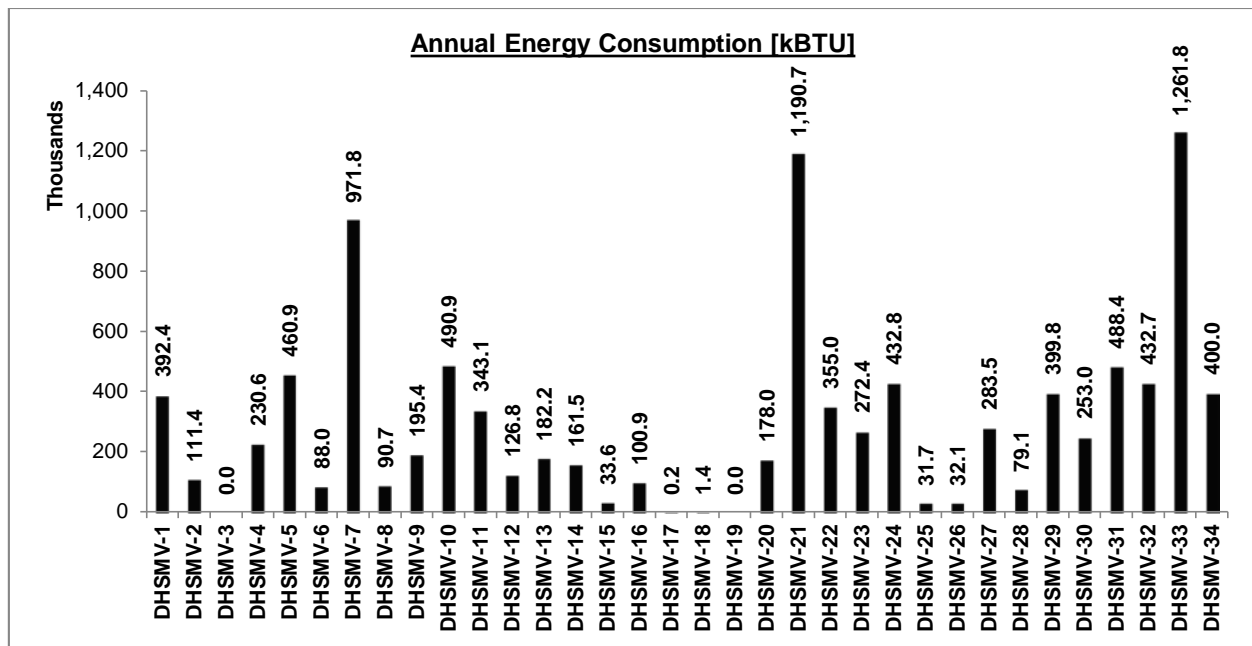


Figure 166: DHSMV Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

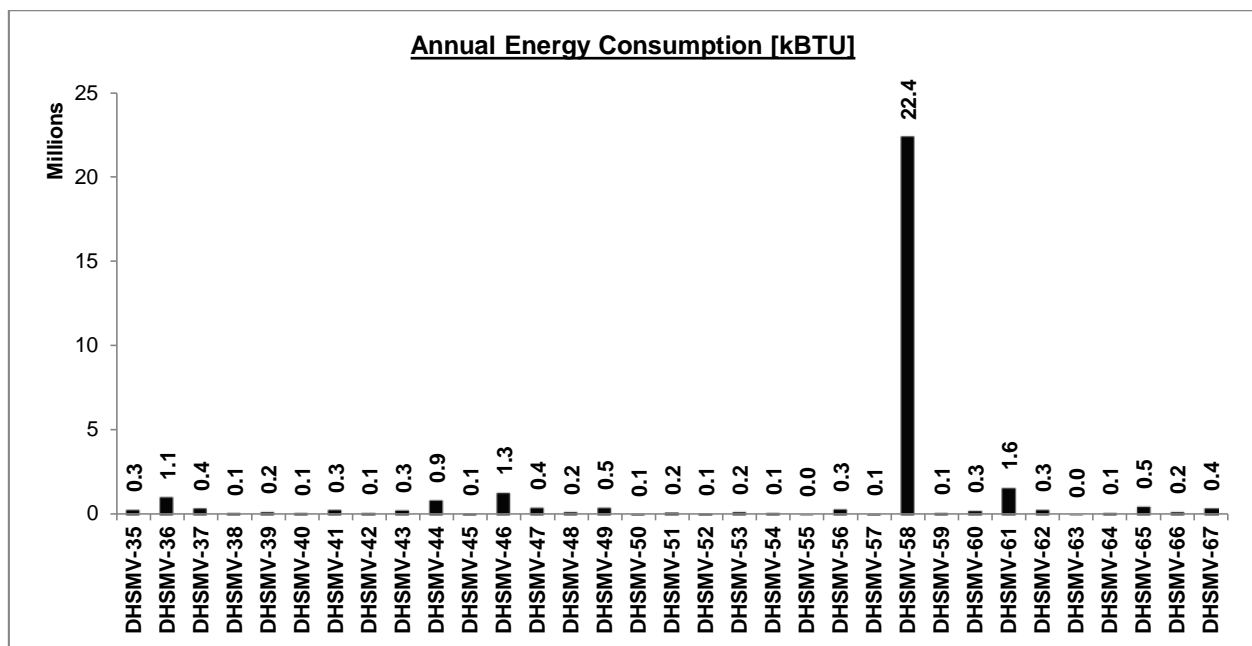


Figure 167: DHSMV Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

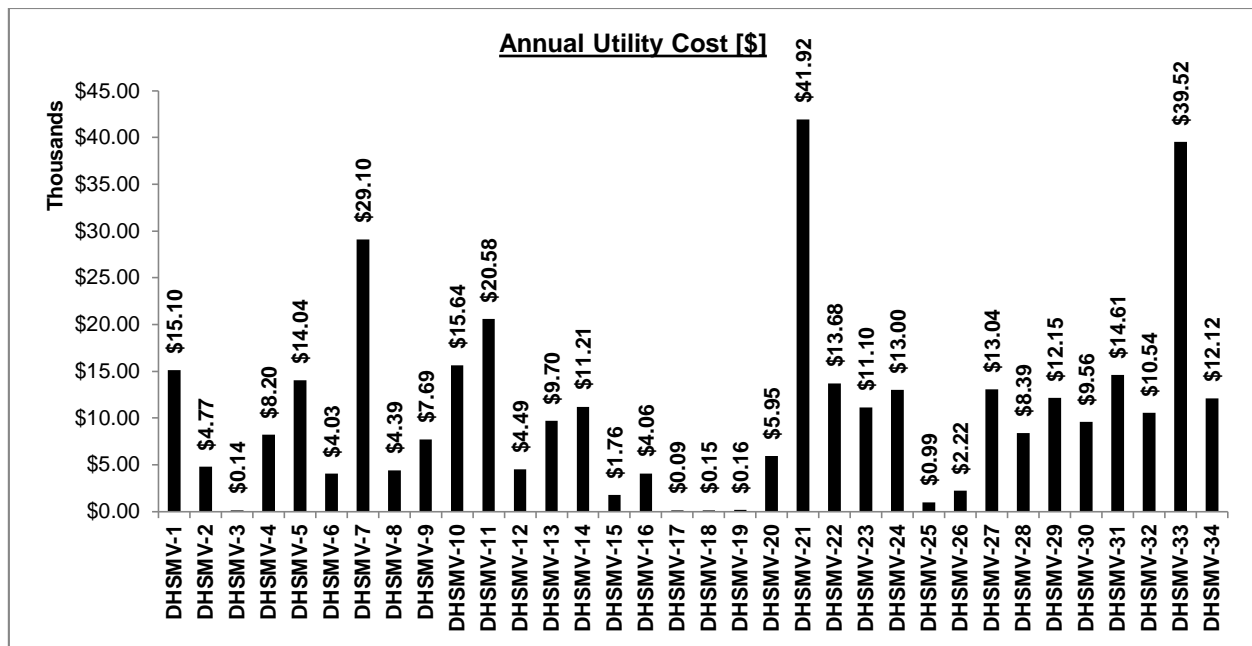


Figure 168: DHSMV Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

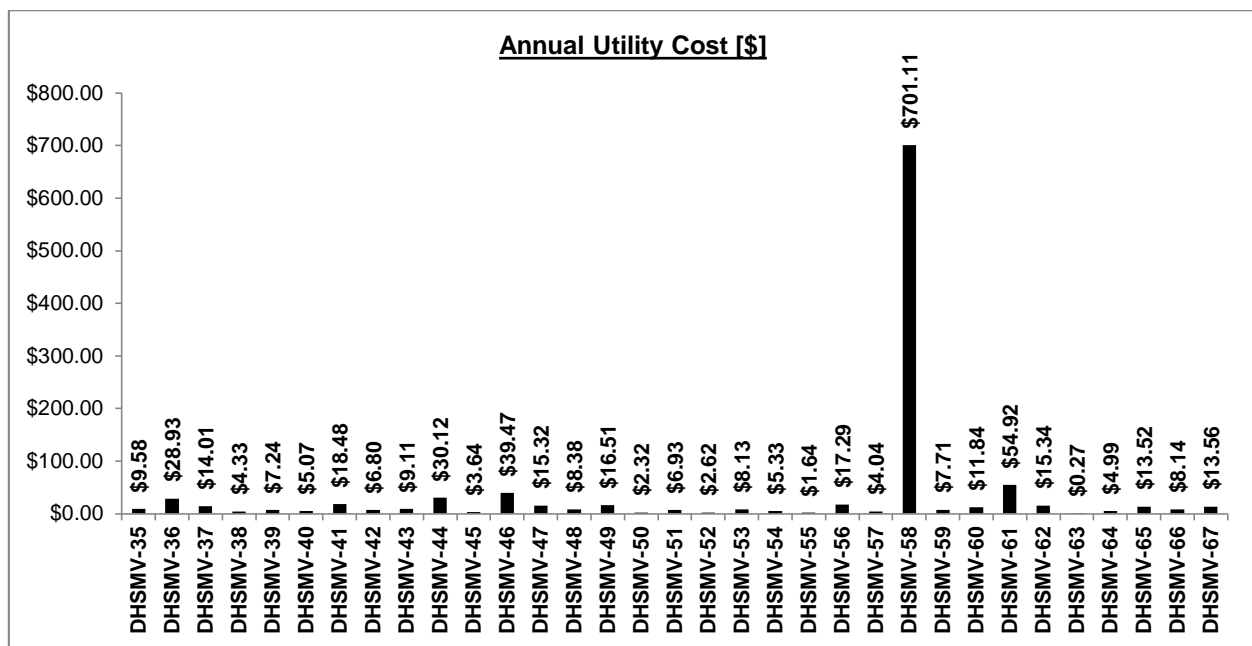


Figure 169: DHSMV Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

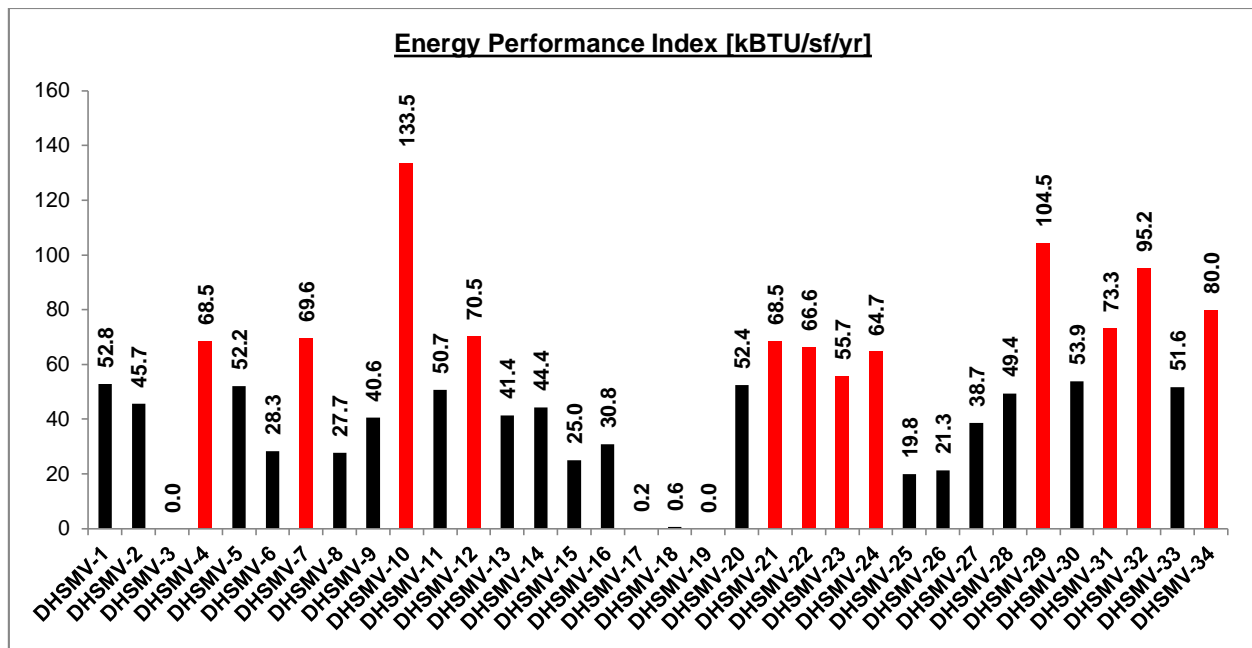


Figure 170: DHSMV Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

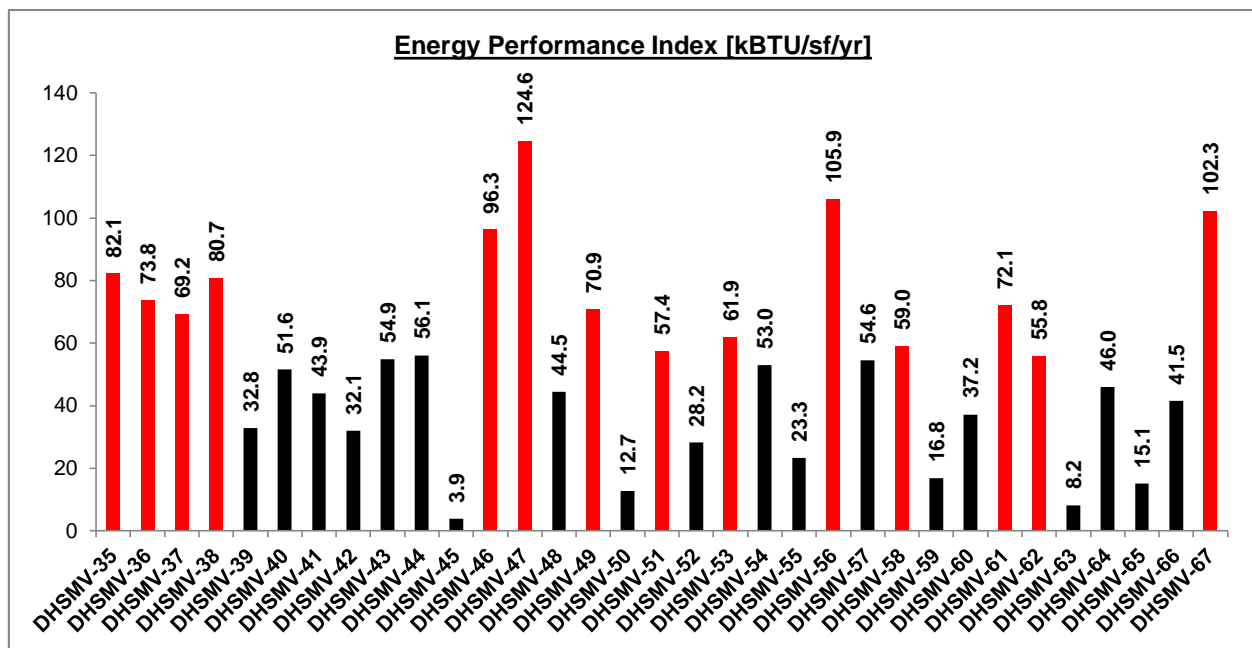


Figure 171: DHSMV Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

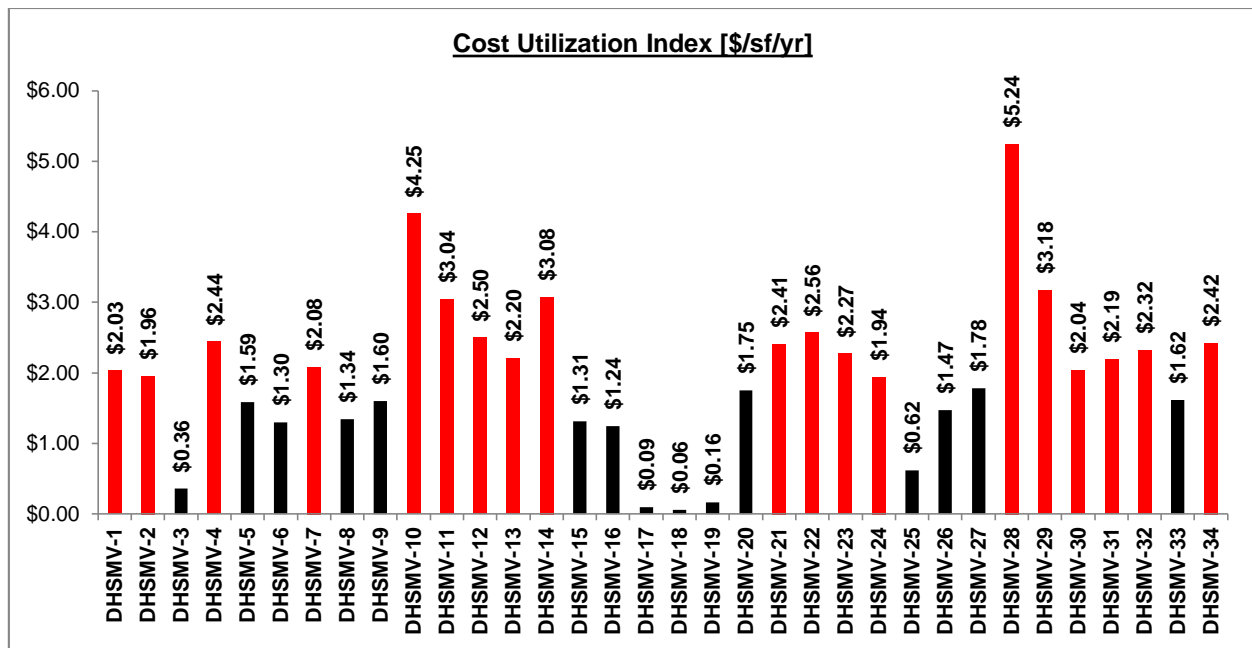


Figure 172: DHSMV Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

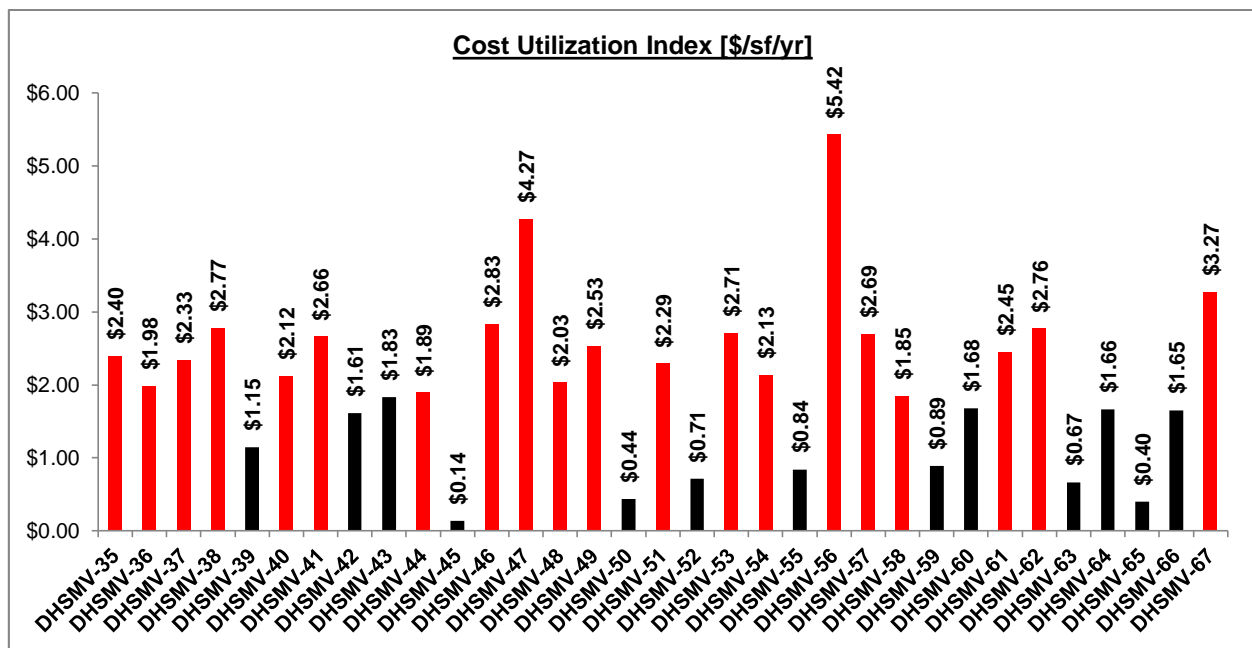


Figure 173: DHSMV Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

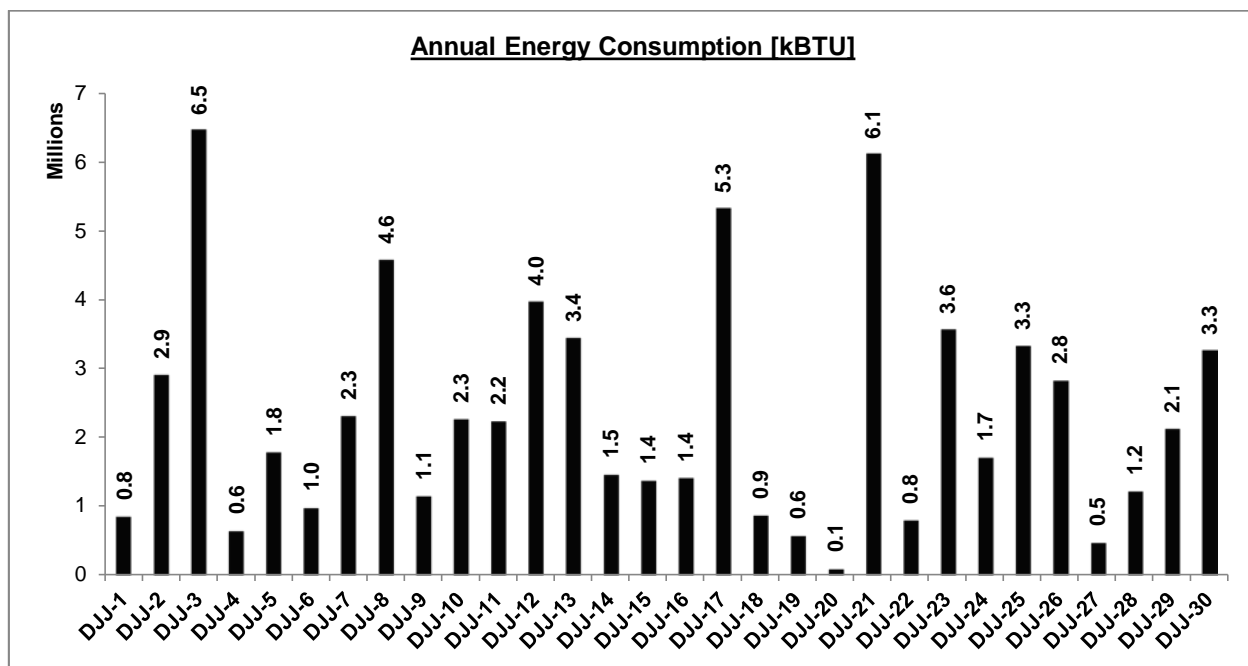


Figure 174: DJJ Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

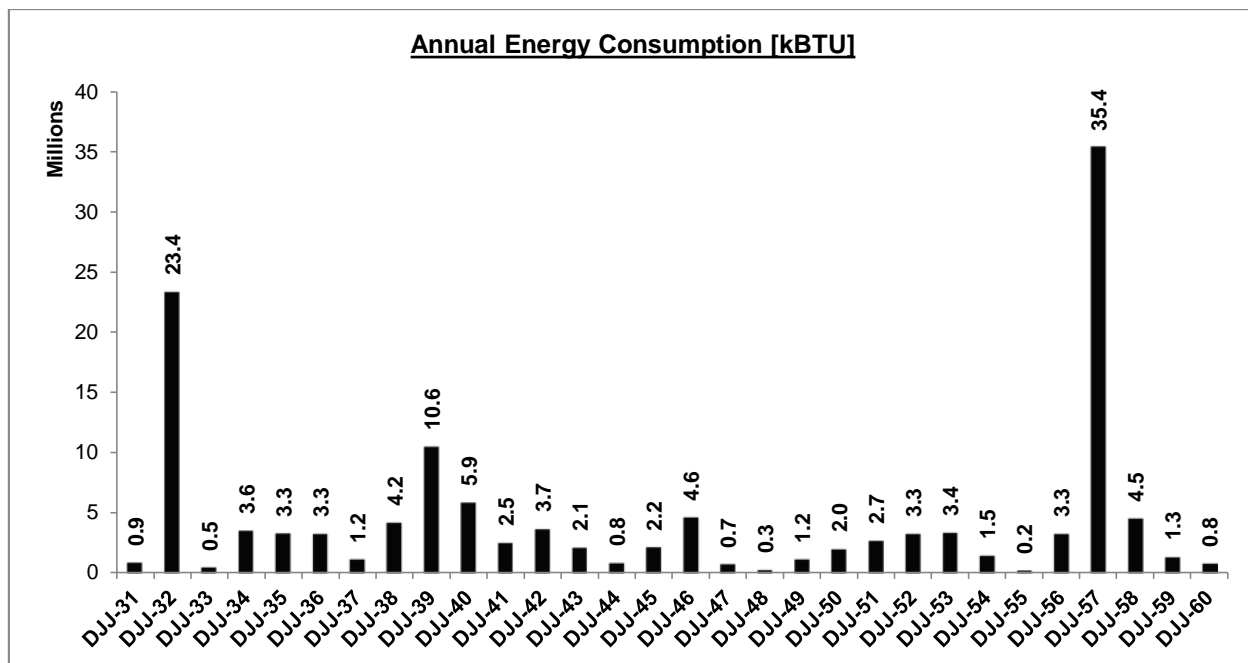


Figure 175: DJJ Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

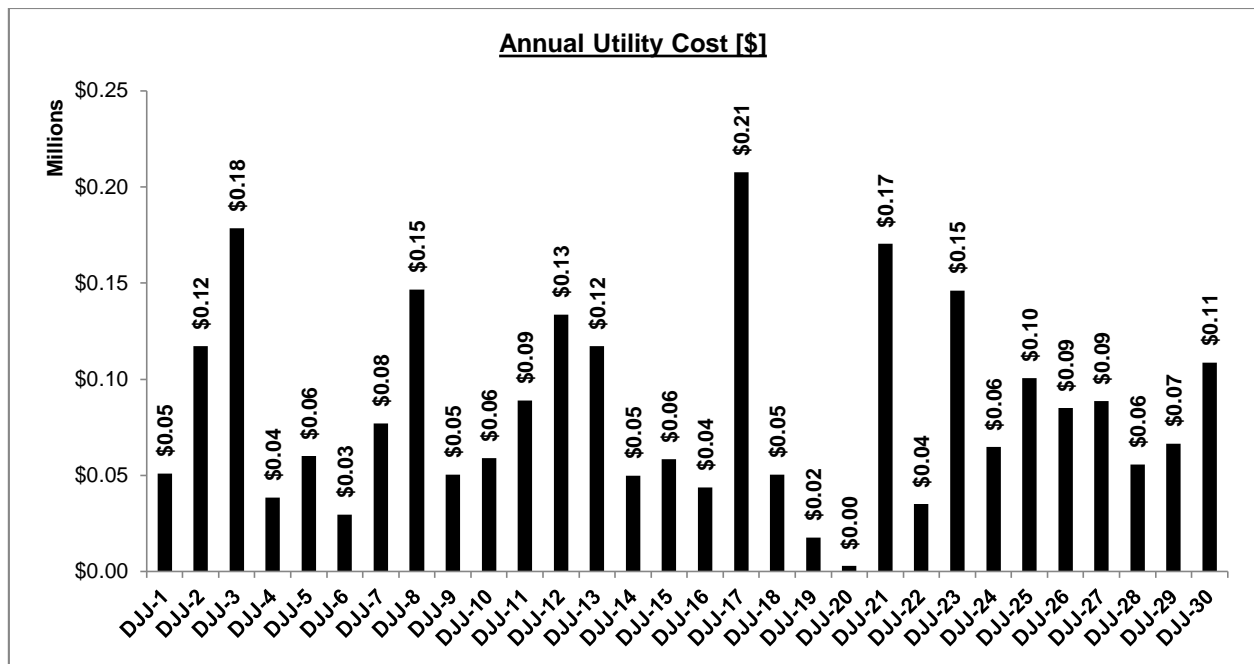


Figure 176: DJJ Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

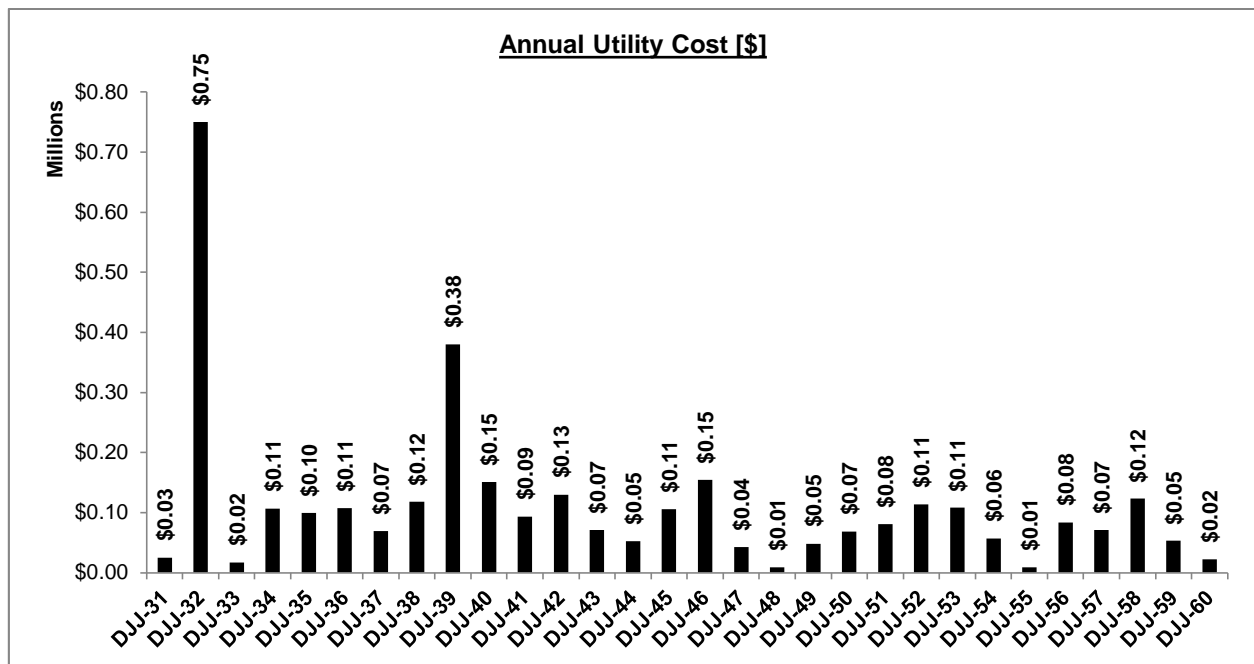


Figure 177: DJJ Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

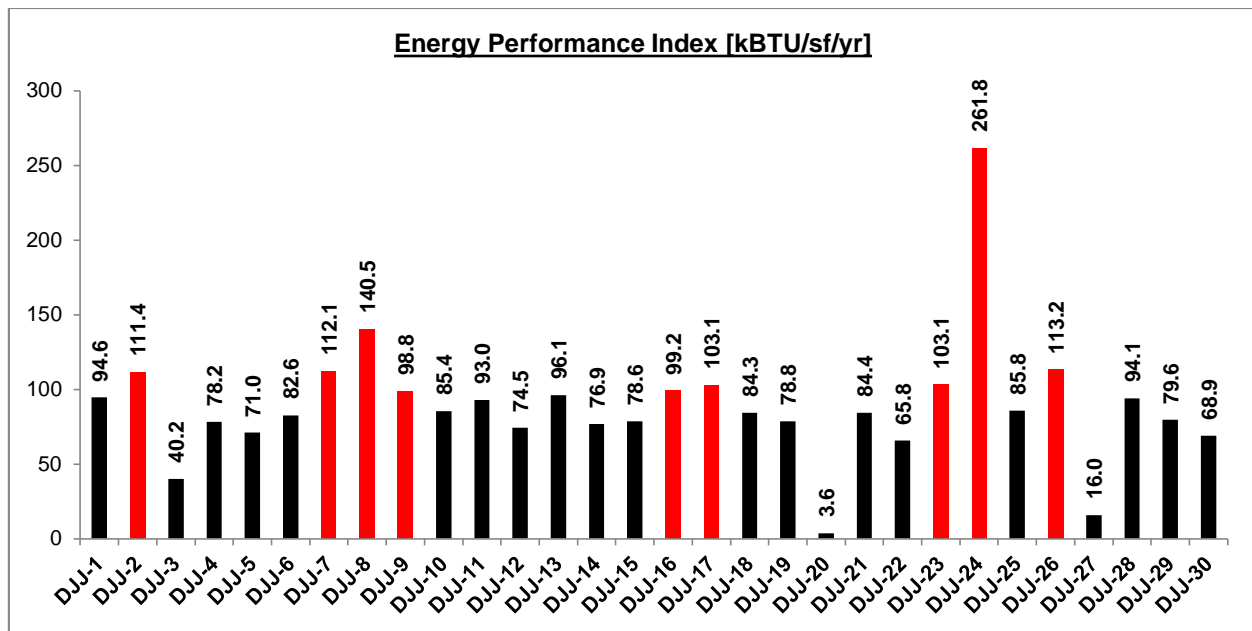


Figure 178: DJJ Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

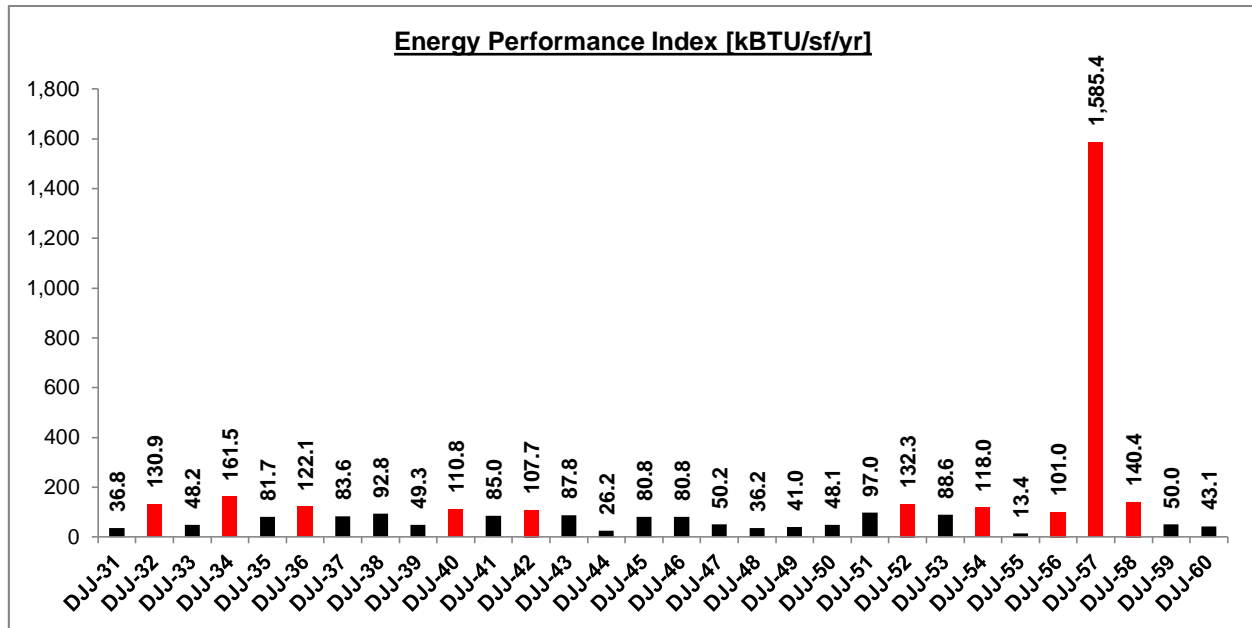


Figure 179: DJJ Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

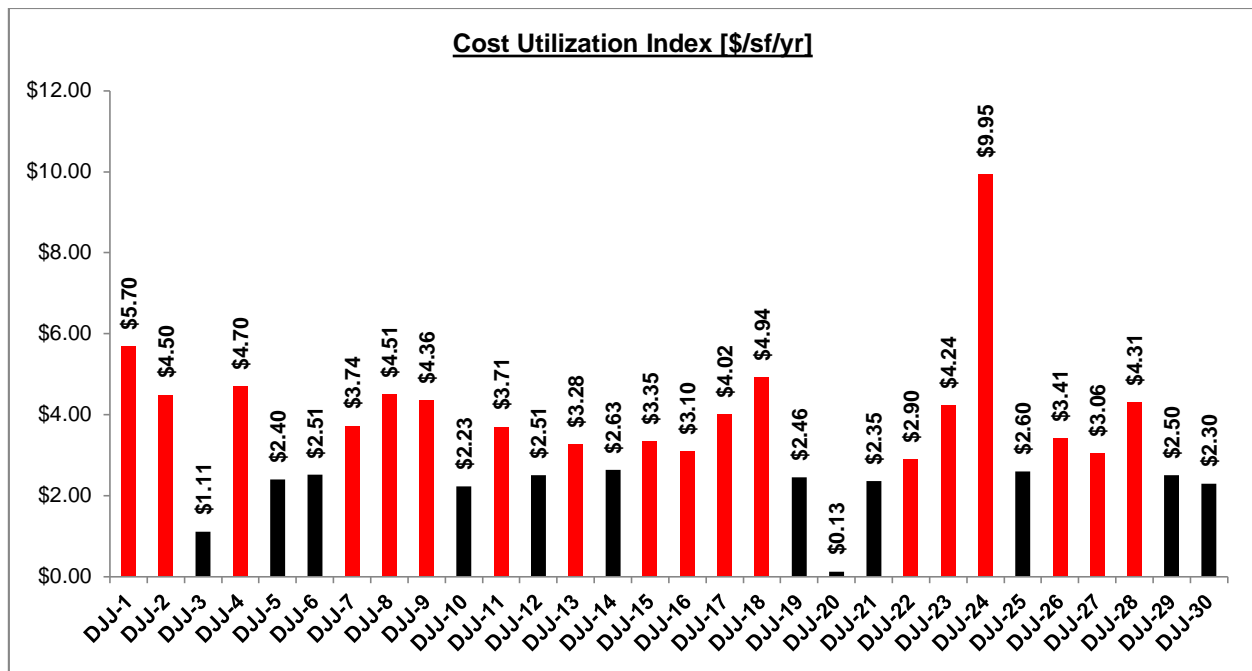


Figure 180: DJJ Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

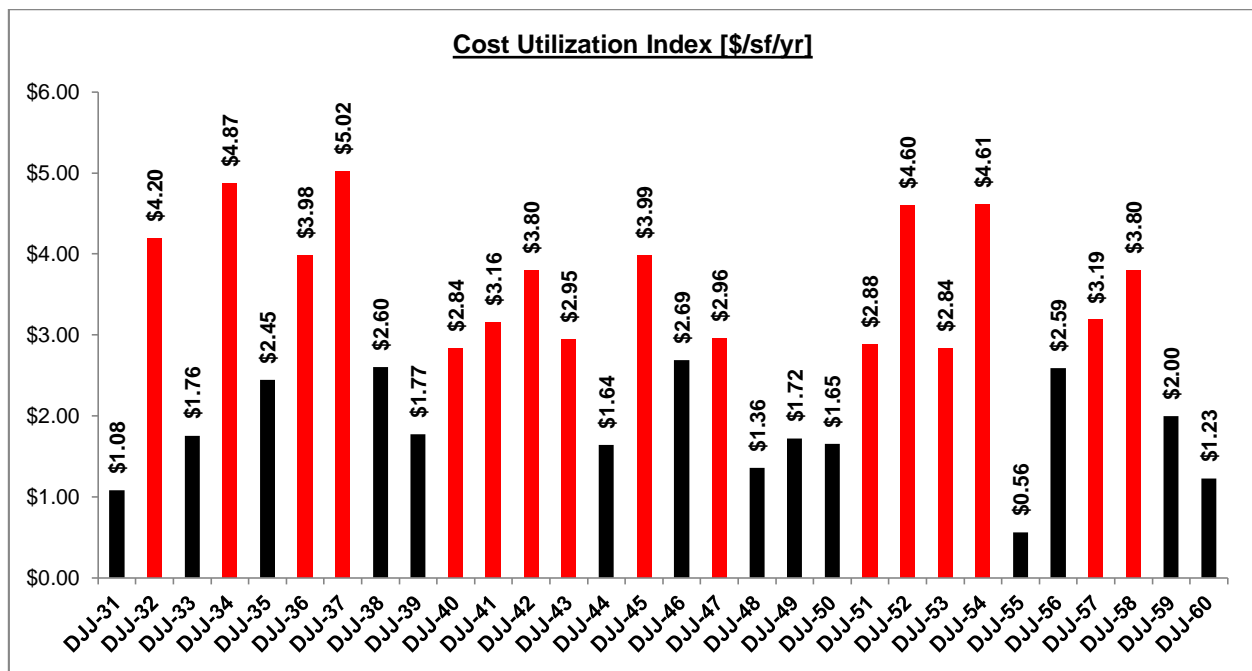


Figure 181: DJJ Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

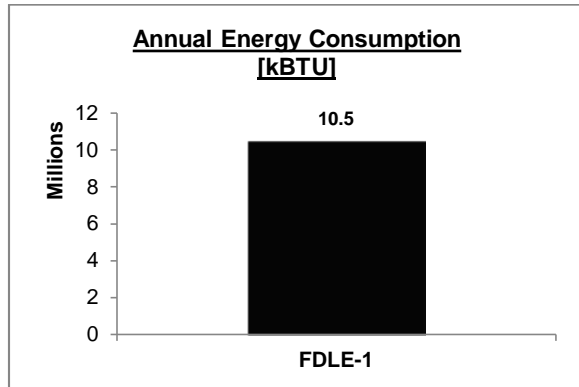


Figure 182: FDLE, Facility AEC

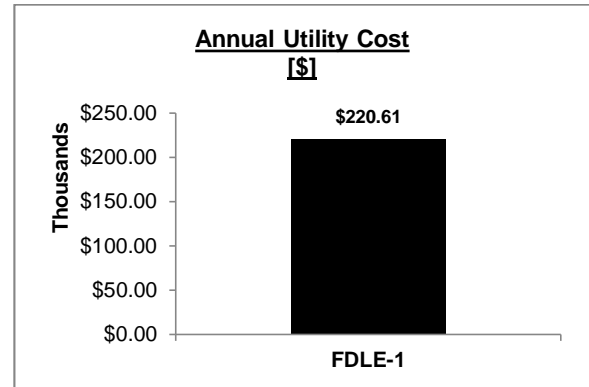


Figure 183: FDLE, Facility AUC

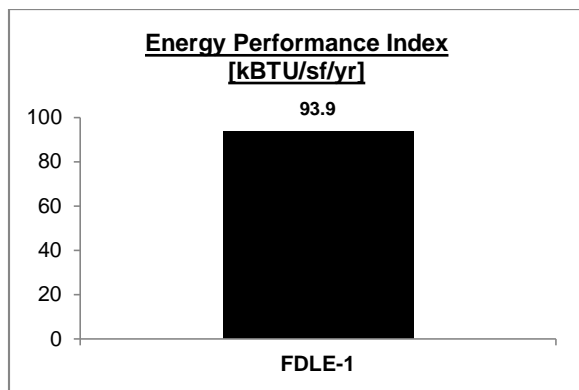


Figure 184: FDLE, Facility EPI

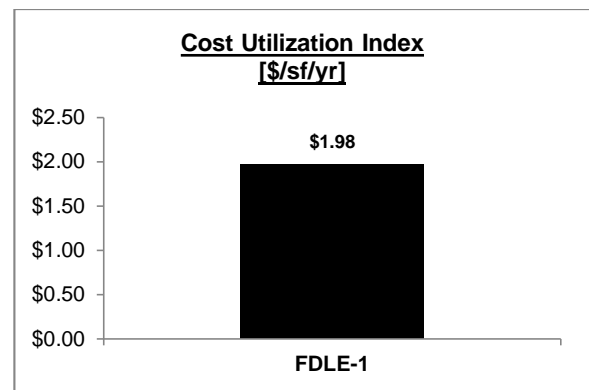


Figure 185: FDLE, Facility CUI

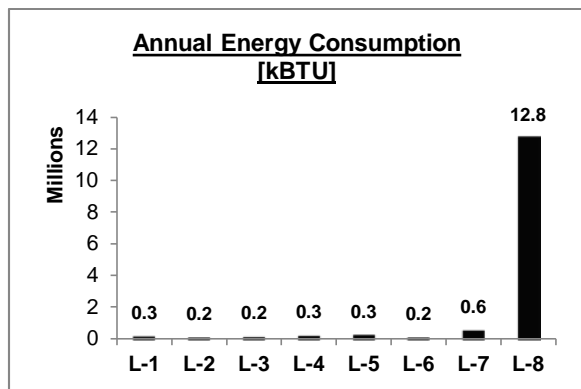


Figure 186: Lottery, Facility AEC

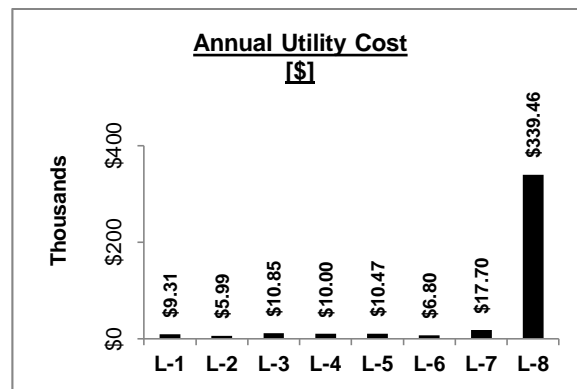


Figure 187: Lottery, Facility AUC

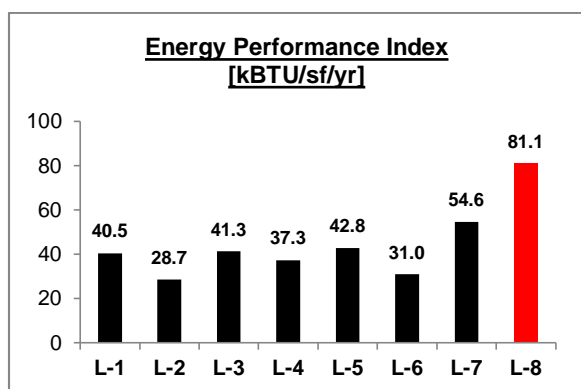


Figure 188: Lottery, Facility EPI

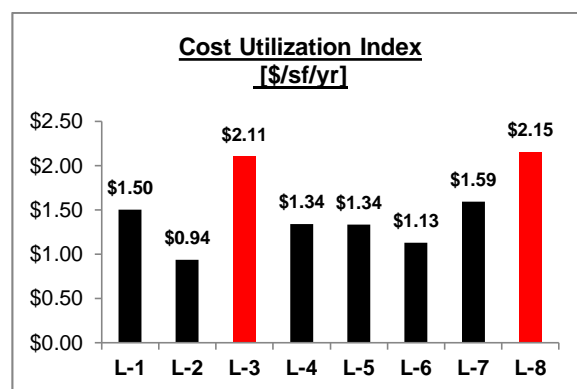


Figure 189: Lottery, Facility CUI

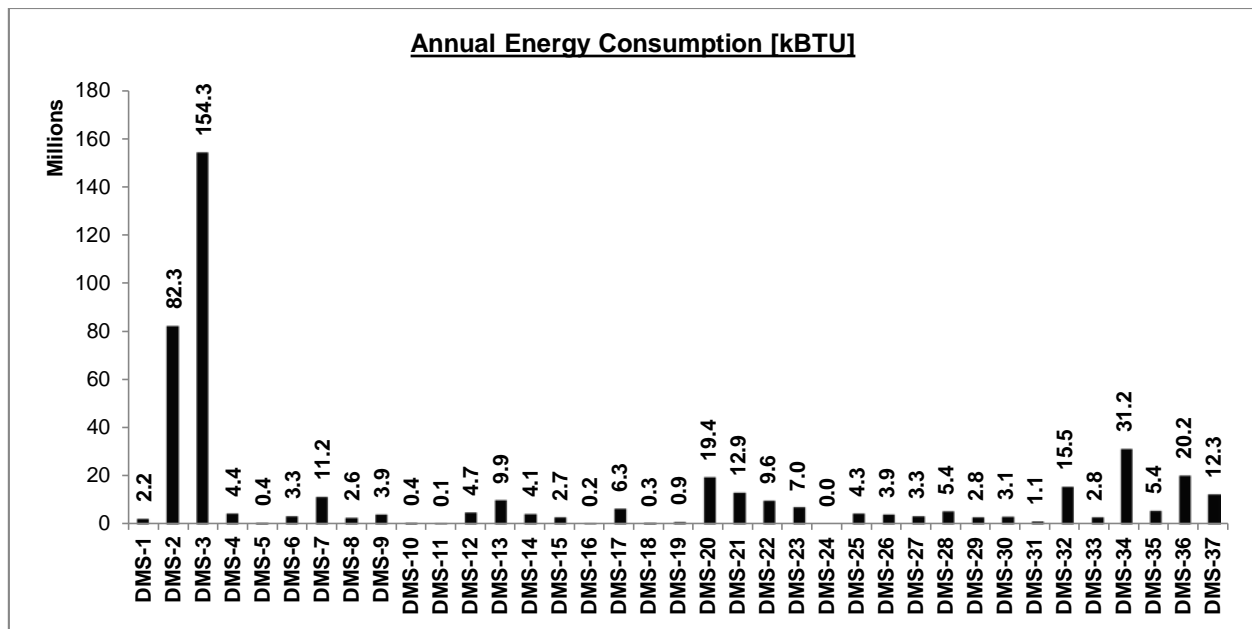


Figure 190: DMS Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

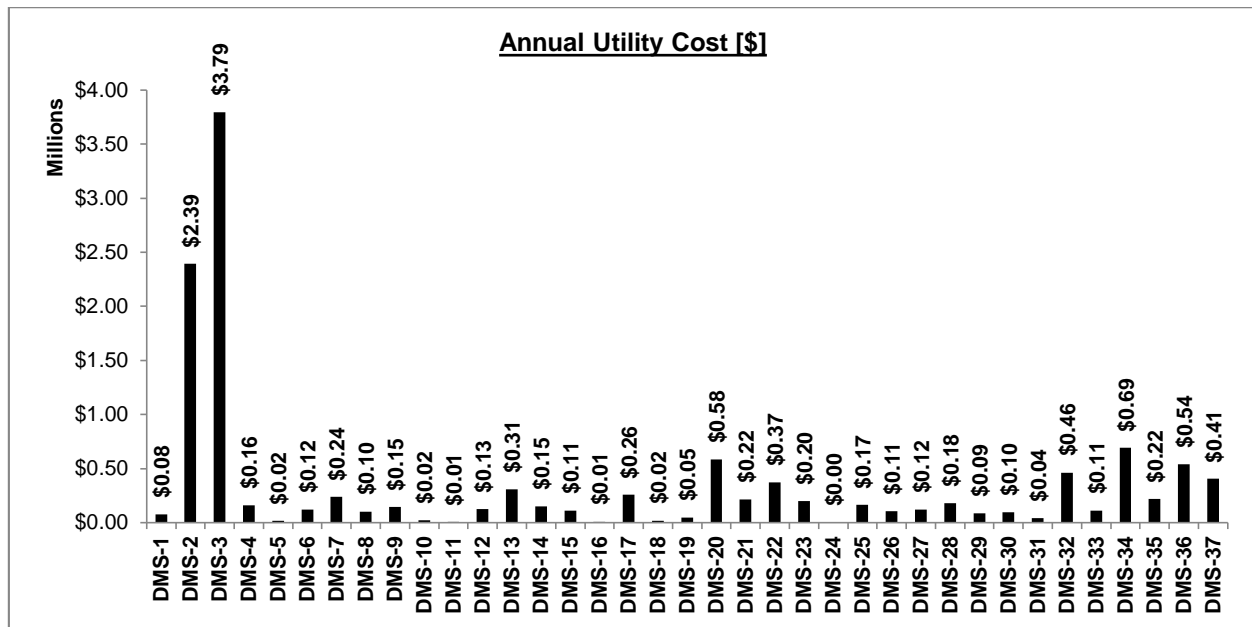


Figure 191: DMS Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

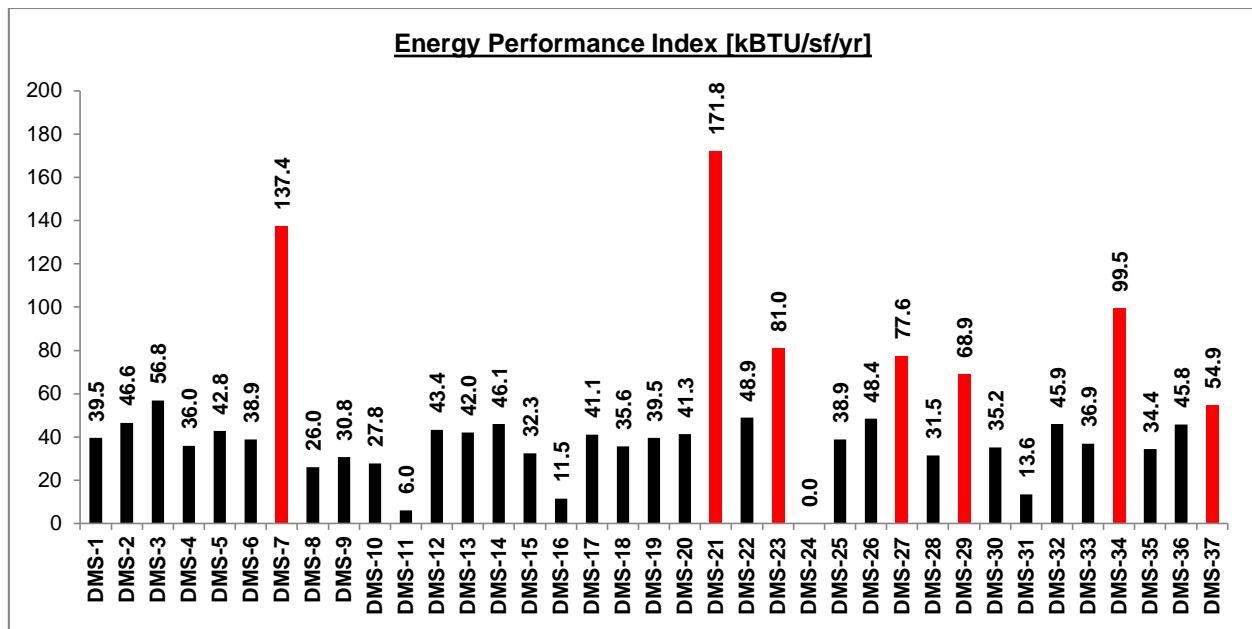


Figure 192: DMS Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

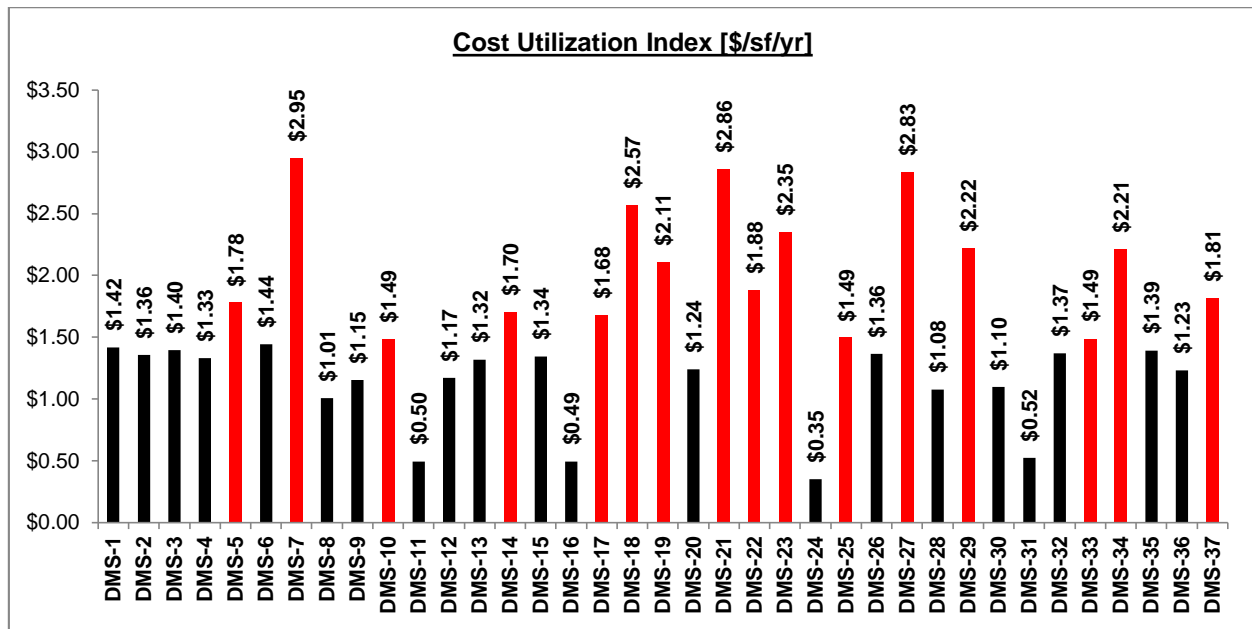


Figure 193: DMS Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

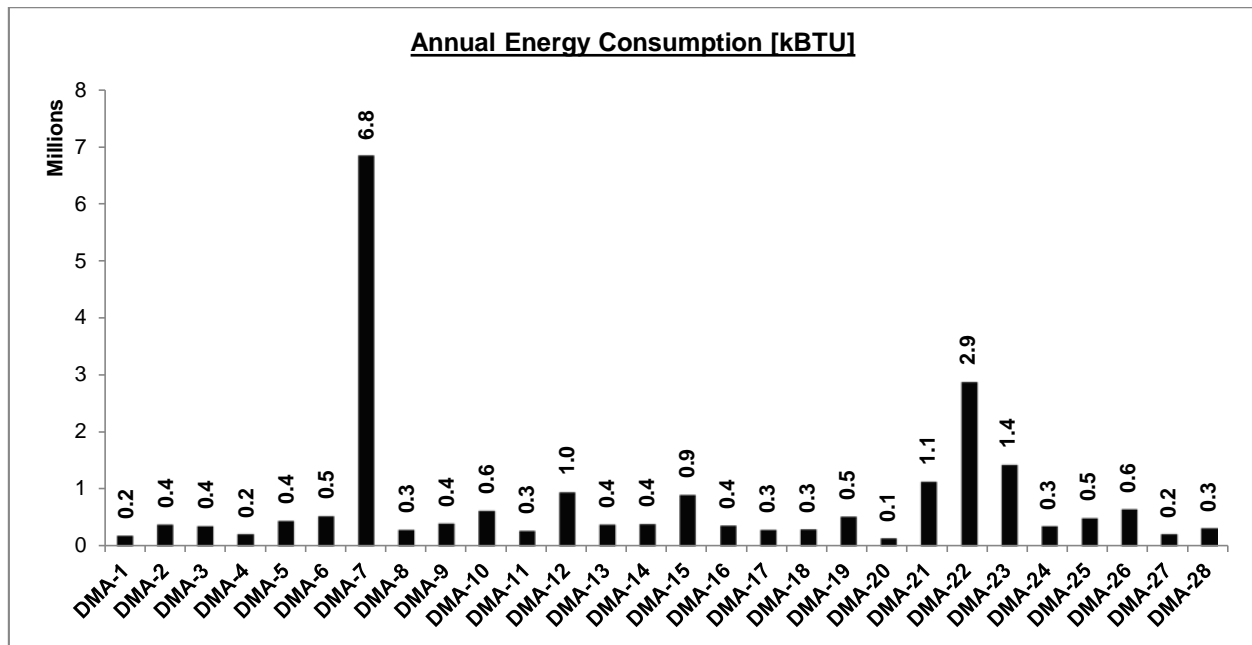


Figure 194: DMA Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

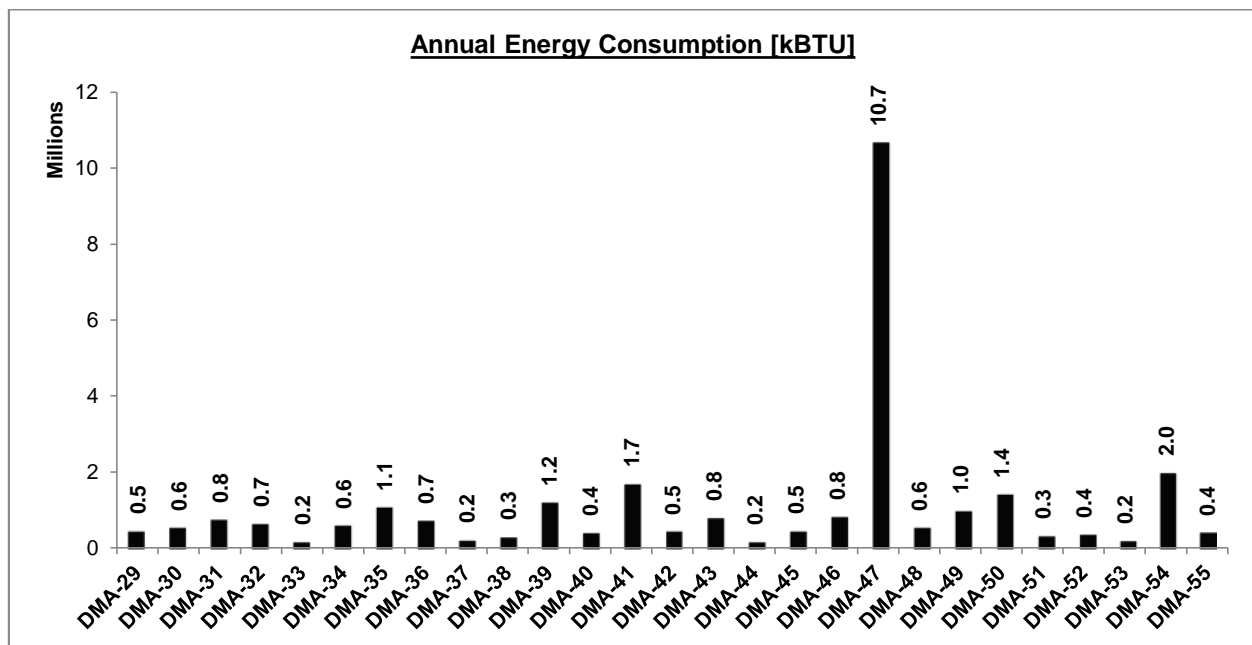


Figure 195: DMA Annual Energy Consumption, By Facility, FY 2013-14

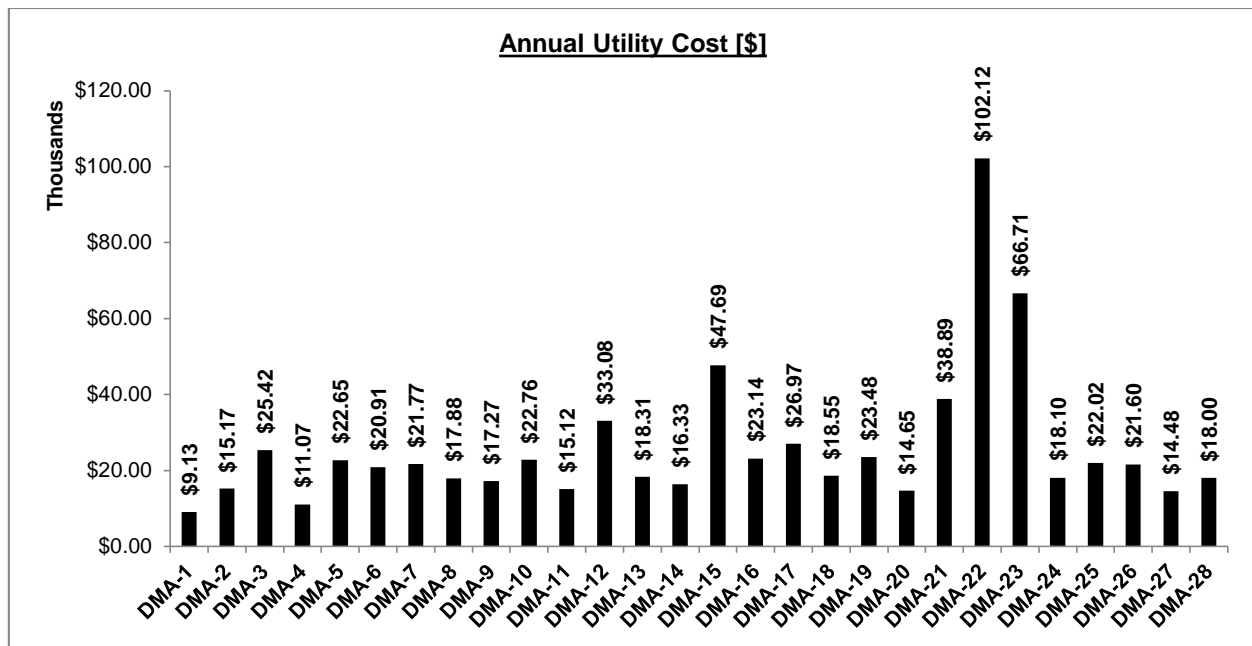


Figure 196: DMA Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

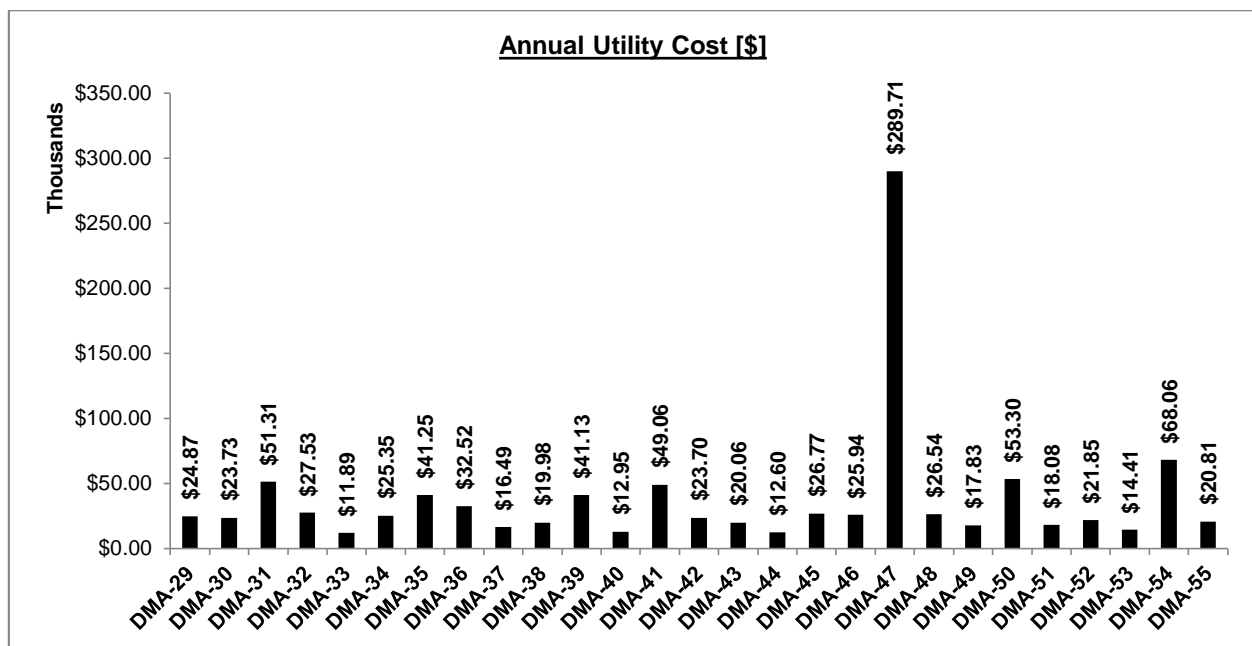


Figure 197: DMA Annual Utility Cost, By Facility, FY 2013-14

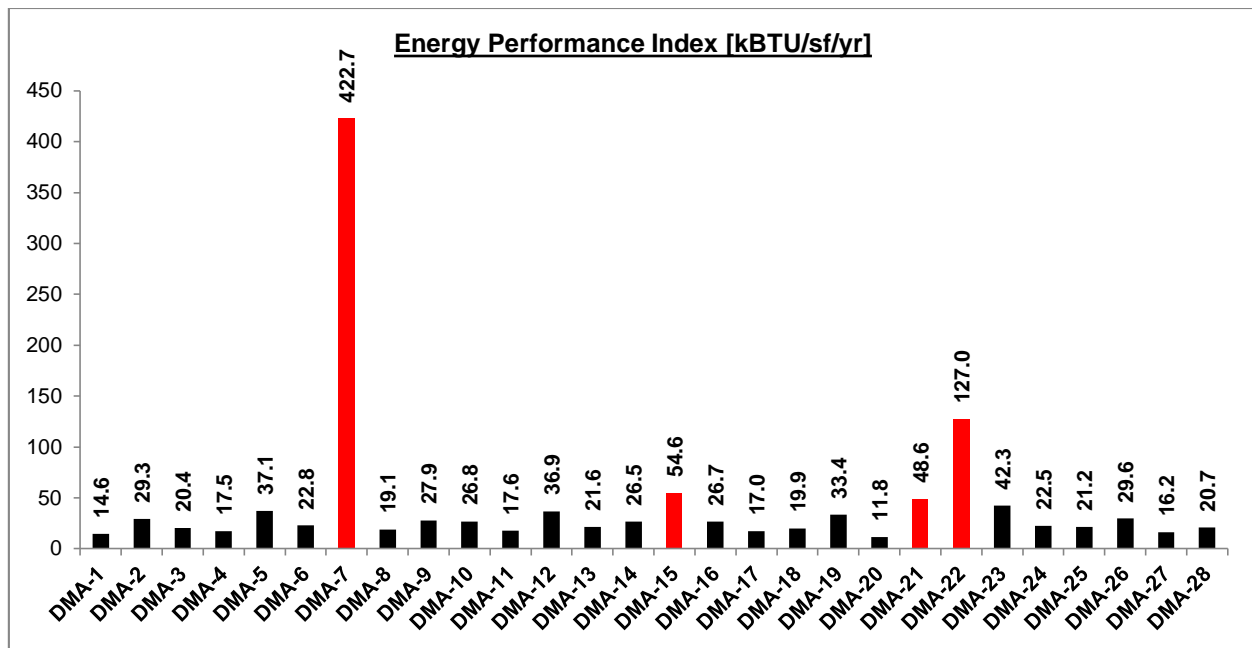


Figure 198: DMA Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

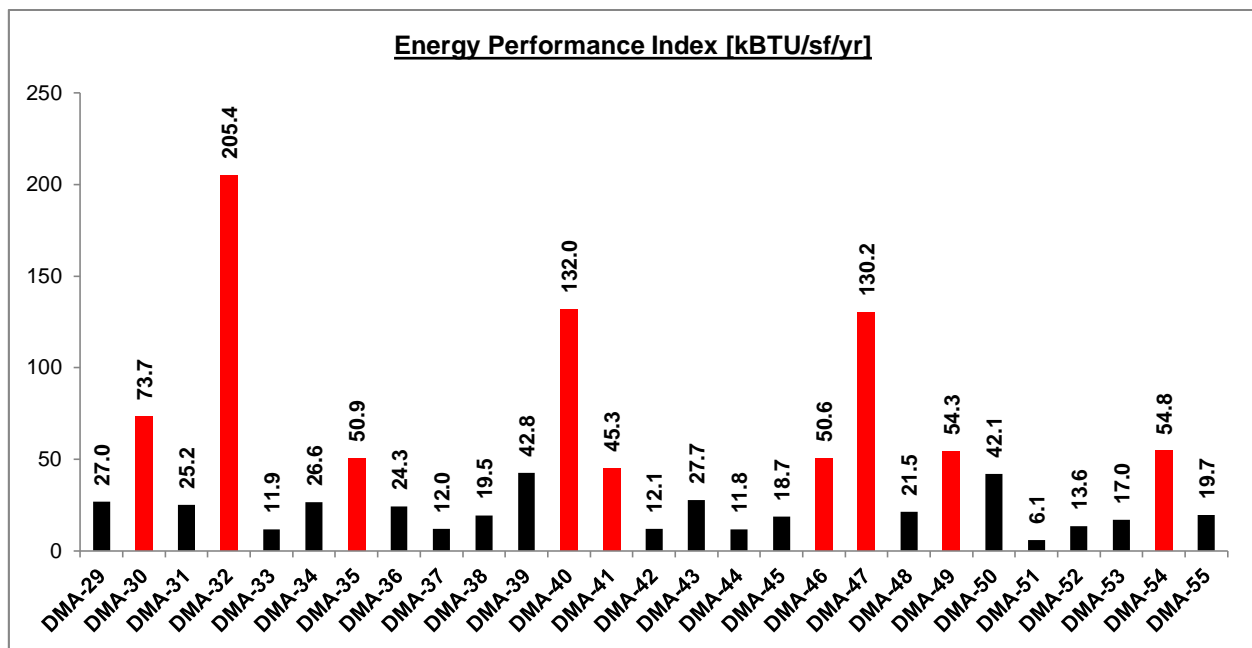


Figure 199: DMA Energy Performance Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

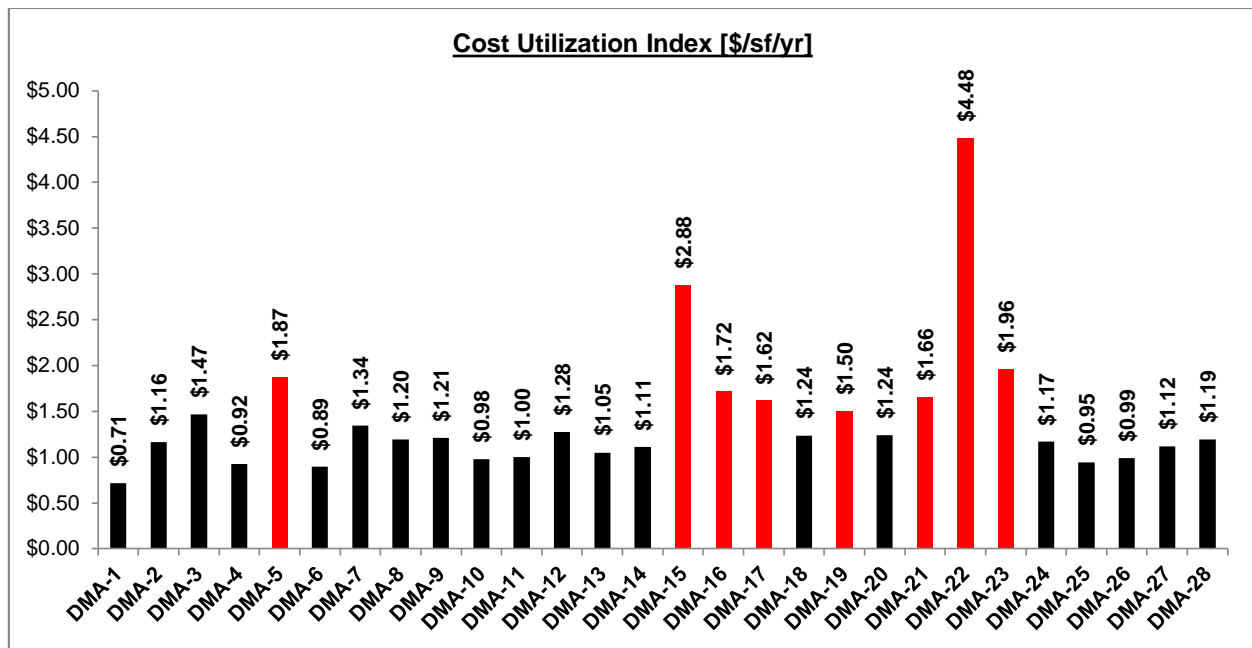


Figure 200: DMA Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

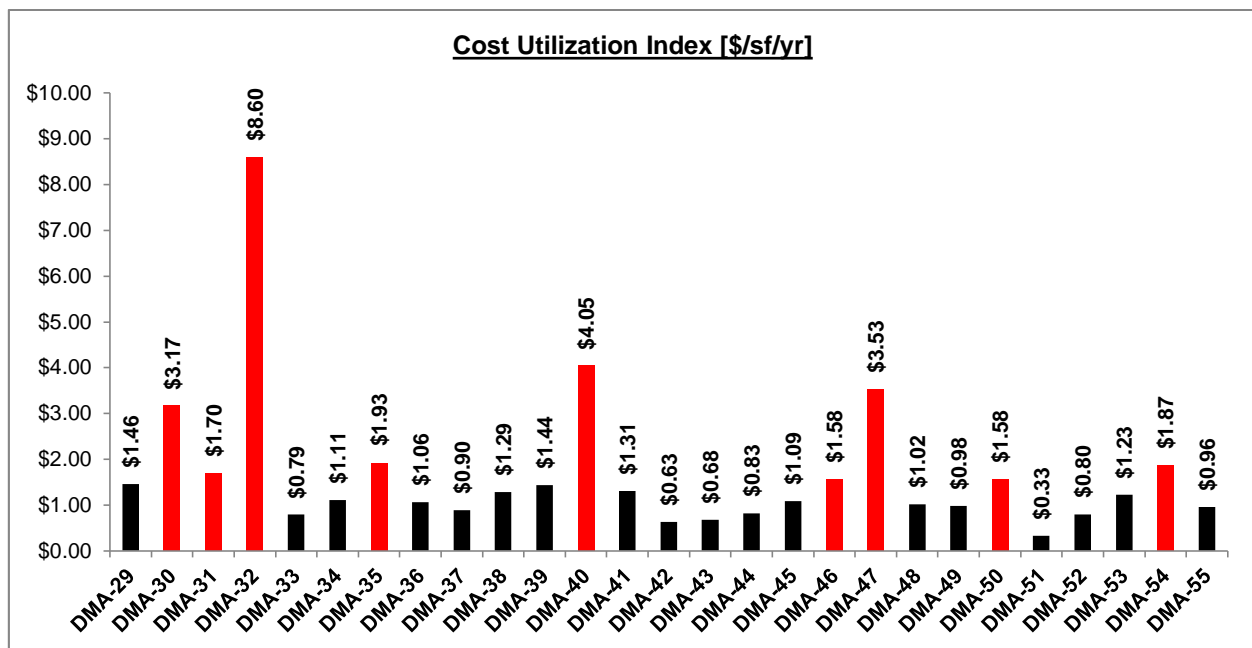


Figure 201: DMA Cost Utilization Index, By Facility, FY 2013-14

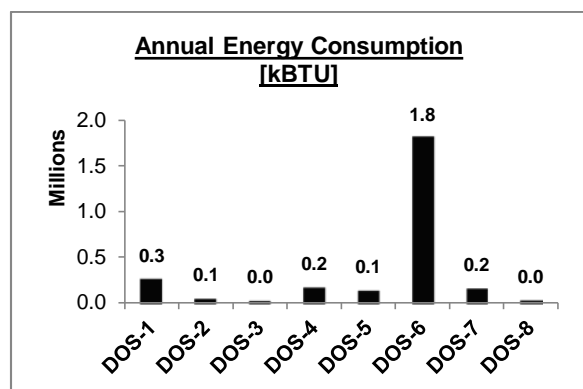


Figure 202: DOS, Facility AEC

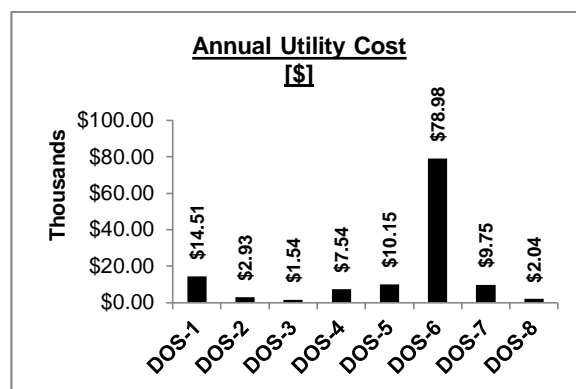


Figure 203: DOS, Facility AUC

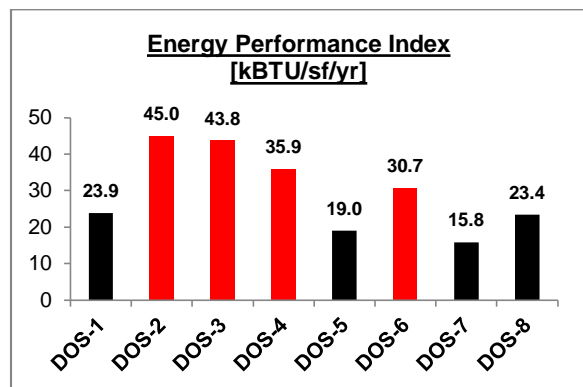


Figure 204: DOS, Facility EPI

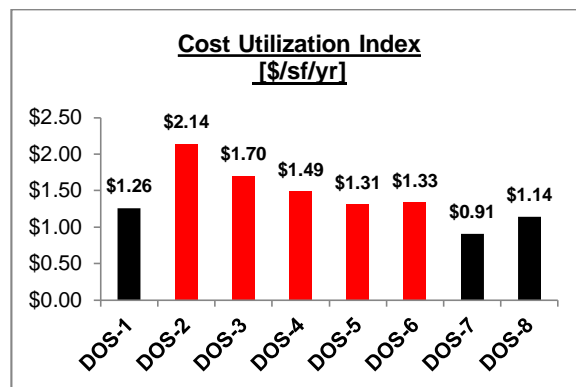


Figure 205: DOS, Facility CUI

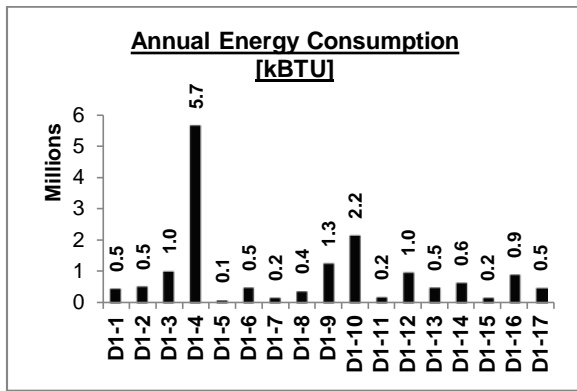


Figure 206: DOT-D1, Facility AEC

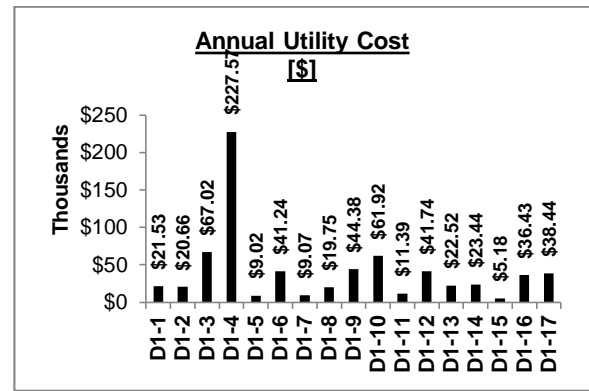


Figure 207: DOT-D1, Facility AUC

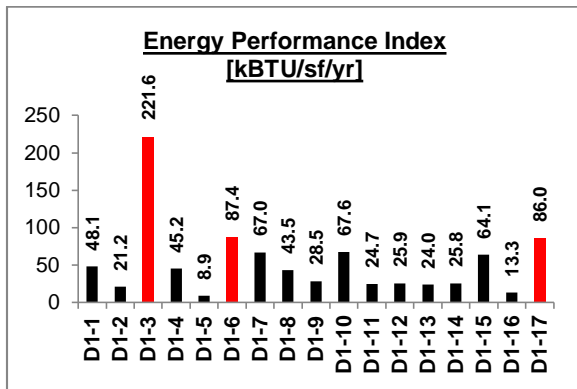


Figure 208: DOT-D1, Facility EPI

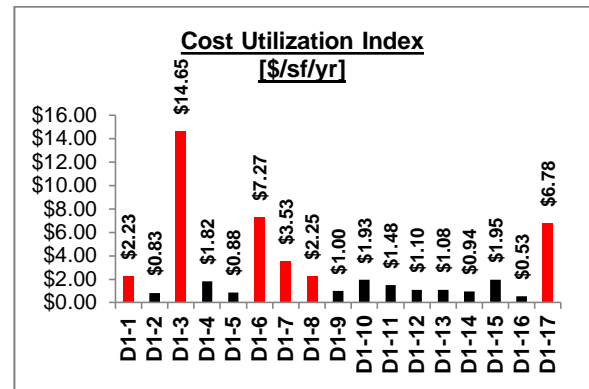


Figure 209: DOT-D1, Facility CUI

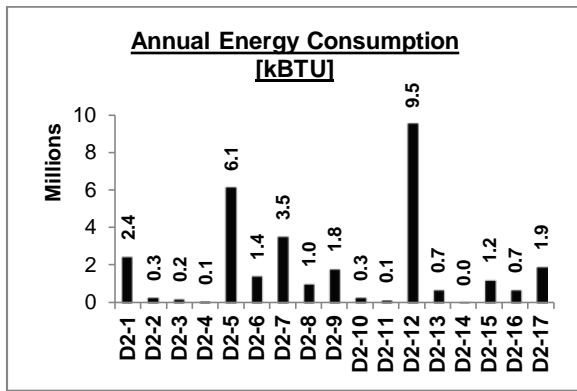


Figure 210: DOT-D2, Facility AEC

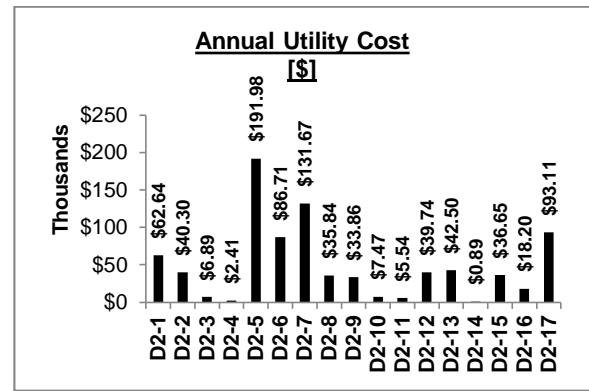


Figure 211: DOT-D2, Facility AUC

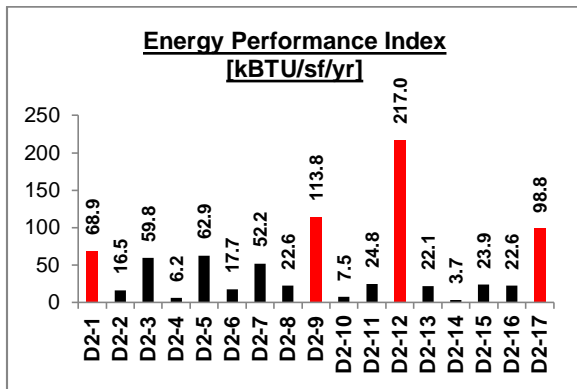


Figure 212: DOT-D2, Facility EPI

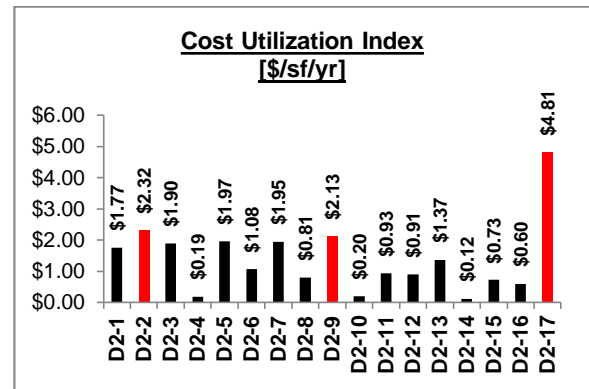


Figure 213: DOT-D2, Facility CUI

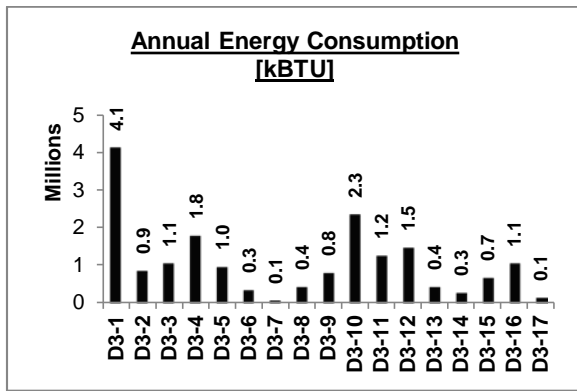


Figure 214: DOT-D3, Facility AEC

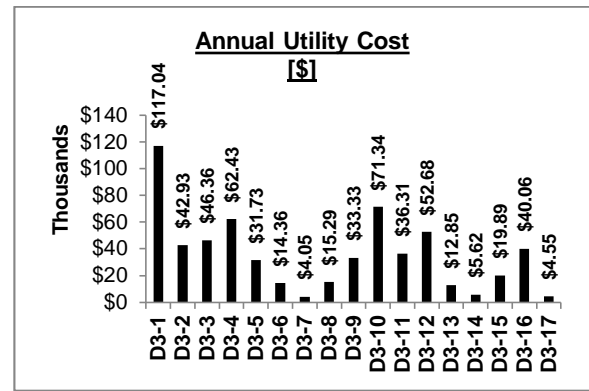


Figure 215: DOT-D3, Facility AUC

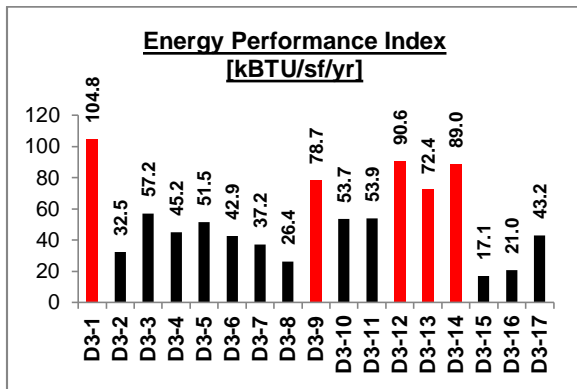


Figure 216: DOT-D3, Facility EPI

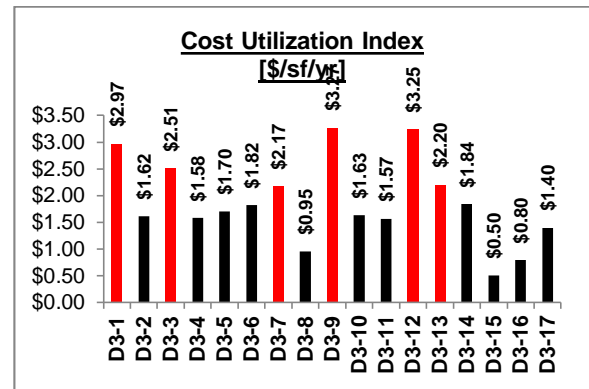


Figure 217: DOT-D3, Facility CUI

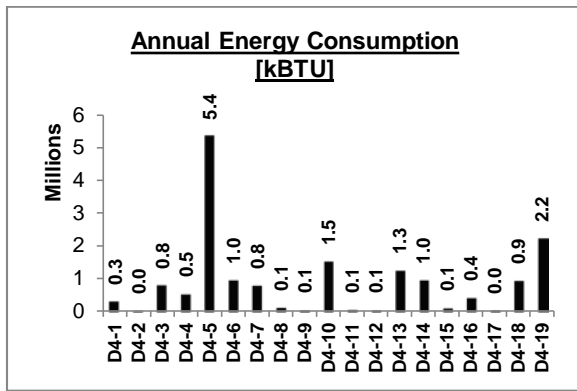


Figure 218: DOT-D4, Facility AEC

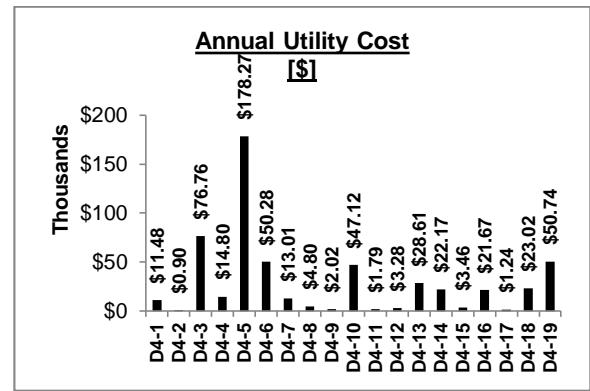


Figure 219: DOT-D4, Facility AUC

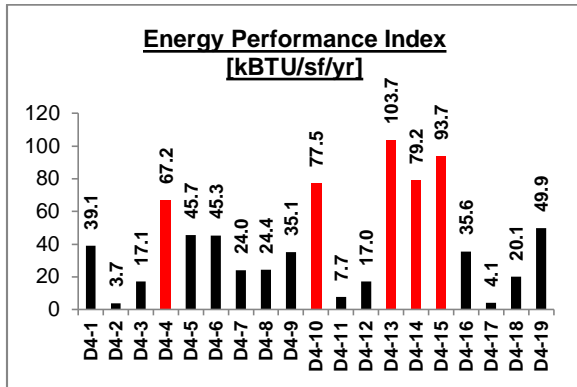


Figure 220: DOT-D4, Facility EPI

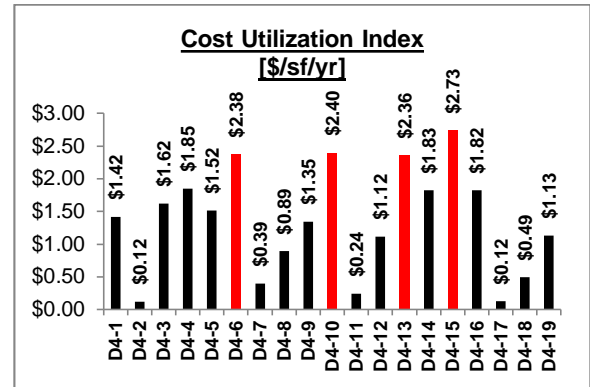


Figure 221: DOT-D4, Facility CUI

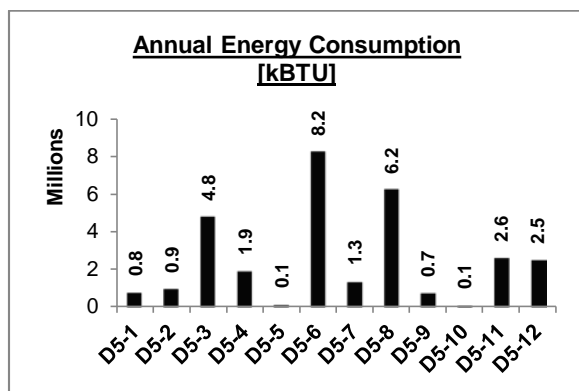


Figure 222: DOT-D5, Facility AEC

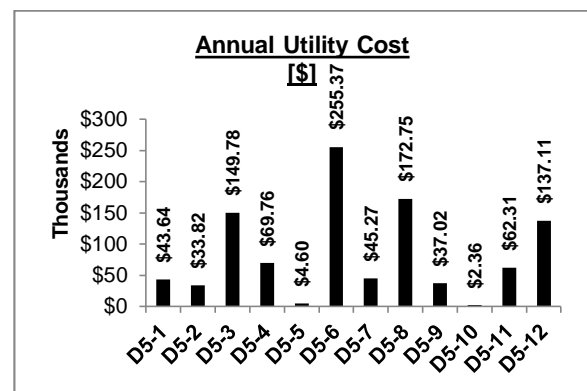


Figure 223: DOT-D5, Facility AUC

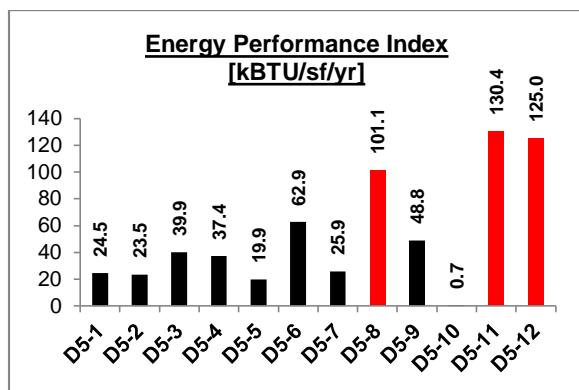


Figure 224: DOT-D5, Facility EPI

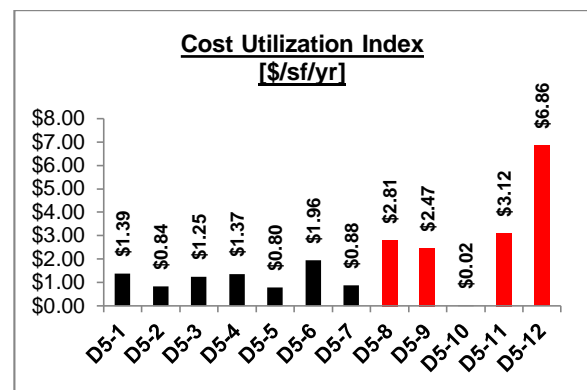


Figure 225: DOT-D5, Facility CUI

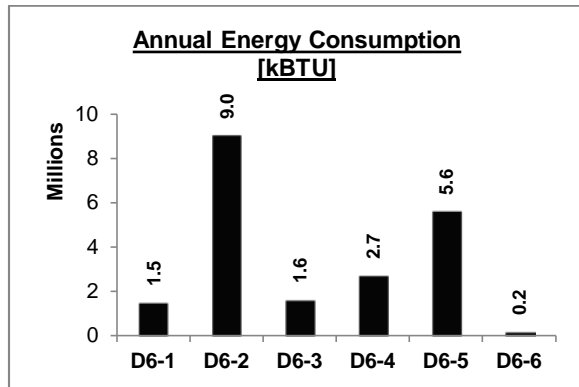


Figure 226: DOT-D6, Facility AEC

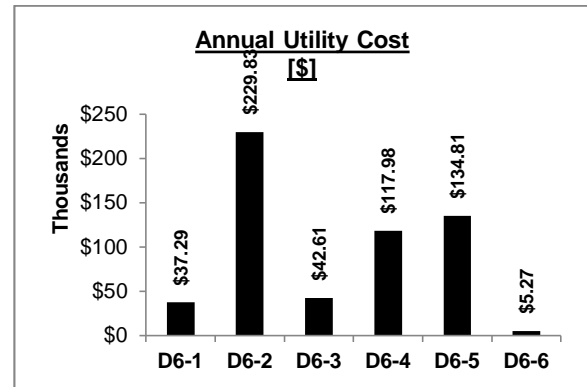


Figure 227: DOT-D6, Facility AUC

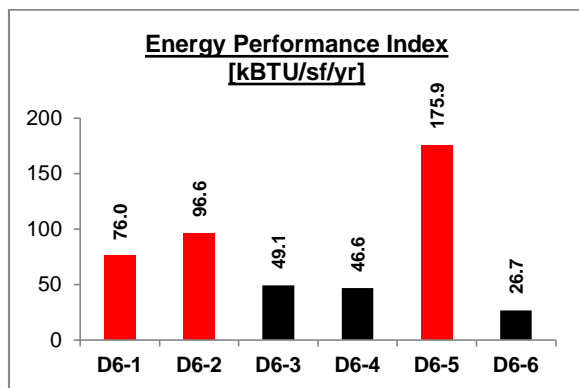


Figure 228: DOT-D6, Facility EPI

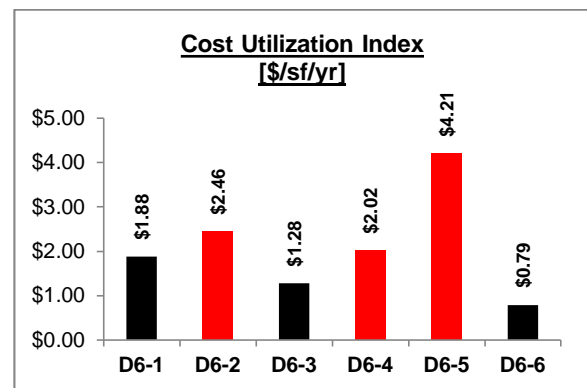


Figure 229: DOT-D6, Facility CUI

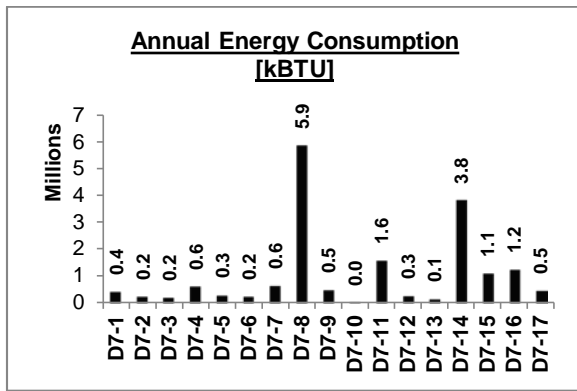


Figure 230: DOT-D7, Facility AEC

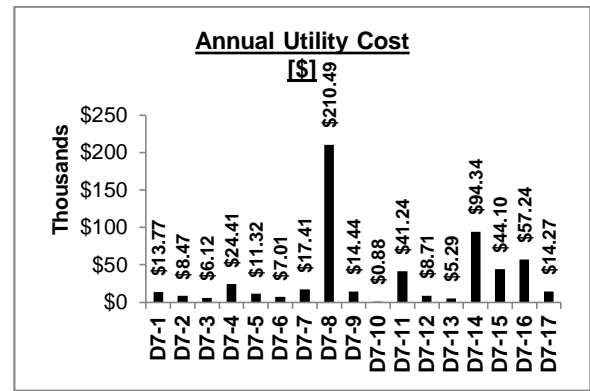


Figure 231: DOT-D7, Facility AUC

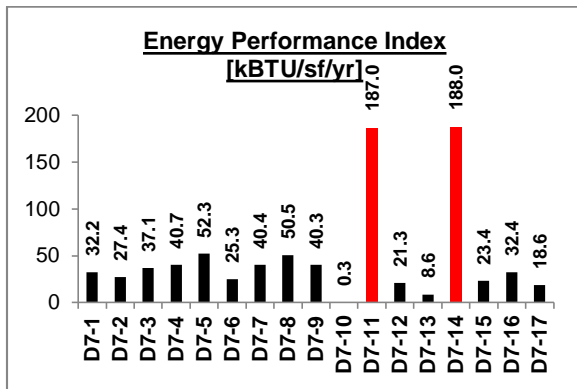


Figure 232: DOT-D7, Facility EPI

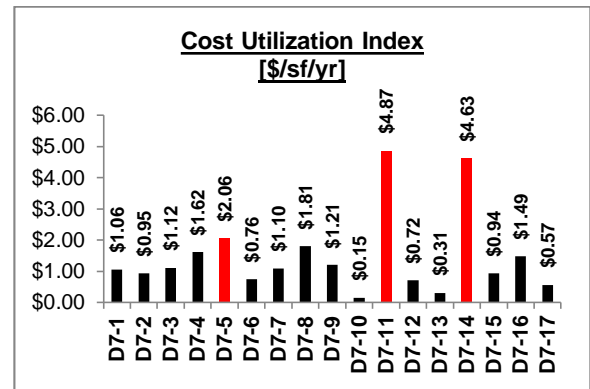


Figure 233: DOT-D7, Facility CUI

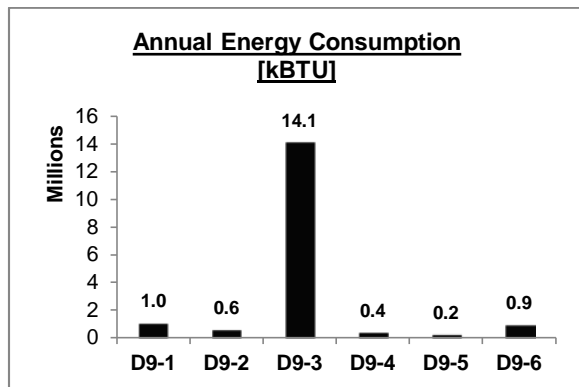


Figure 234: DOT-D9, Facility AEC

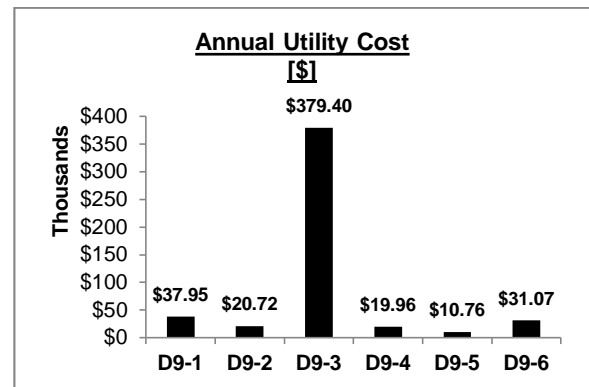


Figure 235: DOT-D9, Facility AUC

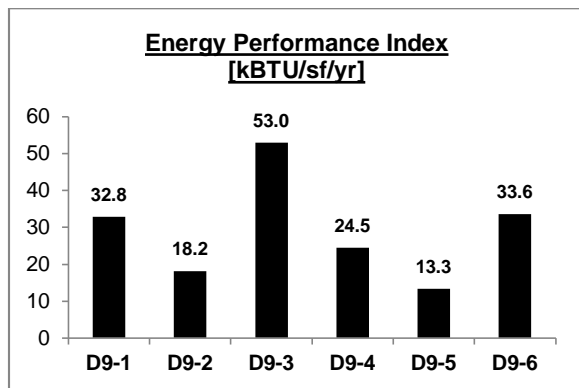


Figure 236: DOT-D9, Facility EPI

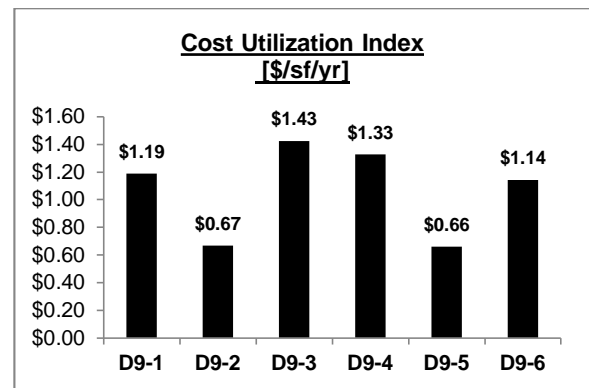


Figure 237: DOT-D9, Facility CUI

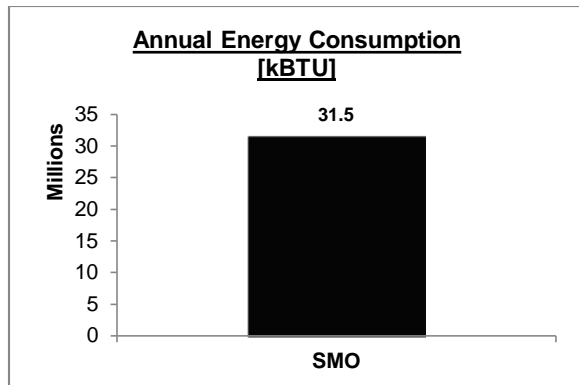


Figure 238: DOT-SMO, Facility AEC

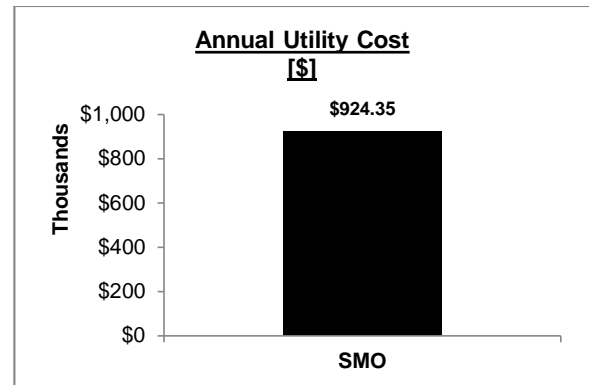


Figure 239: DOT-SMO, Facility AUC

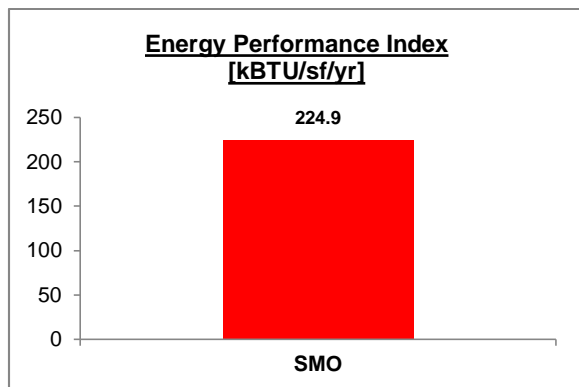


Figure 240: DOT-SMO, Facility EPI

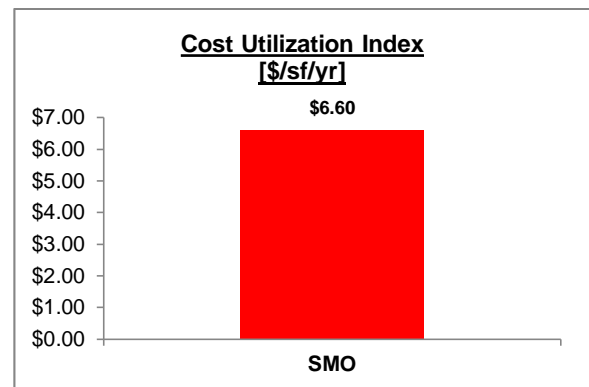


Figure 241: DOT-SMO, Facility CUI

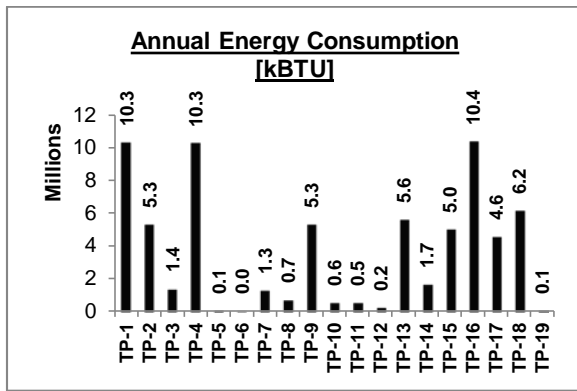


Figure 242: DOT-TP, Facility AEC

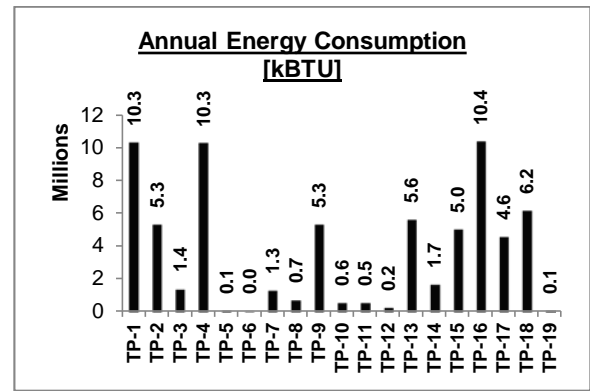


Figure 243: DOT-TP, Facility AUC

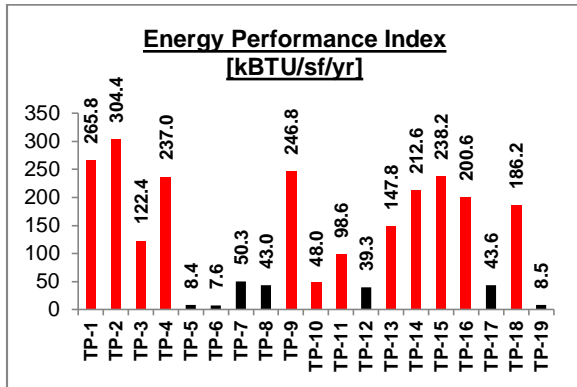


Figure 244: DOT-TP, Facility EPI

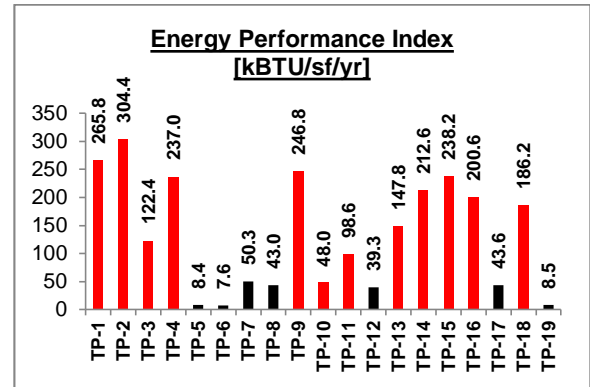


Figure 245: DOT-TP, Facility CUI

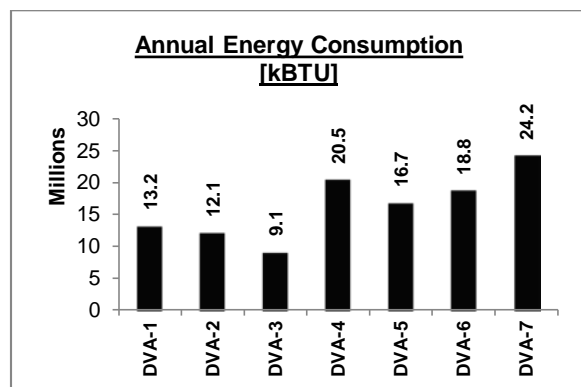


Figure 246: DVA, Facility AEC

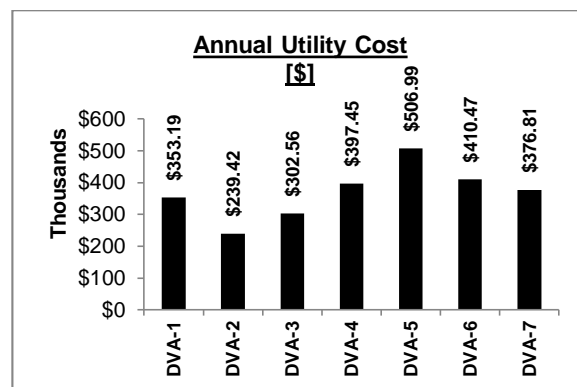


Figure 247: DVA, Facility AUC

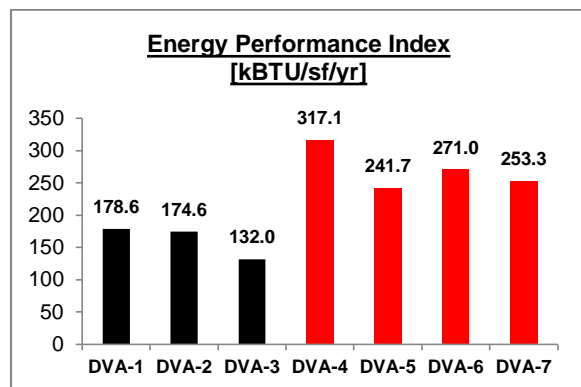


Figure 248: DVA, Facility EPI

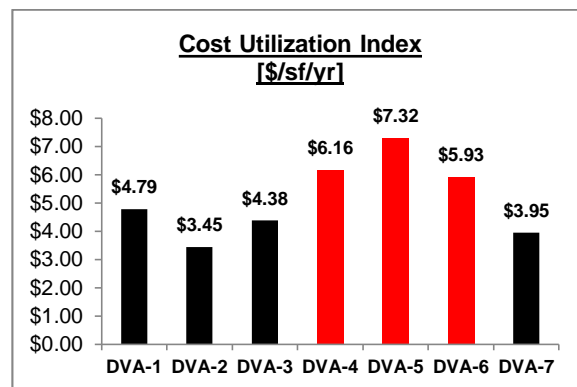


Figure 249: DVA, Facility CUI

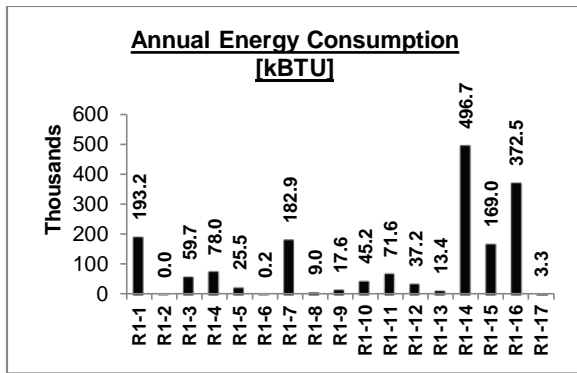


Figure 250: FWCC-R1, Facility AEC

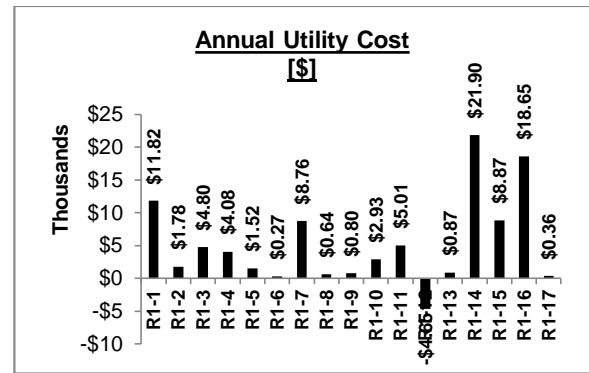


Figure 251: FWCC-R1, Facility AUC

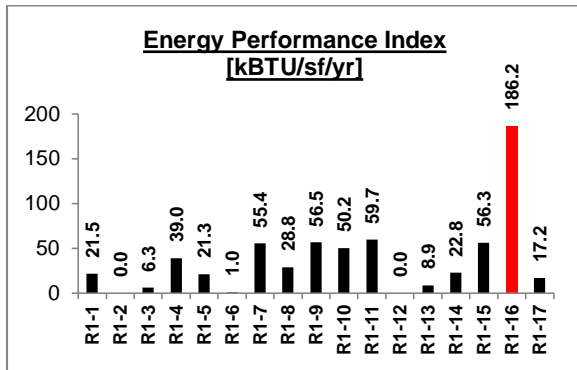


Figure 252: FWCC-R1, Facility EPI

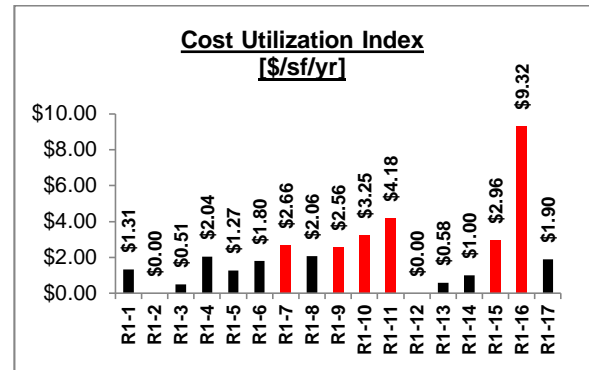


Figure 253: FWCC-R1, Facility CUI

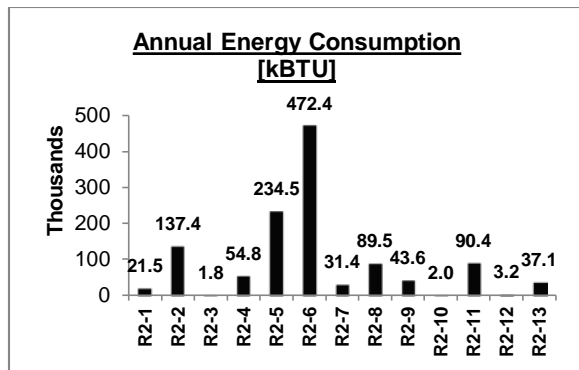


Figure 254: FWCC-R2, Facility AEC

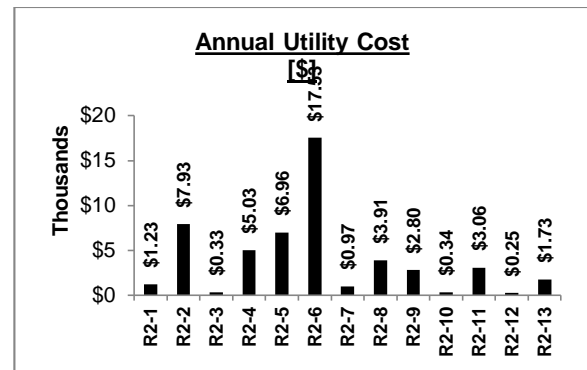


Figure 255: FWCC-R2, Facility AUC

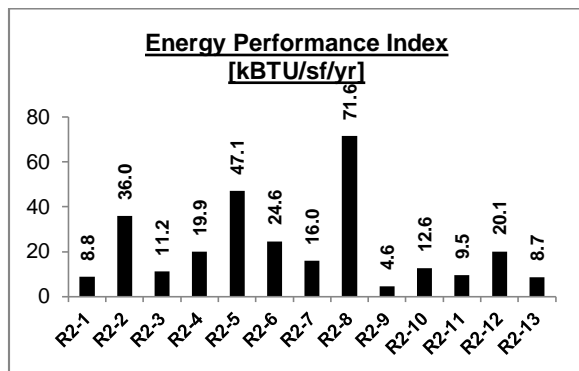


Figure 256: FWCC-R2, Facility EPI

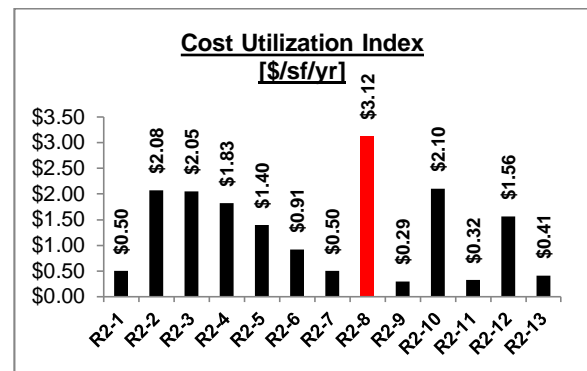


Figure 257: FWCC-R2, Facility CUI

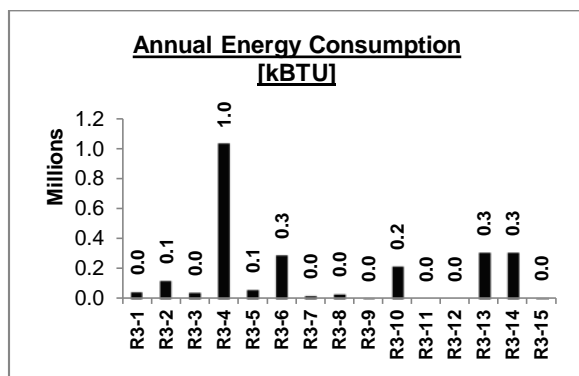


Figure 258: FWCC-R3, Facility AEC

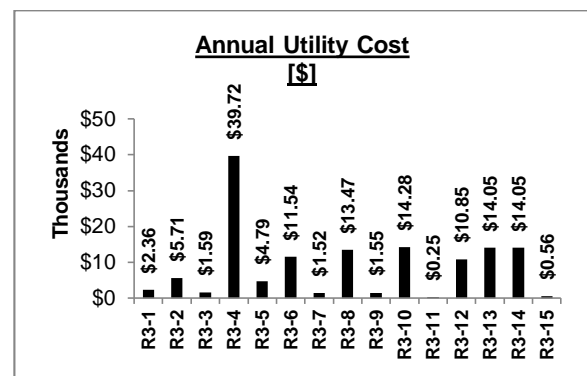


Figure 259: FWCC-R3, Facility AUC

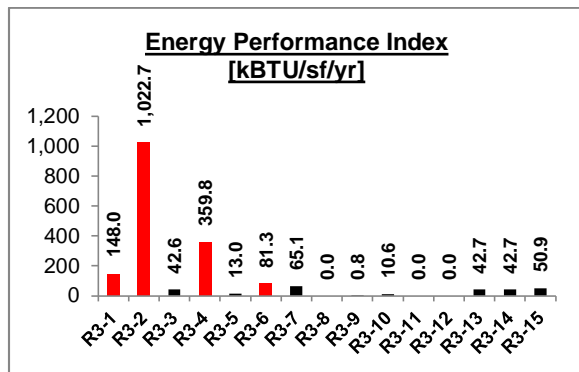


Figure 260: FWCC-R3, Facility EPI

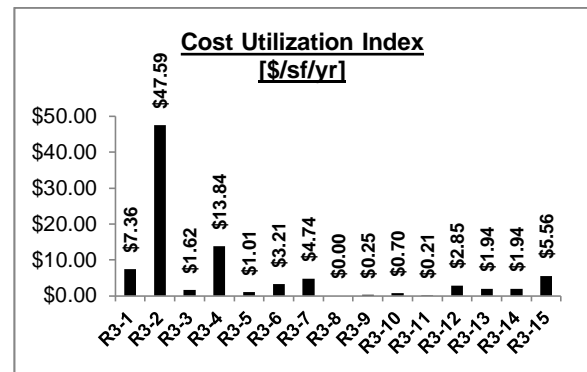


Figure 261: FWCC-R3, Facility CUI

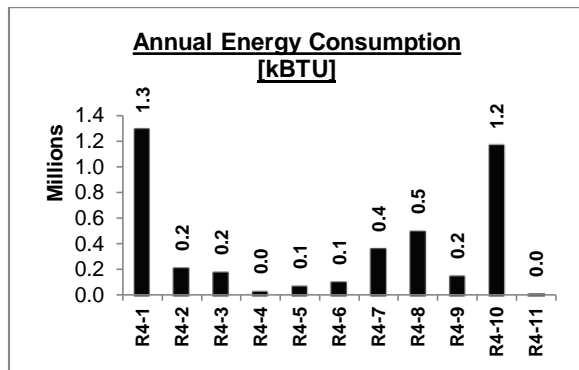


Figure 262: FWCC-R4, Facility AEC

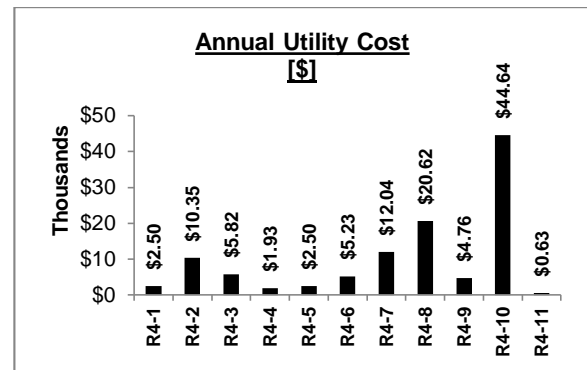


Figure 263: FWCC-R4, Facility AUC

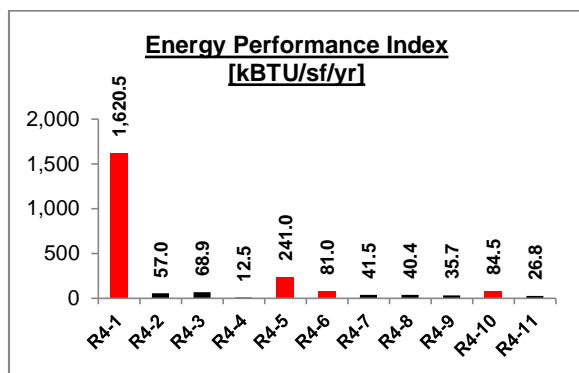


Figure 264: FWCC-R4, Facility EPI

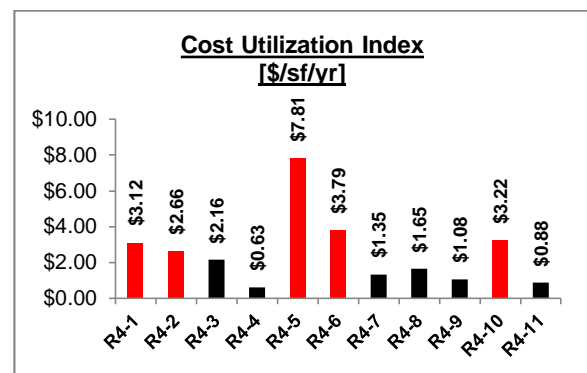


Figure 265: FWCC-R4, Facility CUI

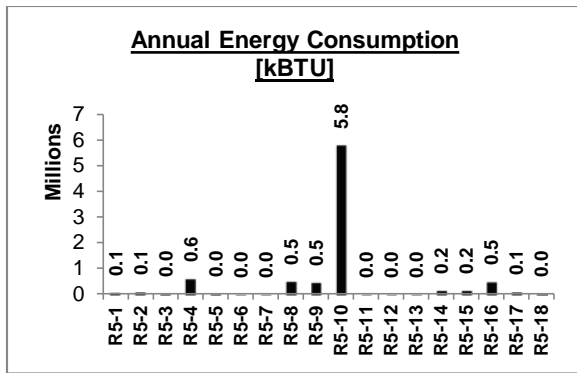


Figure 266: FWCC-R5, Facility AEC

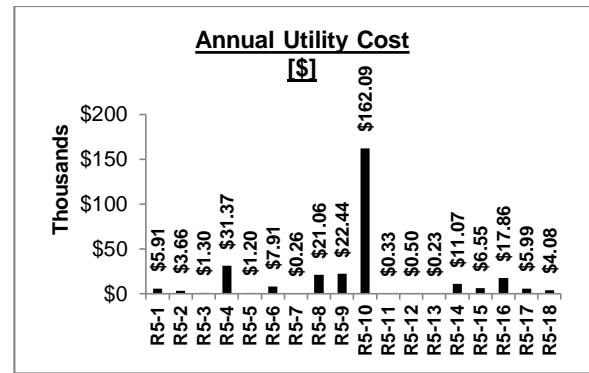


Figure 267: FWCC-R5, Facility AUC

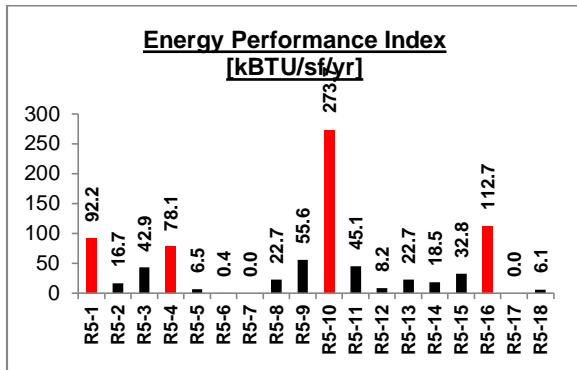


Figure 268: FWCC-R5, Facility EPI

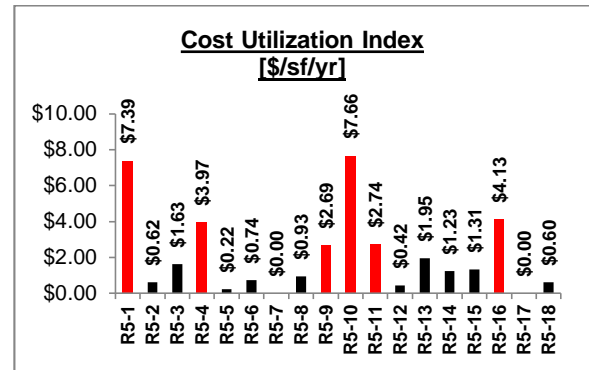


Figure 269: FWCC-R5, Facility CUI

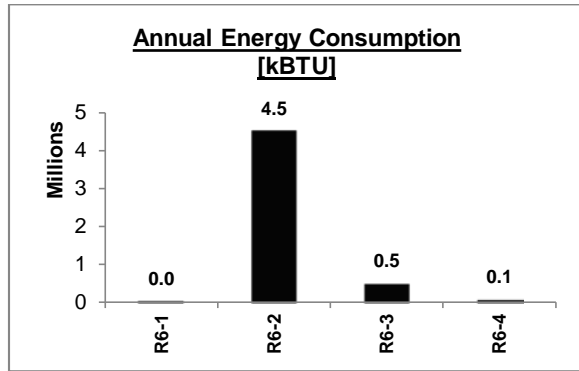


Figure 270: FWCC-R6, Facility AEC

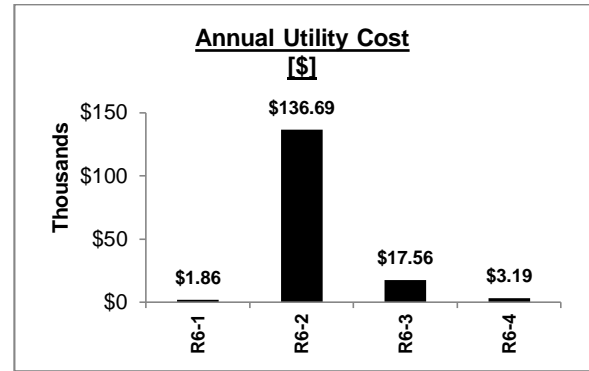


Figure 271: FWCC-R6, Facility AUC

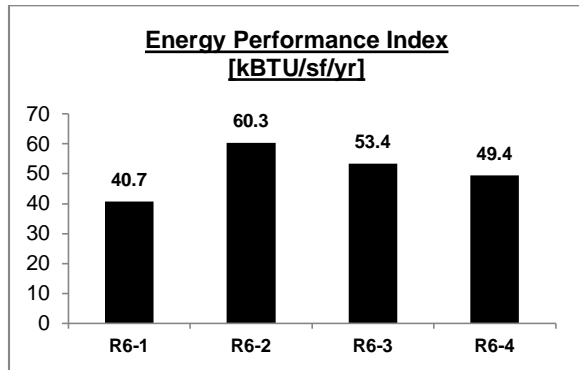


Figure 272: FWCC-R6, Facility EPI

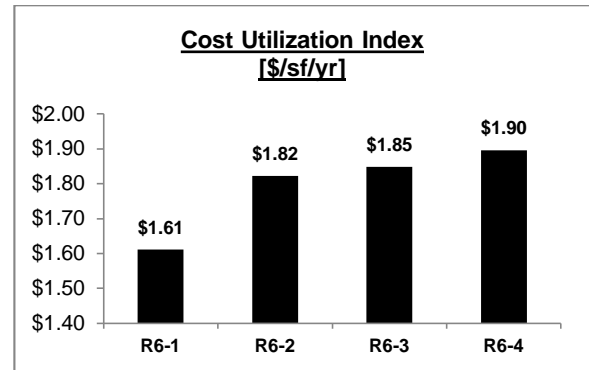


Figure 273: FWCC-R6, Facility CUI

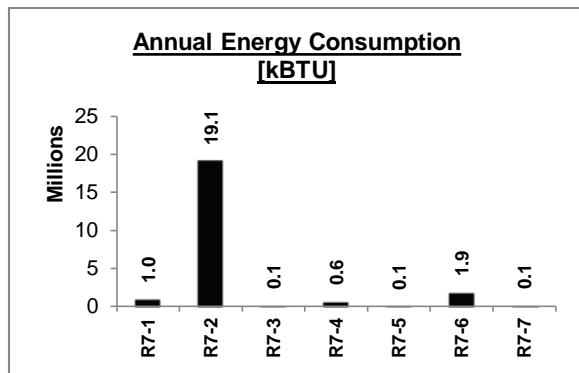


Figure 274: FWCC-R7, Facility AEC

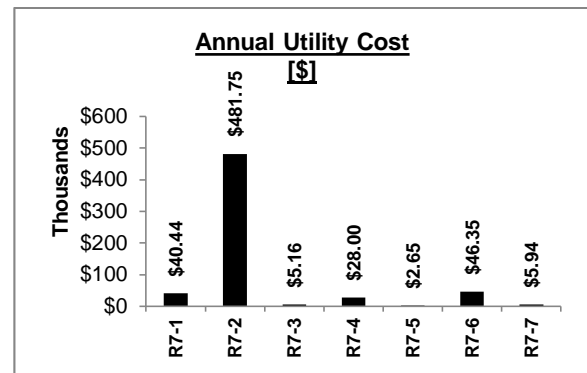


Figure 275: FWCC-R7, Facility AUC

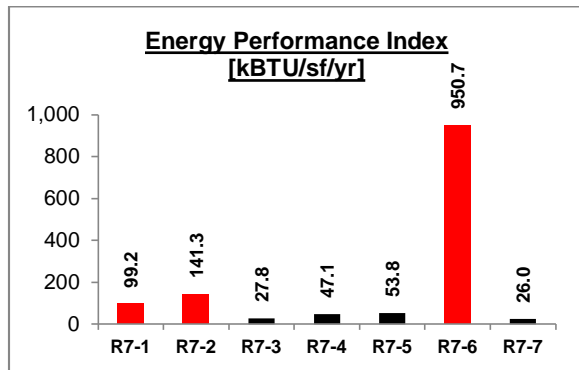


Figure 276: FWCC-R7, Facility EPI

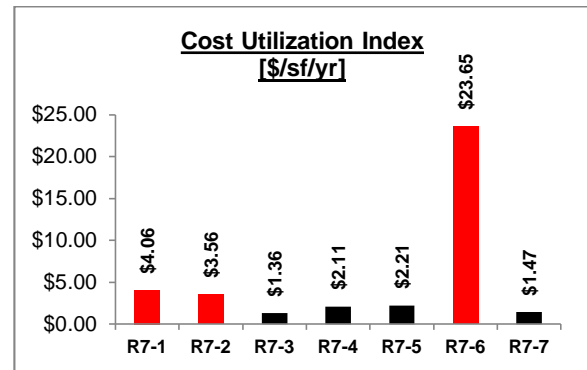


Figure 277: FWCC-R7, Facility CUI
